

Well done Lydia, as it isn't as easy when living in a regional area to compete against the city-based horses, where many of the competitions are held.







The surnames were Klemke (two families), Fischer, Lieschke, Mickan, Terlich, Hennersdorf, and Wenke as well as Johann Gottlieb Snr and Jr and single man Frederich Luhrs. They were all Lutherans, and all German speakers. There were some very young children, and one heavily pregnant woman. Their spiritual leader was Johann Gottlieb Klemke, aged 59.

They travelled with fourteen wagons and two spring carts, all pulled by horses. Some cows were also brought along to provide milk for the children and some poultry to provide eggs.

They left as a group from Ebenezer near Nuriootpa, S.A. 


Seniors Luncheon

Walla Walkabouts



It happened in Walla (well, Jindera actually...)

On Wednesday, 4th July, a group of 30+ people met at the Jindera Community Hub to talk about refugees. Three refugees (two from south Asia, and one from central Africa), who have settled in Albury, told their story. Upon arrival in Australia, after nearly a decade in refugee camps, they were thankful for "just receiving a smile," and having electricity and running water! Having settled in, they are now beginning to think about how they can give back to their community.

The meeting was organised by Multicultural NSW, a department of our state government given the task of building a welcoming, multicultural society. The meeting was attended by members of Greater Hume Council, including our mayor Cr Heather Wilton. This advisory meeting was specially held in Greater Hume to explore opportunities to welcome refugees in this region.

Members from the Walla Walla Refugee Committee (WWRRC) presented our progress to date (see picture). We have started investigating employment options and rental houses, as well as thinking about opportunities and challenges. We have already begun promoting our town as a welcoming place for refugees to help build our community for everyone's mutual benefit.

WWRRC meets every 4th Wednesday of the month from 7pm at St Paul's College. These meetings are always open to the public, with a Q&A session at the end. Our next meetings are 25th July and 22nd August.—Dan Mueller
