

Greater Hume Council Elections

On 4 December elections will be held for North and West Wards only. Three Candidates have nominated for three positions in East Ward therefore this Ward will not be contested and residents of East Ward are not required to vote.

At the 13 October Council meeting it was resolved that Council advise the NSW Electoral Commission that in the event of one or more Wards being uncontested at 2021 Local Government Elections that the Constitutional Referendum on whether the Council should continue to be divided into Wards be withdrawn. Therefore the Constitutional Referendum will not be held.

Pre-poll (early) Voting Options

Pre-poll (early) voting begins on Monday 22 November and ends on Friday 3 December. Early voting in person is available to all voters at these elections to help us stay COVID-safe. Available from:

22 November - 3 December
- Culcairn and Henty
1 December - 3 December

Pre-poll at Council Office locations is only open to those that have been **DOUBLE -VACCINATED OR A MEDICAL EXEMPTION**. If you are not double vaccinated there are pre-polling offices open in Albury to assist. Other early voting options include postal vote and voting online. Both are subject to eligibility. Swimming Pools - All Greater Hume swimming pools are closed Christmas Day. All swimming pools will be open New Year's Day.

Libraries - Culcairn Henty, Holbrook and Jindera Libraries will close at 4.00pm on Friday, 24 December 2021. Libraries reopen in the New Year.

- **Culcairn, Holbrook and Jindera Libraries** – reopen 8.30am Tuesday, 4 January 2022.

Waste Disposal Facilities & Kerbside Garbage Collection - All transfer stations and landfills will be closed Christmas Day and New Year's Day. Kerbside collection will occur on the usual day, but due to trucks operating earlier, residents should put bins out the night before or they may miss being collected.

Mandatory changes to lodging a Development Application

The NSW Government passed amendments to the Environment Planning and Assessment Act 1979 which will require planning applications to be lodged with Council through the NSW Planning Portal. Customers are required to use the Portal to lodge the full range of planning applications, including:

- Development Applications (DAs) including modifications;
- Complying Development Certificates (CDCs);
- Construction Certificates (CCs); - Occupation Certificates;
- Subdivision Certificates; and
- Section 68 Applications including plumbing, solid fuel heaters, transportable buildings etc.

Council will not be able to accept planning applications over the counter, post or via email. It is recognised that some customers may need assistance using the Planning Portal please contact Service NSW on 1300 305 695 or email: info@service.nsw.gov.au.

This needs to be done 24 hours prior to them lighting up which is a legislated responsibility of the landowner. NSW RFS would like this notification so in the event someone calls 000 (in the best of intentions) our duty officers are able to quickly and easily contact the landowner to confirm if a fire truck is required, or not.

Making a Leap

Between late spring and early summer each year, on our farms, roadsides, travelling stock reserves and tucked away patches of large old trees, young Squirrel Gliders will be preparing to take their first leaps. Every year young gliders will outgrow their mother's pouch and their den to build their skills as agile, gliding nocturnal creatures.

Squirrel Glider's often have two young spending the first three months in their mum's pouch. Once they have fur (around 10 weeks), time outside of the pouch increases.

It is at around the 5–6-month age that a young Squirrel Glider will be large enough to begin using their incredible natural, agile skills, however the skills will not be completely refined and there will still be some danger of miss timing flights and landings between and on trees.

The intent of the Squirrel Glider LAMP Project is to create a landscape for Squirrel Gliders to easily move between patches of trees on our farms, roadsides, stock reserves and laneways. Each of these patches form the network or "Squirrel Glider highway" where they can feed, breed and rest and are incredibly important to look after and build upon.

Perhaps if you head out, right on twilight when all you can see are the silhouette of the trees, to a spot where there are large old trees with hollows and just watch - you may well spot a scampering, gliding young Squirrel Glider heading out for the night to feed and test their growing glider skills.

Greater Hume Landcare News

There are four active landcare groups within the Greater Hume LGA. Culcairn Landcare Group (Culcairn), Eastern Riverina Landcare Group (Henty and beyond), Holbrook Landcare Network (Cookardinna, Holbrook, Little Billabong, Woomargama, Rosewood), West Hume Landcare Group (Burrumbuttock, Jindera, Walla Walla, Brocklesby, Glenellen). They regularly collaborate, share 'hot topics' and pool resources.

The NSW Landcare Program supports a Local Landcare Co-ordinator and a Regional Landcare Coordinator who work closely with community groups with a focus on agriculture and nature, there are also Project Officers and volunteers pursuing a wide range of activities.

There are plenty of projects happening across Greater Hume, here are just a few:

- Community planting events – West Hume and LAMP were able to have some planting events on farms. Others had to be postponed due to wet paddocks or COVID lockdowns.
- Plant giveaways were a great success with contactless pickups. Send your photos of thriving plants.
- Burrumbuttock Squirrel Glider LAMP project has been developed to link native vegetation across the landscape so gliders can 'leap' from one patch to another without having to touch the ground. A searching for Squirrel Gliders and other night critters event is planned for Friday 12 November, evening, at Tonks Travelling Stock Route, Burrumbuttock.
- Grassy Woodlands Project – joint Holbrook Landcare, West Hume Landcare, Corowa District Landcare and Murray LLS. Enhancing Grassy Woodlands remnant vegetation on farms.
- Dung beetles – breeding and releasing spring active dung beetles to bridge the gap between the winter active and the summer active varieties.
- Prograze, sheep and mixed farming discussion groups and field days are happening as well.
- Holbrook Beef Group – postponed dinner next year.
- Environmental / Natural Capital Accounting is a hot topic. Who are all these new players wanting to trade your carbon credits?
- Birds on Farms - BirdLife Australia partnership – 4 times per year bird surveys by volunteer teams on farms in the South West Slopes.
- Holbrook Landcare Network Annual General Meeting 9am Thursday, 11 November 2021.

Council's Children Centres and Family Day Care are OPEN



Greater Hume Children Services has continued to provide much needed child care services through its centre based services at Culcairn, Henty, Holbrook and Walla Walla in addition to the more than 60 Family Day Care educators based across the region from Batlow to Benalla. It's been a challenging year with the impact of COVID-19 affecting all services with the many changes, cross border issues and requirements required in order to remain open, maintain services, in addition to managing health and safety risks to remain compliant.

The Culcairn Early Learning Centre successfully transitioned to Greater Hume Children Services in July and continues to provide a full range of child care.

A new van (pictured below) was purchased to provide additional mobile playgroup and other services across all of our delivery areas.



With skills shortages in the early childhood education sector, staff recruitment was a key action; pleasingly, Council has appointed new Centre Directors to all centre based services.

Greater Hume Children Services Manager, Fiona Pattinson said "Our focus continues to be on the children and families and being able to provide services. Our service staff and educators have been amazing and continue to step up and meet all of the challenges that have been thrown at us and I would like to acknowledge and thank all of them for the valuable work they do on a daily basis." Demand for services remains strong with Family Day Care having a waiting list for the first time in a long time and the Holbrook centre operating close to capacity. There are vacancies available for families who need the service for work and who want to maintain routines and consistency for their children. Additionally,

there are work opportunities for new educators to work with the service particularly in the Family Day Care sector. Contact GHCS for more information.





Silage Wrap and Twine Recycling

Holbrook Landcare and Greater Hume Council have partnered together to provide landholders and community members an opportunity to recycle their silage wrap and twine. Skip bins have been placed at the Holbrook, Mullengandra, Burrumbuttock and Culcairn landfill sites. The skip bins will be specially signed with what can and can't be recycled, and how farm plastic is to be packaged for recycling: silage wrap and twine must be packaged in plastic disposable liners provided by Holbrook Landcare. Silage wrap and twine must be submitted in separate bags, not mixed together! You can collect plastic disposal liners from the Holbrook Landcare office, Greater Hume Council Culcairn Office or Wirraminna Environmental Education Centre Burrumbuttock. The tip sites will also have liners on hand.



Swimming Pool Safety

Pools can be great fun but they have the potential to be a tragedy. With over 300,000 backyard swimming pools in NSW, swimming pool safety is a vital issue that affects the whole community. In NSW, pool owners responsibilities:

- Check there are adequate pool safety barriers in place separating the pool from the residence, adjoining properties and the neighbourhood.
- Ensure all of the pool safety barriers are maintained and operating, e.g. check gates are self-closing and self-latching.
- Supervise children when using the swimming pool.
