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DOCTORS AND HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS URGE PEOPLE TO KEEP

General practitioners, pharmacists and other health care providers across **APPOINTMENTS** the Murrumbidgee region are calling for people to continue maintaining their routine health checks. While people are encouraged to stay at home to stop the spread of COVID-19, some people are cancelling routine check ups and appointments which may put them at greater risk. Wagga General Practitioner Dr Tracey Purnell said providers around the region are seeing a decline in patient numbers and this is a very real concern for people's health. We all know how important it is to practice physical distancing and to stay at home to reduce the transmission of coronavirus, but accessing health care and receiving ongoing medical support for existing medical conditions are acceptable reasons for you to leave home," Dr Purnell said. "If you have a chronic health condition requiring regular management, it is important you continue to receive the care you need and maintain scheduled appointments with the various health professionals involved in your care. "Equally important is consulting your GP if you notice something change or you have a health concern. "Ultimately, maintaining regular health checks, during this time will help keep you well and out of hospital. Vice President and Chair of the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners - Rural, and Glenrock Country Practice GP Associate Professor Ayman Shenouda said health care providers were safe to visit. "All healthcare providers are practicing excellent infection control measures to ensure patients are in a safe environment, and some appointments can even be done over the phone," Dr Shenouda said. "With both individuals and healthcare providers both following the national recommendations of good hygiene, social distancing and personal protection procedures, the risk of catching the virus while you're visiting your health providers is minimal. "I would encourage people to call their local practice or healthcare provider to see if your appointment can be done over the phone or if you need to come in person," he said. Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network's (MPHN) CEO Melissa Neal said a campaign highlighting this important health message launches across the region today. "Several of the region's health professionals from a range of disciplines like general practice, pharmacy, pathology, allied health, mental health and ambulance are meeting with us regularly to collaborate around COVID-19 measures, and it was through these meetings we were alerted to a decline in people attending their scheduled medical appointments," Ms Neal said. "Together we have developed a community campaign to encourage people to keep their medical appointments and regular health checks just as you would under normal circumstances. "It's an important health message. We want to ensure people can maintain their wellness and alleviate any unnecessary pressures on the hospital system," she said.

COUNCIL UPDATE

In response to the COVID-19 Coronavirus pandemic, Council resolved to assist ratepayers, businesses and residents by adopting the following support measures:

- Waiving interest on outstanding rates and charges for the period 1 April 2020 to 30 June 2020.
- from 1 April to 30 June 2020 rent on commercial premises impacted by the COVID -19 pandemic be reduced by 50% where the business continues to trade in a limited capacity and 100% where the business temporarily ceases to trade.
- refer to the Budget Workshop the freezing of water, sewerage and waste collection charges.
- amend the Local Purchase Preference Policy to provide a minimum 10% weighting for local businesses to 31 December 2020.
- Further, that reports on the impact of COVID-19 be submitted to each monthly meeting of

In response to the COVID-19 situation, demand for Council's child care services have dramatically impacted. Responding to the crisis, Council officers have been actively lobbying government to raise the issue of the funding shortfall in childcare revenue.

In response the NSW Government has agreed to fund the shortfall in revenue, and Council agreed to monitor funding options for Local Government childcare services and, if required, call on the Minister for Education, Hon Dan Tehan MP and Member for Farrer, Hon Sussan Ley MP for the immediate introduction of further relief measures for local councils who provide critical childcare services to their communities.

Council approved an additional works project for the current year, being: \$15,000 - St Joseph's School - extension of parking bay in Blair Street to be funded from savings from the Creek Street footpath at Jindera.
