HOSPITAL BUS



The Culcairn Hospital is the proud owner of a new bus which will be used by the Aged Care residents for sightseeing and shopping trips in Culcairn and around the district. The need was identified by the Hospital Manager Katrina Gunnett and

Officer Toni Shutt and supported by the Culcairn Local Health Advisory Committee. Funds from an historical trust fund were used for the purchase. The 12 seater bus was purchased locally from Biti Motors and has

been refitted to enable wheelchair access. The installation of a hydraulic wheelchair lifter was undertaken by Ben Newley from Ultim8carfit in Albury. The 4 back seats were



removed to allow for the lifter to be installed, these seats can be replaced when the wheelchair is not required. With residents locked down for most of the past 2 years this initiative comes at an ideal time and will allow them the freedom to regularly get out and feel part of their community.

CORONATION DRIVE

The coronation of Queen Elizabeth II occurred on 2nd June 1953.

Culcairn held a full day of celebrations on the day of the coronation to mark the occasion.

In the evening, trees were planted by children from the Culcairn district by lantern light to form the Coronation Drive. The lanterns were covered with Red and Blue cellophane to recognise colours from the British and Australian flags. The last tree was planted by Councillor A. Ross who declared the drive open. He unveiled a plague which was located near Memorial Gates which had been erected at the "old" entrance to the Culcairn Sports/Showground.

The Culcairn Garden Club would like to celebrate the Queen's Platinum (70th) Jubilee which will be in June 2023. They hope to have a new information plaque erected at the entrance to the Coronation Drive which would detail some history of the drive.


relax as you deserve.

IN YOUR GARDEN

After all the rain in the past few weeks it is good to see the sun and some drying out. Some plants were inundated and I now hope some evaporation will help them recover.

In the vegetable garden there is a lot of action as summer vegies are ready for picking. This include lettuce, beans and zucchinis. Pick your zucchinis regularly, or you will end up with giant marrows! Plant climbing beans at the base of strongly

growing sweet corn, as this will act as a support for the beans.

Feed rhubarb well for good growth. Prior to planting new plants dig a 30cm trench and fill with sheep crutchings or "dags". The wool holds the water and the manure feeds the plants. Cook rhubarb with apples and orange juice for a tasty dessert.

Time to plant more lettuce, beans (bush and climbing) zucchini, cucumbers and even late tomatoes. Try natural pest management by using companion planting to confuse pest insects. Tomatoes with beans, basil with tomatoes, marigolds with cucumbers.

Allow some herbs to flower, basil, parsley, coriander and dill, as they attract pollinating insects which improve fruit set and help pest control.

Keep deadheading roses for further blooms. Grow petunias and vincas in pots, beds, baskets or wheelbarrows. Petunias are susceptible to mildew. Vincas are tough, only requiring water when they dry out. Both will flower till frosts hit. Zinnnias come in all sizes and are a colourful addition to you garden.

BEWARE!! Summer time is MOZZIE time. Regularly clean out Bird Baths. Drain any container that holds water and encourages mozzies to breed. Wear long sleeves and loose fitting clothes when in the garden to avoid being bitten.
