MEET LIAM

He is 7 years of age and suffers from Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD).

DMD is a genetic disorder that causes progressive muscle degeneration. It is caused by a missing protein– the one needed to keep muscles working and usually affects boys. Symptoms start as early as 3 –first affecting hips, pelvic area, thighs and shoulders and later skeletal muscles in arms, legs and trunk. By early teens, the heart and respiratory muscles are also affected. Many are wheelchair bound by 11 or 12.

Liam lives with his mum, dad and two younger siblings in Thurgoona and is currently in Year 1 at Thurgoona Public School. There are tough times ahead for Liam and his family. Liam is the grandson of Michael & Wendy Mohr. To support Liam they will need to make their home wheel chair friendly and purchase a vehicle which can transport a wheelchair.

Your support would be greatly appreciated to assist in Liam's long term care.





premises they remain property of the library but we would love you to come and join up to enjoy our great selection of books at home.




What a huge crowd we had at the library for croc encounters on Wednesday 10th Oct. It was a great turnout so thanks to all who came.

HOLBROOK LANDCARE

Biodiversity Conservation Trust tenders for conservation opened this week.

The NSW Government invested in a Trust Fund for native vegetation protection on private land as part of the reforms in 2017. This funding is available for landholders to long term (in-perpetuity or long term 15+ agreements) protect and manage native vegetation on their properties for conservation in return for an annual "stewardship" payment. The eligibility criteria will be available on the Holbrook Landcare website when the EOI opens – likely to be a minimum ha and there will likely be priority areas and vegetation types. Sites that are already fenced or under current agreement with Landcare or the MLLS may still be eligible as long as you are agreeing to longer term agreement on them. This is different to other programs in that funding is a "stewardship" payment given annually to the landholder for the length of the agreement, which may be forever. This is a chance for areas of native vegetation to earn an annual income for your farm and diversify your farm business. On submission of an EOI (which will be open for three weeks from Oct 22nd), the conservation sites are assessed by the BCT staff (Dec/Jan 2019) and a conservation value established. A tender involves the landholder putting in a bid as to what the annual management of the site is worth to them. **Holbrook Landcare Board**: With the AGM for Holbrook Landcare

coming up next month, nominations are open for interested people to become involved in the Board. Please contact the office if you would like to complete a nomination form. Further information is in the advertisement in this issue of Holbrook Happenings.

"Save The Fuss Put 'em On Us"

CARE URGED DURING THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA SEASON

People prone to respiratory conditions are being urged to take extra care as the start of thunderstorm season approaches. Murrumbidgee Local Health District Director Public Health Unit Tracey Oakman has urged asthma sufferers and people with breathing problems to take extra precautions during the next four weeks.

"Even if you don't have asthma, you should take extra care because airborne pollens are at their highest levels at this time of year," Mrs Oakman said. "Where possible avoid being outside during thunderstorms over the next four weeks. Parents should be vigilant to keep their children inside during storms, with the doors and windows closed."

In Melbourne in 2016, about 3,600 more people than usual presented to hospital and nine died from asthma attacks after a severe thunderstorm.

"Thunderstorms cause pollen grains to explode and release fine particles which can be inhaled deeply into the lungs, causing even more people to wheeze and sneeze. Anyone with diagnosed asthma should carry their asthma medication with them at all times during this high risk period."

The Public Health Unit will be monitoring thunderstorm activity and pollen count levels and issuing alerts at these high risk times. "If you have asthma, make sure you have an asthma action plan and are proactively managing your symptoms. "It's also important for people to know Asthma first aid, so they can help family and friends when they need it."


The four steps to remember are:

- sit the person upright;
- give four separate puffs from their reliever puffer;
- wait four minutes and if there's no improvement, give four more puffs; and
- if there's still no improvement, dial 000.

Breathing difficulties can be life threatening. In the event of an asthma emergency dial triple zero (000) immediately.

Charles Sturt University (CSU) has set up a SMS alert system when the pollen counts are high and thunderstorms are predicted. To register go to: https:// science.csu.edu.au/asthma

HISTORY QUIZ

Previous Who am I? I died in Henty in 1935, my son had an Albury menswear shop, and was the first president of the Albury and District Football League. He founded the Albury Rovers (Holbrook played a prominent part in the League).

Ron Nolan won the Best & Fairest Medal [the Stavely Medal] in 1936, playing for Cookardinia, Jim Kendall won the Carlton Brewery Medal in 1938, playing for Holbrook, runner-up in the medal count in 1939.

The war cut the season short in 1940. After the war in 1947 Charlie Craig, the Cookardinia captain won the Carlton Brewery Medal, with Eric Heather and Brian Brennan close behind. Brian Brennan won the medal in 1948 and in 1949, he tied with Des Donkin in 1950. Another local mentioned in the Holbrook team in 1950, was Ron Trescowthick.

In 1951 Holbrook defeated Culcairn in the Grand Final, 12.19 [91] to 9.8 [62] Ron Bunyan and Brian Brennan were equal second in the medal count. In 1952 Ron Bunyan, of Cookardinia, won the Baz Medal.

Who was the founder of the Albury & District Football League? **Answer:** Jane Tonge Vivian died at Henty in 1935, her son was Alexander Dundas Vivian.

Who am I? I died in Culcairn in February 1966, served three years in the Navy, was Deputy Culcairn Shire President and donated the Best & Fairest Medal in the Farrer League.

Are You Aware of the AIDER Program?

Aider stands for "Assistance for Infirm, Disabled and Elderly Residents". It is a **one-off free service** provided by NSW Rural Fire Service volunteers to assist in the reduction of bush fire hazards for aged and disabled members of the community.

The aim of the service is to support residents to live safely and confidently in areas which may be prone to bush fires. The property must be bush fire prone, meaning an area of land that can support a bush fire, or is likely to be subject to bush fire attack.

AIDER services may include:

- Thinning vegetation
- Removing leaves, sticks & fallen branches
- Trimming branches from around and overhanging the home
- Mowing & slashing long grass
- Cleaning gutters.

Eligible persons include aged residents and residents with disabling conditions who have limited domestic support from family, relatives, friends and other services.

An assessment of the property can be requested by phoning (02) 8741 4955. This assessment is carried out by NSW Rural Fire Service staff and all works are completed by Rural Fire Service teams. Advice will be given about completing your Bush Fire Survival Plan.




