### ANZAC DAY, REMEMBRANCE DAY and the RSL

Anzac Day at Walla Walla has again been a wonderful day, with many people from our town participating. We will remember them.

There may be some people who would like to become more personally involved in these events, like marching or helping in some way. This article is to give information to them, especially if they would like to join RSL.

The main reason I became an RSL member was to help the special ceremonies and traditions of Anzac Day and Remembrance Day continue in our town. Fortunately I was eligible, having done National Service in Adelaide. I heard that the RSL sub-branch in Walla Walla was going to discontinue. So I joined RSL and became a member in the Culcairn sub-branch. As this is written, there is only one other full RSL member here: Jack Schmidt. There is also one Auxiliary RSL member: John Seidel. So RSL in Walla Walla is surviving by a very thin thread. The RSL sub-branch in Culcairn has only a few members. Fortunately, Anzac House in Albury and the Albury sub-branch are very helpful to us.

We are extremely fortunate to have a very active and competent Anzac Day Committee. Apart from people mentioned above, members include Karen Wenke, Julie Barber, Graeme Wenke, Graeme Cunningham and Sandra Wilksch. There are also many other very loyal people who help when the special days come along.

Jack, John and I attend the Culcairn sub-branch meetings, which are held once a month.

I feel it would be good if more locals become either full or associate RSL members of the Culcairn sub-branch. The rules are pretty simple:

- 1. People who have worn any Australian Armed Service uniform in any section of Armed Service are eligible to be full members.
- 2. People who are aged 18 and over and who have a family member who has served in the Armed Service are eligible to be auxiliary members.

Notes: It is possible that a person is eligible for both of these. Medals are worn by anyone who has served in the Armed Forces (left side) People of any age can wear medals of relatives on special days (right side) even if there is no RSL connection. However, only RSL members can wear an RSL badge.

- 3. To obtain free medals (if not already received), there is a simple process of applying to Canberra.
- 4. Membership does not necessarily require attendance at meetings, or doing other jobs.
- 5. Becoming a member is a fairly simple process. The important requirement is paper evidence of armed service. A form is to be filled in, then processed by our sub-branch, and then at RSL State Headquarters in Sydney.

My personal experience is that it gives a person a good feeling to be an RSL member. We are then part of a very large group to help remember what others have done, and are doing, to have peace in our country. We also support people who need help.

I should be able to give assistance to anyone eligible to gain RSL membership.

For anyone interested, the Culcairn sub-branch room is well worth a look, because it is dedicated to RSL activities, and has much memorabilia displayed. Visitors are welcome at the meetings.

## Walla Walla Silos – One Hundred Years Old.

It was found that no precaution had been taken to prevent the moisture soaking through to the grain in the base of the silos. After the repair, the Walla silos were ready for the 1921-1922 harvest, and no more issues of damp grain arose. Brocklesby's silos suffered the same issue and were not ready for receivals that season.

Walla Silo statistics and operation procedure – 1919.


Each silo or "bin" is made of reinforced concrete, external diameter is 36ft 5in, (11.1m) and height is 70ft. (21.3m), the walls are about 10in thick. They have a hopper base, which allows grain to empty by gravity into the conveyor channel that runs about 3metres beneath, the length of the 4 bins. The grain was bought in by the farmers, mostly by horse and wagon; there was a report that in 1917 the first motorised lorry and a trailer was used to deliver bagged grain to the Walla stacks. The bags were then unloaded by hand into a receiving hopper from a platform beside the wagon. Then, as now, grain then gravitated to the boot in the well of the hopper, from there it was picked up by the elevator buckets, and lifted vertically up the elevator leg, this probably is clearer on the small white elevators presently used by the oat mill. Once at the top of the elevator, the grain is then emptied into another hopper which leads to a conveyor operating across the top of the silo bins. At a point above any one of the bins a tripper, also called a diverter, is placed manually, this allows grain to flow into any

one of the bins above which the conveyor operates.

In 1919 there was no allowance vet for bulk delivery, this was added to the system later as gradually a few tipping drays began to be used for bulk haulage. A tipping platform was also added; this allowed wagons to be unharnessed from horses and tipped up as a unit, and also used by trucks later on. So, for the time being the tiresome job of cleaning, washing and patching bags for reuse continued, in some cases into the 1960s. See the recent Walla Walla Celebrating the Journey photo book, compiled by Janet and Ashley Paech, page 26. These pictures from around 1960, show the tipping platform and the variety of bulk and bags being delivered to Walla by small and large tray trucks and also semi -trailers.

The small bundle of 6 silos or grading bins as they are known, on the west end, were completed in September 1922.

In August of 1924, on emptying, a 5 foot long live snake was found in one of the silo bins

Weevils; although they had been getting free passage to Australia since the First Fleet and on most of the other convict and migrant ships for many subsequent years, weevils had been a concern to some at Walla since about 1916. Most bag stacks like Walla often reported infestations, but these fell on deaf ears or they were told to sell the wheat ASAP, often succeeding only months later. In January 1918, a reporter came to Walla bag stacks, and asked the two men who handled the grain about weevils, the answer was one of surprise, they indicated that the weevil was a problem that few knew of, and those that did know, cared even less! Later in the day, a wheat buyer pointed out a stack swarming with weevils from bottom almost to the top. At another station along the railway line, it was reported that a wheat buyer got no satisfaction reporting weevils. Month after month passed only to see weevils turning wheat into a mass of empty shells.

The Walla farmers must have been rejoicing that this pest could now be much more easily controlled once the silos had been built!


