COUNCIL NEWS

COVID-19 restrictions have changed the way Council can run its monthly meeting. Councillors attended the August meeting held at Holbrook, observing social distance rules.

Business dealt with at the meeting included:

In response to the ongoing pandemic, Council resolved to waive the annual Food Shop Inspection Fee for 50 food related businesses that operate across the shire.

Council committed to remaining a member of the Riverina Eastern Regional Organisation of Councils for a further two year period.

Council approved the interim full year budget result to 30 June 2020, declaring a cash deficit of \$188,573. The result is primarily due to congoing costs associated with implementing COVID-19 mitigation measures. The other contribution to the deficit is additional expenditure required on survey and design projects, to ensure new key infrastructure projects can be 'shovel' (or grant) ready when external funding opportunities are announced by the Australian and NSW Governments.

Council endorsed the postponement of commencing roadworks associated with the realignment of the Olympic Highway, part of the major Henty Rail Crossing project, to early 2021. This decision has been influenced by delays in relocation of NBN, Telstra and water supply assets, delay in construction of a new rail crossing, impacts of COVID-19 and potentially a wet spring (according to Bureau of Meteorology). The deferral will also mean that harvest grain receivals will not be impaired by roadworks during early summer.

FREE TAX HELP - 2020

Get your tax return completed with the assistance of an accredited Tax Agent at the Culcairn Council Office.

If your income is less than \$60,000 or you are on a Disability Pension you are eligible to get your tax return completed with the assistance of an accredited tax agent on Fri 18th September, Fri 16th October, Fri 23rd October or Fri 30th October. Make an appointment by phoning 6036 0100 – sorry no business tax can be processed.



CULCAIRN HOSPITAL EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT INFORMATION

Murrumbidgee Local Health District has highly trained Emergency Registered Nurses staffing emergency departments across the region, including Culcairn MPS.

Emergency Registered Nurses have completed an intensive training program in First Line Emergency Care (FLECC).

The six month program includes a theoretical component through the Australian College of Nursing and a clinical component.

The course prepares and credentials rural and remote Registered Nurses as an Advanced Clinical Nurse (ACN) to ensure early appropriate management of acute and life threatening conditions, and to relieve pain and discomfort for patients at hospitals where Medical Officers are not immediately available. Emergency Department staff are supported 24

Emergency Department staff are supported 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by the Remote Medical Consultation Service and the Critical Care Advisory Service.

These services link health care consumers across MLHD's 33 facilities to world class models of care and highly skilled clinicians using advanced digitalised telecommunications platforms.

The Remote Medical Consultation Service supports clinicians in outlying hospitals by prescribing medical treatments and first aid advice and identifying when further care is required.

The MLHD Critical Care Advisory Service (CCAS) facilitates critical care expertise from senior critical care clinicians at the Wagga Wagga Base Hospital (WWBH) using Telehealth. In some cases due to the limited number of critical patient presentations, staff can lack recent experience in dealing with these patients so the CCAS is there to support them.

Culcairn MPS Emergency Department is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and reminds residents that in an emergency they should call 000 for an Ambulance, or come straight to the ED. HealthDirect is also available on 1800 022 222 for general advice and information.


