Greater Hume Council formed a team in this year's Border Relay for Life to raise much needed funds for cancer research and to support those suffering with this terrible disease.

We have all been touched by this terrible disease in some form and felt it a worthy cause to be a part of. We had 6 staff members form the organising committee. The committee and staff, along with many other helpers along the way, organised fundraising events throughout the last 6 months. These included a cake stall, movie nights, various raffles, a breakfast BBQ, selling of chocolates, an old time dance, lunches and morning teas. The staff at Greater Hume Council dug deep into their own pockets donating goods, cooking, baking and donated time away from their families on weekends and for the event, to do their bit to raise funds and support this great cause. The relay event was held on Saturday 27 October and Sunday 28 October over 24 hours. We had a team on the track relaying for the full 24 hours. We had staff, family members and friends come along and join in which was fantastic.

As a team we raised an outstanding total of \$13,826.02 by the end of the relay. Greater Hume Council were also awarded the X-Ray Group Business Challenge Award. We were the business who raised the most funds this year as a team.

A massive effort was put in by all who were involved and we would like to thank each and every person who assisted and supported and for their contribution to such a successful fundraising event!

The Relay for Life fundraising further builds on efforts of Council staff who in September 2017 participated in the September event. September is a fundraiser for research and developments of treatments and an eventual cure for Cerebral Palsy through the National Cerebral Palsy Alliance. 6 teams of 4 participated in September 2017 registering 6,828,993 steps and fund raising an impressive total of \$5,105.

Henty Streetscape Celebrations

On Friday 9 November the Henty community celebrated with an official opening of the Henty Streetscape Project, together with gala activities highlighting Bendigo Community Bank 20th birthday serving the community, opening of the new fire and rescue station and the craft shop railway precinct. Major infrastructure improvements in Henty have been undertaken by Council over several years, focusing on Sladen Street CBD area, between Ivor Street and Allan Street.

Council's investment in excess of \$1 Million into the town included:

- Installation of heritage style street lighting and undergrounding of power lines
- Installation of a roundabout at corner of Sladen Street and Allan Street
- Installation of underground stormwater drainage
- Replacement of kerb and channel
- Replacement of verandas over footpaths (in conjunction with building owners)
- Replacement of existing footpath with combination of asphalt and concrete pavers
- Resurfacing of Sladen Street with an asphalt overlay, line marking
- New Street furniture and signage
- New garden beds and plantings of street trees

Sladen Street was closed from noon with families and visitors to Henty enjoying the celebrations and the activities such as jumping castles, a merry go round, bucking bull, youth activities, face painting and craft stalls etc. The official opening of the streetscape was conducted by members of Henty's Community Development Committee. To complete an already joyous day "Wobley Boot" performed into the evening and an impressive fireworks display at 9pm ensured that the festivities went off with a bang.

A larger than life bronze sculpture of Headlie Taylor was unveiled by Mr Tim Fischer AC, former Deputy Prime Minister, Member for Farrer and Nationals Leader at Henty's Bicentennial Park, Olympic Highway on Wednesday, 12 September. Many interested locals, family members, donors, councillors and visitors from across Australia attended the event to recognise Headlie Taylor's creation of the world renowned invention of a ground driven header which revolutionised grain harvesting worldwide, over 100 years ago in Henty. The artist/sculptor was Paul Smits, who stayed on to conduct a well attended free workshop on the creation of the sculpture. Several local organisations willingly contributed to support the event, as well as, Murray Arts, Greater Hume Council, Henty Machinery Field Days Committee, Bendigo Bank and both primary schools.

Swimming Pool Safety

Pools can be great fun but they have the potential to be a tragedy. With over 300,000 backyard swimming pools in NSW, swimming pool safety is a vital issue that affects the whole community. In NSW, an average of 11 children under five years of age drown annually, with a further 62 children being admitted to hospital each year for near drowning.

Pool Owners Responsibilities:

- Check there are adequate pool safety barriers in place separating the pool from the residence, adjoining properties and the neighbourhood.
- Ensure all of the pool safety barriers are maintained and operating, e.g. check gates are self-closing and self-latching.
- Supervise children when using the swimming pool.

- Make sure pool gates are kept closed at all times.
- Keep objects (chairs, pot plants) and structures at least 900mm clear of the pool fence at all
- Ensure that your safety barrier is 1200mm in height from the existing ground level.
- Ensure that there are no gaps in your fence greater than 100mm.

Greater Hume Council has received confirmation from the NSW Department of Premier & Cabinet that we were successful in obtaining grants from Round Two of the Stronger Country Communities Fund for the following projects, which are expected to get under way during 2019:

Engineering Works

Listed below is Council's scheduled works program for the next few months.

- Reconstruction of 1km of Jennings Road, Culcairn starting from the Olympic Highway.
- Reconstruction, widening and realignment of the intersection of Urana Road, Walbundrie and Walla Walbundrie Road.
- Widening of a 2km section on Howlong Kywong Road, 4km north of Brocklesby to Burrumbuttock Creek will commence early in 2019.
- Reconstruction, widening of 2.8km of Culcairn Holbrook Road from Willow Bend Creek Bridge to Billabong Creek Bridge including installation of a turn lane into Ralvona Lane funded under the NSW Government "Blackspot Program".
- Construction and sealing of 2.1km of Coach Road, Gerogery commencing from southern sealed end.
- Local Resealing program will commence late November.
- Replacement of wire fence with guardrail on Fairbairns Road, Woomargama over Mountain Creek.
- An extensive grading program for unsealed roads will commence when the weather conditions provide the appropriate moisture levels needed to maintain the integrity of the road surface.

Squirrel Glider LAMP Project Update

On 30 October the former Steering Committee for the Squirrel Glider LAMP Project met under their new title of Advisory Group – Squirrel Glider LAMP Project, reflecting a change in funding sources and structure.

Reports were given on:

- The completed National Landcare (NLP) funded program which included 3 years of on-ground works (planting of 30,000 trees and shrubs, equalling 90ha within a 10km of Burrumbuttock).
- The current Environmental Trust, Nest Box Program.
- Murray Local Land Services (MLLS) – Catchment Action funding.

Actions from the meeting included an update on the current funding from MLLS, maintaining a viable Squirrel Glider population, monitoring activities using motion sensor cameras, working with existing groups (particularly West Hume Landcare group) to run demonstration events and Squirrel Glider Stag Watch events, returning to sites to monitor success, run activities such as a plant give away and/or Stock Proof Tree Guard co-ordination purchase and delivery, establishing priority areas/actions for the newly received Environmental Trust – Restoration and Rehabilitation Grant, investigating how to value and maintain the amazing network of Crown or 'paper' roads in the local area, reviewing existing communication material and suggesting changes and additions.

The next meeting of the advisory group will be in February.

Youth Advisory Committee Successful Grant Application

The Committee was successful in obtaining a FRRR Heywire Grant so watch out next year for an exciting new project coming in April in conjunction with 2019 Youth Week.

The Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR) recently announced that 20 communities will receive grants to pilot youth-developed ideas, thanks to the FRRR ABC Heywire Youth Innovation Grants program. Greater Hume in partnership with Lockhart Shire Council's FRRR ABC Heywire Youth Innovation Grant Step Up Project was one of the successful applications. The ideas originated at the 20th ABC Heywire Regional Youth Summit in February 2018 and address the tough topics facing rural and regional youth ranging from mental health and drug prevention, to youth disengagement and learning about healthy relationships, celebrating indigenous culture, connecting new Australians to agricultural careers and aligning medical professionals with their communities.

Thanks to the Department of Infrastructure, Regional

Development and Cities; The Sally Foundation; Findex Community Fund; the Myer Foundation; and several private donors in providing support for these grants.

The Step Up project will be youth led and driven, increasing youth awareness of local employment and engagement opportunities through workshops in Culcairn and Lockhart, and a 'Festival of Possibilities' showcasing youth achievements.

Overall the grant is a fantastic opportunity to make a real difference in the Greater Hume and Lockhart communities.




Share the Dignity It's in The Bag Christmas Appeal


