#### IN YOUR GARDEN

I am not able to get into my garden at present but would like to share some ideas with you.

Spring flowering bulbs are mostly up and growing well, some early jonquils are already flowering. Still time for a few very late additions.

Think about planting Lilliums now for Christmas flowers.

Camellias are flowering now, so visit a nursery and perhaps find a new one for your garden, beautiful winter colour.

Now is a good time to divide cacti and succulents. Take small plants from the parent plant or just take pieces i.e. aloes and sedums.

Roses need their winter prune in July, cut out all dead wood, crossed or weak branches and reduce height.

Still time to plant a last lot of broad beans. Sugar snap peas and varieties for shelling will do well too

My first cauliflower was picked for me at the weekend. Sown in February, it enjoyed warm soil all Autumn. Later plants sown in April are much slower growing.

A good time now to put mature pansies (with flowers on) into pots or wheelbarrows. They will flower on for the rest of the year with a little soluble fertiliser added.

A sprinkle of potash around natives will help them do well and flower over winter. Enjoy your Garden, Margaret Pumpa

Greater Hume Council will conduct councillor elections to elect nine councillors to serve for a four year term on Saturday, 4 Sept 2021.

A constitutional referendum will also be held for electors to consider whether the Council area should continue to be divided into wards.



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
