

#### IN YOUR GARDEN—JULY/AUGUST

Winter is with us with some cracking frosts, shorter days, and some wet weather. Nearly all Autumn foliage should have fallen by now. You can leave it where it has fallen or rake it up for your compost heap, adding a couple of handfuls of blood and bone. Water down to help the process.

All your pumpkin vines should have died off by now, so collect all your pumpkins and store for later use. Never store directly on cement, as this will cause pumpkins to rot quickly. Put on netting hung in a shed (or dry space) or on wooden racks or shelving.

Rose pruning time is now. I start in June, so as I have time to prune them Roses are amazingly tough plants (and very hard to kill!) Remove all dead wood, and any wood growing in the centre of the bush as this allows better air flow. Any crossed wood can be removed. I have heard said that any wood thinner than a pencil should go too. Rose cuttings (pencil sized) dipped in honey and placed in a sharp sand/potting mix medium, will generally strike. Keep damp. July is also time to plant bare-rooted roses, available from nurseries.

As the cost of fresh fruit and vegies rises, more people are growing their own produce. Asian Greens are easy and quick to grow. Multi pick lettuce are also easy and will grow well in large pots. There is still time to plant more broccoli, peas, silver beet, asparagus crowns, and various herbs, including coriander, dill, chervil (like parsley). My old wheelbarrows planted with Pansies, and Dwarf snapdragons are bright spots of colour on a dull day.

Chooks—a lot of us have a few chooks in the backyard. They lay some eggs, eat some pests, and help fertilise the garden. As well as this, they eat the kitchen scraps.

GOOD scraps—stale, but not mouldy bread, weevil infested barley, wheat, and couscous, failed banana cake, seeded celery, carrots, lettuce, and other garden vegies scraps.

scraps—anything rotting, mouldy fermenting (bubbling Jam), playdough, anything very salty, rancid oil, avocado skins and seeds, chocolate and junk food, tea leaves and coffee grounds (put them on your camellias or compost heap).

Winter Colour—these shrubs and bushes will bring beauty and colour to winter.

Hairpin Banksia—many and varied sizes and colours. These shrubs attract many birds. Grow in gardens or large pots.

Small Crowea—pink or white flowers, from Autumn onwards.

Blue Dampiera—a blue, butterfly attracting plant Spotted Emu Bush—Plant in dry, well-drained soil. Beautiful flowers come in pink, mauve, orange, red and yellow.

Hume Greater Council has allocated funds in its 2022/2023 budget for the removal of a row of large pine trees located the on

Western Side of the Culcairn Cemetery. established trees are a wonderful wind break for the cemetery and help to delineate the edge of the cemetery. Unfortunately as the trees have grown to a considerable size they are now too close to rows of headstones and they are damaging the head stones through dropped limbs and raised roots.

To eliminate additional damage to the headstones it is planned to replant another row of similar pine species further to the West.

#### **WIRES MURRAY RIVER**

Winter is upon us and should be time when animals are resting and awaiting spring, however they are still out and about on our roads and our properties. We always need to remain vigilant and watch out especially at dawn and dusk. Surprisingly there are still many young animals around.

If you see an injured animal, please call Murray River WIRES 0427 493 737 so we can assist.

Winter is the perfect time to join WIRES, so that your basic training is complete for the onset of spring and all the new little animals. There are many positions available in WIRES; Carers, Rescuers, Tree climbers (for placement of nesting boxes, when animals are released). Transporters between carers and/or Vets and sharp shooters. Now is the time to ensure chimneys are covered and holes are repaired in buildings, to prevent unwanted animals entering your house.

Did you know barbed wire fences cause absolute havoc to all forms of native wildlife?

Birds spread seeds, flying foxes propagate our trees and forests, Turtles clean our waterways and Raptors clean up carrion. Each one of them play an integral role in maintaining our natural habitat.

# CAN SCOUTING RETURN TO HOLBROOK/CULCAIRN?

There has been an interest in getting Scouts up and running in the Holbrook and Culcairn area after an absence of 15 years from the community.

Over the last 12 months I have received many messages and emails from parents wishing to enrol their child in Scouting. It seemed that there is a real need for this activity in the community.

This interest culminated in a community meeting on 23rd March 2022 in Holbrook. Unfortunately, no -one attended this meeting!

So, we have changed our focus and instead of trying to get a full Scout Group up and running with kids in all sections, we will look at providing a Joey Scout section and grow from there.

Joey Scouts are boys and girls in the 5-8 year old demographic. Of interest, there are 810 children in this age group in Greater Hume Shire, representing 7.9% of the total population.

Scouting is community service and citizenship, so we earn our money and give back to the community in the process.

Meeting Nights—This will be open to negotiation with the Leaders. Joeys usually meet for an hour anytime between 5.00pm and 6.30pm.

Meeting Place—We have 2 choices of meeting places in Holbrook, perhaps one day we will get a real Scout Hall again!

Inclusivity—The Scout Program is designed for any child, irrespective of ability, or disability, to achieve to the best level they can, and they will be always recognised for that. Not everyone can be a sportsperson, but all are equal and included under Scouting.
