
We have certainly noticed the phone rings a lot more! On this topic, whilst the number you call to speak to Customer Service is 02 6036 0100, if you want to call the library directly about specific library enquiries, you can simply call our extension number which is 02 6036 0173 (note that our old number 02 6036 3262 is still currently working but not for much longer, so now is a good time to put our new number in your contacts and start using.) Another major bonus for our library is that our opening hours now align with council customer service hours. So we are open Monday to Friday from 8.30am to 5pm. We get the Border Mail delivered every day so with our new hours, you could call in early each day and read the paper, sitting in a quiet sunny corner of the library.

With our new hours there is more flexibility for you. Things such as Story Time, which has always been at 11am (our previous opening time) could maybe start earlier if that suited more families. Maybe 9.30am start would suit after dropping school aged kids at school? We are open to suggestions so please let us know if an earlier start would mean that you could now join in with the Story Time group.

It is true that since Covid took hold, borrowing books at the library has been very quiet and we would love people to put down their tablets and visit us for some hands on entertainment. BOOK REVIEW Bush School by Peter O'Brien

I had seen this book sitting face out on our non fiction shelves for some time. I assumed by the front cover that it was a historical book about small schools back in the late 1800s. ANGLICAN NEWS

On Sunday the 22nd we will have Bishop Mark Short and his wife Monica as guest at our 9:30am Service in Holbrook. Bishop Mark is the head of the Anglican Church of the Diocese of Canberra & Goulburn which covers from below Wollongong, south to the VIC border, the west along the border to near Albury, then north to above Cootamundra, and then back to below Wollongong. This is a big area to cover and be responsible for and we are blessed to have them visit us.

I learned recently that one of the oldest Anglican Churches in Australia that has not been restored is at Morven, but it is not easy to find. I was a part of a discussion recently that centred on the topic, "What is the purpose of having churches in our community?" I remember studying early Australian Settlement and for a new Village or Town to be recognized it had to have several services available to the community.

There had to be in place, or within one day ride by horse the following: A General Store that sold clothing and provisions, a place accommodation and refreshment for travellers (Hotel), A Police Officer and maybe a Court House, A communication centre now a Post Office, a Church, a Medical Service, and a public recreation area. We can begin to see that basic fabric of a community is still in place in Holbrook. There was one item left off the list for the criteria for establishing a designated village or town, and that is people, = US. It was assumed that there would be people there, and the main reason a community exists is to meet the needs of people, by people. The answer to the question above; "What is the purpose of having churches in our community?" Is; Holbrook, or "Germanton," would not have existed without having a Church in it!

In John's Gospel in Chapter 14 verse 6 Jesus said: "I am the way, and the truth, and the life, no one comes to the Father but through Me." Churches are important because they reveal the presence of Jesus in a community.



PLANT PICK PLATE

I have received my recently ordered vegetable and herb seeds. The punnets having been sown, the tray sitting on my table in bright light awaiting the emergence of the tiny green sprouts. I was delighted to also receive a complementary Companion Planting Guide. This beautifully illustrated A2 poster contains a wealth of information on both pest repellent and attractant plants to suit home gardeners.

Scanning the list of flower companions where Marigolds and Nasturtium feature prominently, a whole range of herbs are also listed as companions to the vegetables and fruit in the garden.



It make sense to plant your herbs in amongst the vegetables or along borders to gain full advantage of repelling pests, while planting the insect decoy plant away from your precious crop. Interestingly, there is also a column on plants that are not friendly to others and need to be planted apart. Gardeners must avoid planting these side by side. The humble Potato and the popular Tomato, members of the Solanaceae family, feature here regularly. Avoid closeness to Apple, Asparagus and Berries. The Pear, Cherry and Melon are also not companions and neither are the Zucchini, Pumpkin, Turnip or Silverbeet friends with the Potato or Tomato.

So what is it about these two vegetables the restrict the growth of its neighbour and causes disquiet in the garden?

Apart from being hungry and absorbing the soil nutrients, the only other reason I could conclude was due to disease. Spotted wilt can infest these Solanaceae vegetables. The Aphids are attracted and subsequently spread the disease to other plants. As gardeners know Aphids are regular visitors to the garden and can create decimation en mass. Consequently, my Potato and Tomato plants will be planted in isolation with their only companion and friend, the Sweet Basil.


