Deborah has extensive experience coordinating community research projects across Australia and has worked with many organisations including Universities, High Schools, Women's Health Centres, Youth programmes, Migrant Government and non-government services, organisations.

The Greater Hume Council is confident that stakeholders and the community will be supportive of Deborah as she goes about this work.

NSW Growing Regions of Welcome Pilot Program



ABOUT THE BUSH

Gardens aflutter with butterflies

Stepping out into my garden full of native strawflowers and paper daisies over summer I'm surrounded by hundreds of butterflies alighting on the colourful flowers. Amongst my common fluttery visitors are three orange, brown and white coloured butterflies with subtle variations in the pattern and colour of splotches on their wings – these are the Meadow Argus, Yellow Admiral, and Painted Lady. Like all butterflies they hold their wings "closed" above their bodies when they alight on flowers (unlike day flying moths whose wings are held flat when resting). They use their long, coiled proboscis to suck up nectar from flowers.

Hundreds of small blueish-grey butterflies, Common Grass Blues, abound in my daisy patch. There are several species of Blues that occur in our area, but apart from the odd spot or line they can be tricky to tell apart. Most use native peas, wattles, clovers or garden peas as the host plant for their larvae and so can built up in large numbers in favourable seasons. Some species have a symbiotic relationship with ants, where ants tend the larvae and protect them from insect predators in exchange for honeydew that the larvae secrete.

Besides the introduced Cabbage Whites and Heliotrope Moths which are everywhere this summer, I have the occasional Grass Dart, Skipper, Magpie Moth, Common Eggfly, and Orchard Butterfly fluttering around my garden. All are welcome visitors, and the odd plant that gets defoliated by their voracious larvae is a small price to pay for their delightful presence and the part they play in pollinating flowers.
