IN YOUR GARDEN

As we continue to have warm days, some showers and no frosts (as yet) plants are still growing well as the ground is still a good temperature. The first week in May is International Composting Awareness Week. Great gardens begin with great soil.

Compost and Humus improve soil structure and it's ability to hold moisture and take up nutrients. An ideal time now to collect Autumn leaves from your deciduous trees. Pile them in a heap, sprinkle a few cups of blood and bone, water and leave to break down.

Above ground gardens meet a need for people who move house often, or for those who can't bend easily to garden. These waist high gardens come in different sizes and are good for growing almost any vegetable. Good for potatoes and tomatoes but also herbs and lettuce.

Mothers Day—Instead of a bunch of flowers, give Mum a pot of flowers, which can last for months. Potted Chrysanthemums and Cyclamen are in full bloom now. Time now to pick olives if you are growing them. Camellias of all shapes are in bloom now.

Kangaroo Paws—These plants need lots of sun and perfect drainage. Feed in Autumn and Spring for multiple flowers per stem. Cut back to the ground after flowering. They can be divided now. Be aware snails and slugs love them!! Prepare for Winter colour with pots of annuals. Right for planting now are—Pansies, Primulas, Polyanthus and Lobelia. Continue to plant Spring flowering Bulbs. Plant Azaleas and Camellias—check nurseries for availability of varieties. Prepare beds for planting bare rooted roses. It's still a little early to prune roses yet.

Vegetables to plant now include—Broad beans, Spinach, Broccoli, Kale, Peas, and Lettuce. Pumpkins are still maturing so leave till after frosts. Enjoy this last month of Autumn in your Garden. Margaret Pumpa

ABOUT THE BUSH



Squirrel Gliders in our midst. Did you know that we have a healthy population of Squirrel Gliders living in the big old box trees dotted around the golf course? I was very excited to spotlight four gliders there one evening last month. These gorgeous mammals have blue-grey fur above and white bellies. They have large black eyes, dark stripes around their eyes, and a fluffy, black-tipped grey tail. A membrane from wrists to ankles opens out like a small paraglider allowing them to glide up to 50m between trees.

Listed as vulnerable in NSW, Squirrel Gliders are critically dependent on large hollows in 100 to 200-year-old eucalypt trees for resting during the day and raising their young. Feeding on nectar, sap, insects and pollen they rely on areas with large old trees close to remnant bush with a mix of shrubs – particularly wattles.

They can tangle in barb wire as they glide past fences and so the Burrumbuttock Squirrel Glider LAMP project works with landholders to replace top barbs and to create new planting corridors on farms linking up paddock trees with remnant patches. A big shout-out to the Golf Course Committee for managing the area to provide a mix of big old trees and leave a few dead trees standing. That combined with nearby remnant bushland in the Reserve and along Billabong Creek provides ideal food and nesting resources for gliders. Now let's get Culcairn Landcare Group reactivated to remove invasive privet, date palms and olives in the Reserve, and get the next generation of hollow-bearing box trees established so that Squirrel Gliders continue to prosper in our town's backyard! MURRAY RIVER WIRES

Winter is on the way and native animal breeding cycle is slowing, although we are still seeing some baby birds, lizards, snakes and possums. We (the whole population) share the responsibility for the wellbeing and protection of our native fauna (and flora).

- Slow down when driving at dawn or dusk. Remember if you do hit an animal, you are at risk of serious injury, not to mention, damage to vehicle. Also remember you are obliged to stop and render assistance.
- Protect native flora, the natural home of native animals. This will prevent them from “invading our space”.
- Do not pick up “stay” or injured animals and take them to another area. Animals are territorial and will kill other animals placed in their area.
- A “QUIET/FRIENDLY” wild animal is a sick or injured animal! Approach with caution as they will lash out with sharp teeth and claws to defend themselves.
- Assist the animals by shepherding them out of danger by walking behind them, or, as with turtles, you can carry them. Always take them in the direction they are heading.
- Animals caught in barbed wire – if possible try to cover their heads until help arrives. This helps to protect them from further injury, stress and from the sun.
- Animals getting into houses. Cover Chimneys and holes that allow the animals to enter.
