

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

DOG HIGH JUMP

Class Description: 1. Small dog - under 50cm 2. Medium dog - 50cm - less than 60cm 3. Large dog - 60cm and over.

\$5.00 entry fee, payable on show day at the time of registration.

Please register your dog to the dog steward at the event site, at least 15 minutes before the event starts. **Waivers MUST be completed.**

Prizemoney: 1st = \$200.00; 2nd = \$50.00 (for each class)

Regulations:

- The competition is a test of the dog's jumping ability.
- The competition is open to all dogs.
- The dog is permitted to jump onto or over the jump.
- All dogs not competing must be on a lead with a handler in the Marshalling Area behind the competition area.
- Only ONE dog may be loose in the competition area at any one time.
- Every dog must compete at every height.
- There must be a handler at the top of the jump to act as a catcher if necessary, and a handler as a catcher at the bottom.
- The dog's owner must supply the extra handler.
- Each dog is allowed three attempts at each height if necessary.
- In the event of two dogs jumping the same height, the winner shall be determined as the dog that took the least number of attempts from one jump.

• A dog may compete on a loose lead or must be released at a minimum of three metres from the jump.

• ANY MISHANDLING OR MISUSE OF A DOG WILL INCUR IMMEDIATE DISQUALIFICATION

• If, in the opinion of the Stewards, a dog is unsafe to other competitors or the general public, it will be withdrawn from the competition.

RICH FRUIT RECIPE

Sponsored by: The Riverina Hotel

1st \$25, 2nd \$5 (Winner is eligible for Group Judging)

The following recipe is compulsory to all entries:

250gm (8oz) sultanas; 250gm (8oz) chopped raisins; 250gm (8oz) currants: 125gm (4ozs) chopped mixed peel; 90gm (3ozs) chopped red glace cherries; 90gm (3oz) chopped blanched almonds; 1/3 cup sherry or brandy; 250gm (8oz) plain flour; 60gm (2oz) self raising flour; ¹/₄ teaspoon grated nutmeg; ¹/₂ teaspoon ground ginger; ¹/₂ teaspoon ground cloves; 250gm (8oz) butter; 250gm (8oz) soft brown sugar; $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon lemon essence or finely grated lemon rind; ¹/₂ teaspoon almond essence; $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon vanilla essence: 4 large eggs.

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices.

Cream together the butter and sugar with essences.

Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the fruits and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly.

The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8ins) and bake in a slow oven approximately $3\frac{1}{2}$ - 4 hours.

Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: to ensure uniformity, and depending on size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 3-4 pieces; cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise 3-4 pieces.



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



REGULATIONS

No tents, booths, hawkers or others will be allowed on the ground without the special permission of the Show Society Secretary. All exhibits must be bona-fide property of the exhibitor (except where otherwise stated). In all classes and sections, exhibitors may be called up to sign a declaration if deemed necessary. Exhibitors of livestock will be required to furnish the full particulars as to age and pedigree of such exhibit, also to breeder's name (in the case of cattle) and such other information as the committee may demand. The Committee reserves themselves the right to disqualify any exhibit improperly entered or regarding which any false statement has been made.

Proved wilful misrepresentations of exhibits will not merely forfeit the prize, but render the exhibitor liable to be disqualified from exhibiting at future Shows of the Association. The onus of proof of the bona-fide of the exhibit will rest with the exhibitor. All exhibitors are to place their exhibits in the place allocated to them by the Committee. All exhibits are to be on the ground by the time and day specified in the schedule.

The Committee will give every possible facility to exhibitors and every care will be taken, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Show Society as to loss or damage of exhibits. Prizes must be fixed to exhibits and stewards will affix the exhibitors' names to the winning exhibits after the judges have given their decision. For any exhibit being sold, the buyer and seller shall report same to the Show Society Secretary, and the seller shall pay a commission of 5% on gross profits.

Protests, with \$50.00 deposit, must be lodged with the Show Society Secretary within 24 hours of the declaration of the awards, to be dealt with by the Committee and if the Committee finds that the protest is frivolous, the deposit may be forfeited.

Work done by the School Children must be authenticated by a school teacher, or another responsible person, stating the age of the child. Special entries will be received if not in the Prize List, and space will be reserved if due notice is received by the Show Society Secretary.

Certificates and Entry Forms and all particulars will be supplied on application to the Show Society Secretary.

All complaints are to be directed to the Show Society Secretary.

The Holbrook Sheep and Wool Fair Committee is affiliated with the Holbrook Show Society but is financially independent of it.

NOTICES: Any person found guilty of improper practice and disqualified for any period, shall not be eligible to exhibit or compete at any Society Show during the period of disqualification. Any appeal must be lodged with the Show Society Secretary within seven (7) days.

Any person defaulting in their payment of entry fees, etc., shall not be eligible to exhibit or compete at any Society Show affiliated with the Association until all moneys owing have been paid to the Society concerned.
