


### HOLBROOK NETBALL CLUB JUNIOR PRESENTATION





### **NEWS FROM HOLBROOK HOSPITAL**

Hello Holbrook Community,

I appreciate these times are challenging for everyone. While staff at the hospital are working hard to support the community and our residents we'd also like to thank you for doing your part to keep the community safe and well.

Some updates from the team at Holbrook Health Service:

1) This year we have had above average rainfall throughout winter that can result in increased grass growth and higher pollen counts during the Spring Thunderstorm Asthma danger period. This is to support producers already trialling pastures, those that want to try them and to increase knowledge and skills in the region to maximise the chances of success.

We'll be looking across the spectrum of activities, from pre-sowing weed management, to sowing, to grazing management and everything in between. We are planning to bring everyone along on the journey with us — farmers and agronomists, seed companies, and also have the backing of NSW DPI expertise.

### **ANGLICAN NEWS**

The recent Covid Lock Down at Albury extended to many Holbrook folk in Holbrook who had been to Albury in the preceding week. The Lock Down impacted on me as I had been to Albury which meant I had to isolate and could not be at worship on Sunday 19th.

Chatting with a lot of our church members revealed that they had been to Albury and also had to go into Lockdown. With this information at hand the Parish Council decided to cancel worship on the 19<sup>th</sup>. The decision to cancel worship due to the Covid carried into Albury by someone made me angry because it should have not happened.

What do we do with anger? Saint Paul wrote in the book of Ephesians Chapter 4 verse 26: "Be angry, but do not sin!" Even Jesus got angry and drove the traders out of the temple because they were violating a Holy Place, but He did not sin. I, like Jesus, was angry with the Covid, but did not sin, what do you do with anger? It is no good keeping anger pent up inside because it can do one of two things, it can make you aggressive, or depressive.

Anger and frustration must be worked through and worked out of your system in a healthy way, e.g., physical activity, telling people how you feel and why, writing down what you feel, etc, are helpful. Appreciating the good things that we have also helps us focus on dealing with anger, e.g., think of those overseas who either, cannot get back to Australia, and those who cannot leave Australia to visit loved ones. ### GREATER HUME COUNCIL NEWS -SEPTEMBER

Council resolved to write to the NSW Government to withdraw the Environmental Planning and Assessment Amendment (Infrastructure Contributions) Bill 2021 from NSW Parliament. Additionally, Council will call on the to undertake **NSW** Government further consultation with the local government sector on any proposed reforms to the infrastructure contributions system. Council will also seek a meeting with Justin Clancy, Member for Albury, to discuss the likely impact the Bill will have on Council, our community and ratepayers.

Cr Doug Meyer OAM was voted as Deputy Mayor which was put to open vote at the Council meeting.

Council reaffirmed its delegates for various organisations / committees where Council is represented for the remainder of the Council term

Council will enter into a Partnership Agreement with Service NSW for Business. Service NSW for Business provides free, personalised support to small business owners, to help them understand industry regulations, to guide them through transactions, and to access support.

The 2020-2021 Financial Statements were adopted as presented.

The Greater Hume Energy Savings Action Plan (ESAP) was adopted. The ESAP has identified that initiatives undertaken to date have resulted in a 48% reduction of net electricity usage.

Council agreed that the operation of the Greater Hume Disability Inclusion Action Plan 2017/2021 will be extended to the period 30 June 2022.

Council are currently reviewing the Community Strategic Plan. There are a number of opportunities for the community to contribute to the development of the plan. The Council website also advises other means to engage with us.

### **MEALS ON WHEELS**

As the Covid – 19 pandemic continues, we all need to stay at home as much as we can. Holbrook Meals on Wheels can help you to stay well-nourished and stay in your own home by ensuring that your meals make a positive contribution to your nutritional needs. We can support you to make informed menu choices to ensure you are getting a well-balanced meal, designed to nourish your body.

We can also help you with your shopping needs and transport to appointments. Although you must be registered with My Aged Care and have a referral it is very simple to arrange. Call 1800 200 422 or call us on 02 6036 3677 and we can help you.

Although our staff are working as usual, while Albury remains in lockdown our office door will be locked for general entry. You can still call in, just ring the bell and we will meet you at the door for screening prior to entry. We are trying to keep everyone safe, clients, volunteers and staff. There is a great deal of scientific research that highlights the unique nutritional needs of older adults. Malnutrition can be a problem for older people living in the community for a range of reasons, including having a reduced appetite and/ or illness. According to the National Meals Guidelines "It is estimated that 5-8% of older Australians living in the community additional malnourished. An 35-39% are considered to be at high risk of malnutrition." Malnutrition can cause loss of muscle and loss of strength and mobility, increasing the risk of falls and fractures, also osteoporosis, slower wound healing, increasing the length of stays in hospital and, potentially, reducing an older person's ability to stay in their own home and contributing to premature death. It is much easier to prevent malnutrition than to treat it in older adults.

Having meals delivered should not be seen as a last resort. Meal services may be suggested to older people who are unwell and this service may only be needed in the short term until the person recovers and is able to prepare their own meals again. Alternatively, a meal service can also be provided to a person who requires ongoing assistance with meals to support functional independence and wellbeing. We are happy to discuss your needs.

The provision of a meal each day can be an enabler that can improve opportunities for increased participation in life's other roles, such as meeting friends or engaging in activities. Home delivered meals also have the added advantages of providing an opportunity for social interaction and the potential to monitor a person's health and well-being — they are 'More than Just a Meal"!

Don't forget our social support services — if you are feeling lonely or would just like someone to phone you on a regular basis to chat and check all is well, let us know. We will be happy to arrange a friendly volunteer to make a regular call to you.

### PLANT PICK PLATE

The recent continual rain has exposed a spongy, wet site in my garden. The water pools at the fence line then flows through my purpose dug drain and away from my productive garden. However, the soil is still soaked and has become sour and unproductive. My solution was to place a raised garden bed on this area, keeping the drain open. I recruited my garden helper with his marvellous construction skills then it was just a matter of obtaining friable soil as fill.

I arrived at the soil and gravel centre with a number of requirements. Loam is what I required! This is a soil that has a gritty texture, must bind together yet also crumble. There must also be an incorporation of compost materials and sand together with well matured manure (no smell).

I was directed to a soil pile which appeared suitable. I squeezed the soil then produced my pH Test Kit and took 2 samples for an accurate result. One from the outside of the heap then another further within.

Correct PH releases elements and micro elements into the soil to be taken up by the plants thereby encouraging healthy growth. The pH scale ranges from 1–14 with 7 neutral and optimum pH for productive plants. An Acid soil range is 1–4 which can be corrected with the application of Lime. An Alkaline soil range is 10–14 and will require the application of Sulphur to lower the pH. My tests indicated this loamy soil on the edge of Alkaline 9–10. I have added my home made compost and Sulphur, waiting a few days, then another test for pH prior to planting. The soil salesman looked at me curiously until I

advised the soil was close to ideal. The raised garden is fantastic and I can't wait to plant.

#### **FEATHERWEIGHT SPONGE BY HOPE**

4 or 5 eggs (I use 5 unless using a smaller tin. Eggs at room temp. at least 2-3 days old), ¾ cup castor sugar¾ cup wheaten corn flour, 1 rounded tablespoon custard powder, ¾ teaspoon cream of tartar, ½ teaspoon carb soda. Sift all four dry ingredients together. Separate eggs — pinch of salt in the whites, vanilla in the yolks. Beat whites till they hold shape, gradually add castor sugar, beating briskly, lastly add egg yolk and beat for a couple of minutes. Reduce speed to slow on Mixmaster or fold in dry ingredients. (I do it all in my old Mixmaster) Prepare the tin by spraying with cooking spray, line the base with cooking paper and spray again. I think the secret to the cake is a deep tin. 2x sponge tins — 21cm across & 7cm deep

large tin – 29cm across & 8cm deep 4 egg mix tin – 23cm square & 8cm deep.

Pour mixture into tin, I tap mine on the floor or bench to reduce air bubbles, before placing in oven to cook for 25-26 minutes, check it is cooked before taking out of oven.

Oven Temperature: 175° F (old oven) or 250° C (modern oven)

Remove from oven when cooked onto grease proof paper to cool.

Slice cake with serrated knife when cool and fill with lemon filling & whipped cream. Ice with passionfruit icing or dust with icing sugar.

NB reduce quantity of corn flour and add a tablespoon cocoa to make chocolate sponge.
