Mayor's Message



It was terrific to see residents in all towns taking advantage of the clean out. Some interesting statistics were: 216 registrations for pick up in Henty, Jindera and Walla Walla, and across the five towns a total of 376 mattresses, 128 fridges, 579 trailer loads of rubbish, 83 washing machines and 250 lounges/couches/chairs were placed in landfill.

I would like to congratulate the Henty, Jindera and Rand Walbundrie Walla Walla Football and Netball Clubs and Holbrook Rotary for assisting Greater Hume Council with pick ups and delivery to our landfills.

NSW State Government commits final piece of \$3.1M funding for new railway crossing at Henty

On 1 February 2019, Greg Aplin, Member for Albury announced \$3.1m from the NSW Government's Regional Communities Development Fund has been allocated for the project involving construction of a new protected railway crossing, realignment of Olympic Way, and upgrade of a local access road to the major grain handling facility at Henty. This project, once completed, will enable B Double access directly to the GrainCorp facility at West Henty.

"This Council has been working consistently since it became an issue with a near miss event occurring at the location in 2013, when a truck and passenger train almost collided at the current crossing" said Mayor Heather Wilton. Council has worked hard to build the case based on much needed improvement to safety and strong economic merit. Council worked closely with NSW Roads and Maritime Services (RMS), Australian Rail Track Corporation and GrainCorp to ensure the project reached a 'shovel ready' status to successfully seek funding.

Full design was completed by RMS, which invested \$300,000 into planning for the project which involved detailed design and project estimates, road safety audits and review of environmental factors. The project had also been identified as a key priority in the Regional Economic Development (RED)

Strategy released last year, as important infrastructure for the region. In September 2018, the Australian Government announced \$3.6m for the project from the Heavy Vehicle Safety and Productivity Program and Council already having earmarked \$500,000 for the works.

The scope of the \$7.2m project includes:

- construction of a new railway crossing
- realignment of approximately one kilometre of the Olympic Highway to

Olympic Highway to the east of the existing alignment

- construction of a new intersection between Grubben Road, Orange Flat Lane and the railway crossing
- construction of a new property entrance to 'Sunray' (private property entrance)
- removal of vegetation
- closing the existing Williams Crossing railway crossing approximately 1km north of Henty.



Our new website has been live for four months. We are still developing the site with new sub-sites for Greater Hume Children Services and town sites for Culcairn, Henty, Holbrook, Jindera and Walla Walla recently going live. To utilise the site fully here are some helpful tips:

- Lodging a Customer Request allows residents and the general public to lodge a Customer Request to Council. Go to Contact Us tab on the homepage, click on 'Lodge a Customer Request', complete the fields (some fields are compulsory) and upload photos or documents (up to 10mb in total), click on SUBMIT BUTTON (may take 2 to 5 minutes), a copy of your request will be emailed to you including your CRMWEB number and any documents/photos uploaded. If you are in the middle of a request and you need to add more information later you can click on SAVE BUTTON, which will be sent to your email address and you can submit at a later date. Quote your CRMWEB number when following up your request.
- **Predictive Search** (the website predicts what you may be looking for) -Predictive search displays page and file name results based on the first 3 characters typed. Go to the Search Button (top right hand), start to type what you are searching, click on a suggested search result link from the predictive list, or click the search button to display a full list of results eg type in "min", see what comes up, then type in "minu" and you should get much more detail. HINT, DON'T enter only TWO CHARACTERS it won't work, it is not that predictive.
- Searching Council Minutes and Business Papers/Agenda's When searching for a topic presented at a Council meeting, go to the Council Minutes and Agendas page, to the right is Search Minutes & Agendas, enter a word or phrase eg skate parks, you will then notice Council Meeting dates relating to this topic will appear, from the top in order of appearance, click on the date, any reference to skate parks during that meeting will appear, sometimes the word "park" may also appear), if it is not the reference you are looking for, go to the next Council Meeting date and so on, until you have found the reference. You can also search for Meeting Type, eg Special Meetings etc.

Greater Hume Children Services

At the end of 2018, the Albury Wodonga Community College announced the closure of the Henty and Walla Walla child care services and the two communities were left without long day care services. The news was devastating for many rural families who rely on child care and did not know if they would have access to child care services leading into 2019. Greater Hume Council's Children Services (GHCS) team provided support to the communities as the impact of the closures became evident. GHCS are pleased to announce that Henty and Walla Walla child care centres, opened on Monday 14 January, and provide quality, flexible care by professional qualified early childhood educators for children and families in our shire.

Operational hours are:

- GHCS Henty: Monday to Friday 7.30am - 5.30pm
- GHCS Walla Walla: Monday to Wednesday 8.30am -4.30pm

GHCS staff are working with childhood services to incorporate our philosophy, and to implement a natural environment where children can be children learning through play while taking risks and exploring their community and environment. The new child care centre being built at Walla Walla will also incorporate these, with areas

for children to explore, take risks and learn through play in a natural learning environment. Our team have started the year with professional development, where we continue to extend our skills and knowledge in early childhood regulations, policies, procedures and the law. Staff members attended the Family Day Care Australia-Engagement Program and will be attending 'The Nature of Listening" through the International Association of Nature Pedagogy. Later in 2019 staff will also be attending the Early Childhood Australia Conference. We are collaborating with Greater Hume Council Library and Youth Services Development Officer, Susan Kane, for senior's week and Kim Schultz, Road Safety Officer, will be hosting a safety and awareness night for educators and families in regards to road safety, and driveway accidents.

Playgroup has commenced. Renee, the educators and children have been out and about in the community and have some exciting playgroup visits planned to Brocklesby Public School, Wonga Wetlands, Flyaway Gymnastics, Albury Airport and Jindera Community Hub just to name a few. 
Wig Wag School Bus Flashing Lights

Greater Hume Council hosted their annual bus operators meeting in February, with the aim of sharing information with key stakeholders from Roads and Maritime Services, Transport for NSW and NSW Traffic and Highway Patrol to identify any issues.

The main concern voiced by bus operators was that many driver's don't slow down to the 40km/h speed limit when passing a school bus heading in the same direction with flashing amber lights, otherwise known as wig wag lights.

Bus driver's' mentioned that many drivers pass with no attempt to reduce speed at all and are putting themselves and children at risk of being involved in a collision.

Drivers should look out for children who are crossing the road or waiting to cross. Lights flash on buses to warn motorists that buses are picking up and dropping off children.





A stationary bus can impede your view of children near the bus. By law, a driver must not overtake or pass a bus with flashing lights at more than 40km/h.

Lights begin to flash when the bus stops and the doors open, and they keep flashing for about 20 seconds after the doors close. Children are most at risk in the minutes after they get off the bus.

Young children are often unpredictable in their movements. They are still developing the skills that help them to judge the direction of sound and the speed and distance of vehicles.

We know that because of their sheer size and mass, buses can cause severe outcomes for other road users in crashes. Motorists can help reduce the risk of a crash and keep children safe by:

- Slowing down to 40km/h when bus lights are flashing
- Looking out for children crossing the road near bus stops, in school zones or along bus routes
- Giving way to buses when they merge back into traffic.

Firewood Collection Permits

As we are heading into the cooler months of the year it is time to start thinking about our wood supplies to keep those home fires burning.

Residents of Greater Hume Council area can obtain a permit which allows them to collect fallen timber (felling of trees is not permitted) for personal use from selected roadside verges with in the Council area.

The permit is valid for a period of up to 12 months and can be obtained from your nearest Greater Hume Council Customer Service Centre following payment of the appropriate administration fee and proof of residency with in Greater Hume Council area.

The service is one of ten trials operating under the NSW Government's Rural and Regional On Demand Public Transport pilot program.

Regional Buses will provide dropoffs and pick-ups within the Albury City Boundary.

Operating hours are 7.00am till 6.00pm, Monday to Friday.

The service will use a modern 12 seater bus with experienced, customer focussed drivers.

Value for money fares commence from \$4.90, with passengers able to

travel from Walla Walla to Jindera or Burrumbuttock, or Jindera to Albury. Half price concession fares are available to those eligible. RED ticket fares are also available for those eligible, allowing all day travel from any location at a bargain \$2.50.

Engineering Works

Listed below is Council's scheduled works program up to 30 June 2019:

- Tunnel Road, Woomargama upgrade to accommodate B-Double access for plantation harvesting only.
- Culcairn Holbrook Road (MR331) road reconstruction between Ralvona Lane and Billabong Creek Bridge funded under the NSW Government 'Black Spot Program'.
- road rehabilitation, flood culvert and guardrail installation on Olympic Highway at The Rock. Works expected to commence late March, traffic will be reduced to single lane, expect minor delays.
- heavy patching at various locations along Olympic Highway, expect minor delays.

- heavy patching at various locations along Tumbarumba Road, Little Billabong to Carabost, expect minor delays.
- Drought Relief Heavy Vehicle Access Program along Walbundrie Road heavy patch repair work.
- completion of remainder of Council resheeting program.
- completion of Council's Regional Road Resealing program on MR331 Jingellic Road and MR547 Walla Walla Jindera Road.
- completion of asphalt surfacing of Sladen Street, Henty over the rail crossing to the Olympic Highway.

Planning is currently underway for the 2019 - 2020 budget period with funding being confirmed for:

- Coach Road, Gerogery construction and sealing of a further 2km south of Benambra Road funded under NSW Government 'Black Spot Program'.
- commencement of Henty Rail Crossing Project involving the realignment of 1km of the Olympic Highway and installation of a new rail crossing linking to Grubben Road, suitable for b-double access (refer to page 2 of the newsletter for Henty Rail Crossing announcement).

Loans to Community Groups

Community groups and organisations can access financial assistance under Council's 'Loans to Community Groups Policy'. To be eligible the project or facility must be approved by Council and be located on Council owned or controlled community land. Loans for major plant items and equipment will be considered where the plant or equipment is used in the maintenance and operations of the community facility.

Applications for loans up to \$50,000 will be considered, subject to the total loan liability owing by any one community group or organisation not exceeding \$50,000 at any one time. The aggregate of all loans owing to Council must not exceed \$250,000 at any point in time. Interest rate is fixed (currently 3% per annum) for the duration of the loan with a term not exceeding 10 years.
