HOLBROOK CAMPDRAFT 2021

After a forced hiatus in 2020, local campdrafters were thrilled to be back into the swing of things this year with the Holbrook Campdraft held across the last weekend of April. Idyllic autumnal weather conditions made for an action packed three days of campdrafting with competitors coming from far and wide across the southern states. This year marked our first use of the new building at the HEC campdraft arena, with a much anticipated upgrade from the former shed completed over the last 18 months. Much time and effort has gone into this project and the outcome has been excellent.

The weekend proved to be highly competitive, with local riders well represented across the weekend in finals and placings.

Wantagong based rider Richard Triggs showed us all how it's done, taking out 1st place in the Maiden A Draft on board 'Goody Two Shoes'. Holbrook sportsman Jim Grills also had success in the event with 3rd place on 'Berragoon Mardigras' and 6th place on 'Berragoon Floozy'. Up-and-coming young Gerogery horseman, Archer Chaston, placed a close 2nd on 'Mitchells Fantasy' in the Maiden B Draft.

Local ladies were well represented in the Ladies event with Georgie Cottrell placing 2nd, Lucy Grills 4th, and Evie Quihampton also making the final. Lucy's 88 point first-round score on 'Berragoon Floozy' saw her awarded for both the *Highest 1st Round Scoring Lady Rider* and *Highest 1st Round Scoring Local Rider*.

Our young local riders shone in the Juvenile event with Claire Cottrell placing a close equal 2nd-3rd, and Scarlett Chaston from Gerogery equal 4th-6th. Tooma rider John Mitchell was the star of the show when it came to the Feature Open, winning the event on his mare 'Duckndaisy', in addition to 5th and equal 6-7th places on his two other horses entered. Local talents Lachie Sim and Luke Carman were also in good form making finals in the Novice events.

With the Sunday being ANZAC day, a commemorative reading was delivered by Sandra Beirs, The Last Post played, and a minute's silence observed to acknowledge and celebrate the men and women who have served to keep Australia safe, and also commemorate the important role that Australian horses have contributed in wartime.

This year we were fortunate to have received

tremendous ongoing and new sponsorship support from local businesses such as Holbrook Stores Pty Ltd, Brett's Rural Services, Carman Spreading Services, Winnett Equipment Hire, R. S. LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Recently there have been some concerns raised about Phase 1a of the COVID-19 National Vaccine Rollout in the Murrumbidgee's residential aged care facilities, specifically the delayed delivery of vaccines. On behalf of Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network (MPHN), I would like to Julie Redway Acting Chief Executive Officer acknowledge the COVID-19 vaccination rollout is complex and challenging.

Primary Networks Health across Australia. including MPHN, have been tasked by the matthew.olsen@mphn.org.au Commonwealth Department of Health to provide (02) 6923 3168 support to a number of stakeholder groups including residential aged care facilities, general practices and GP vaccination hubs regarding rollout of the COVID-19 vaccination program across all phases. Scheduling of COVID-19 vaccinations under the Phase 1a is managed directly by the Department of Health with Commonwealth contractors administering the vaccine to residents of aged care. We are now pleased to confirm all privately operated residential aged care facilities now have their facility scheduled to receive the Pfizer vaccine. The first doses will all be complete by mid-May 2021.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all professionals healthcare across Murrumbidgee, who continue to work diligently with such passion, empathy and care for their patients.




village and we look forward to sharing photos of its use and produce very soon!



LEST WE FORGET – VALENTINE F. BOWLER

Trooper Valentine "Val" Bowler, son of Samuel and Mary Bowler was born in Holbrook in 1894. Bowler attended St. Ignatius College, Riverview, in Sydney and obtained rural training at the Wagga Experimental Farm. At the outbreak of World War One, he was working as a grazier on the family farm.

In late 1915 Valentine joined the 1st Light Horse Regiment stating his age as 22, although he was only 20 at the time. Bowler embarked from Sydney aboard HMAT *Anglo-Egyptian*. He trained in Egypt prior to being sent to Gallipoli. At Gallipoli, his regiment relieved another Light Horse regiment at Pope's Hill. Pope's Hill was a ridge in the heights above ANZAC Cove named after Colonel Harold Pope of the 16th Battalion. It became occupied by Australian troops on 25th April

1915 and remained a key post on the ANZAC frontline until the end of the Gallipoli campaign. Bowler was killed on 7th August 1915 whilst on sentry duty following a day of fierce fighting. At about 10pm Bowler and a comrade went to their posts in the trench at Pope's Hill.

Sometime later Valentine was shot by a sniper. He was taken to a casualty clearing station where John Purtell, also from Holbrook, stayed with him until he passed away a short time later. The following day he was buried by Chaplain Rev. J. McPhee. Trooper Bowler was laid to rest in Beach Cemetery, on the Gallipoli Peninsula, in Turkey.

PLANT PICK PLATE

We have not yet embraced Winter but as a gardener I am already thinking of Spring. The tasks of fertilising the soil and planning my productive garden - what and where to plant,



while adhering to a crop rotation system of planting, are all issues to consider, explore and implement.

I started by eagerly collecting my containers of seeds to check what variety of vegetables I could start growing as seedlings in punnets right away and which packets of seed I would need to purchase. I have shamefully neglected to note the Best by Date on each seed packet, hence around 1/3 of expired packets must be discarded. As with food in your pantry, vegetable seeds will deteriorate with age. The packets also need to be inspected for contaminates and damaged seeds possibly contributed to by poor storage.

What to do with these old seeds? Rather than place in the bin, some gardeners sow them direct into dormant garden beds to grow as green manure. Digging the lush green growths into the soil prior to flowering will provide a significant nitrogen boost, ready for spring crops. Legumes (beans and peas) also introduce nutrients to the soil when dug in while young. In my containers I found several packets of Mustard seed which not only improves the soil but also acts as a bio fumigant to reduce the growth of soil borne disease and fungal diseases which infest root vegetables and tomatoes. I regularly cast this green manure seed over the soil at the end of each crop throughout my vegetable gardens as a tonic for the next plants.

Returning to my seed packets on hand, I need to replenish my collection. Enthusiastically I will be exploring seed catalogues for new exciting and heritage varieties of vegetables to grow.

Superstar GIANT Alyce Parker has continued to add honours to her short but glittering career, winning back-to-back Gabrielle Trainor Medals as club champion.

The two-time All Australian from Holbrook in southern NSW - in just her third season in the competition - led the count from start to finish and polled the highest amount of votes in club history, under the current voting system.

Parker becomes the first dual winner of the Gabrielle Trainor Medal and finished ahead of 2019 winner Rebecca Beeson and Irishwoman and the oldest player in the competition - Cora Staunton.

The 20-year-old finished equal second in the league Best and Fairest with the equal-highest average disposals for the league with 23.9 a game, whilst also averaging 5.6 clearances and 5.1 tackles to further enhance her reputation as one of the competition's best.

Coach Alan McConnell paid tribute to Parker's stellar season.

"This is just another well-deserved award for Alyce," McConnell said.

"She'd had an outstanding start to her short career but the best thing is that she also has the drive and determination to want to continue to improve every single season.

"Alyce has taken her game on the field to another level this season but she's also continued to improve as a leader of our football club off the field and we expect that to only continue in the vears to come."

Chairman Tony Shepherd congratulated Parker and spoke about the resilience of the club's AFLW program.

"The past 12 months has seen our group confront some enormous challenges and the resilience and strength the players and staff have shown has been incredible," Mr Shepherd said.

"We're so proud of this group and the performances they put out on field even after being the only team to have to relocate to get the crowned the Gabrielle Trainor Medallist. 2021 season away.

"I congratulate Alyce on behalf of the entire club on her outstanding season. She continues to be an amazing role model for aspiring footballers across NSW and the ACT and we're so proud she's a GIANT.


