As a community, we are soon to benefit from a state-of-the-art facility that the Holbrook community will have to enjoy for generations to come.

Russell's roles within the Holbrook community are many and varied. Russell epitomizes what volunteering is all about in a country community.



Holbrook Health Service have been given supply of Saliva Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) to be dispersed via our ED to Community members.

These RATS are for people presenting to our facility who do not require a PCR but are symptomatic. The attached information clarifies who requires a Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) and who requires PCR test for COVID 19.

Pick up time is at 3 pm. Rapid antigen tests will be labelled with name and will be found for collection in front of Emergency Department to collect.

PLANT PICK PLATE

This season I have adopted a more diligent routine of succession planting than in previous years, which involves quick growing vegetable plantings to fill small spaces within my garden. Whether slotted between rows of larger growing plants, under planted amongst higher vegetable bushes or filling the end of a row, this method is providing my kitchen with a continual supply of fresh produce throughout the season.

Implementing this system provides all gardeners the opportunity to plant different varieties of a vegetable as an experiment to ascertain their growing performance and ultimately their taste and versatility in the kitchen. More importantly, the delicate vegies are provided with protection from the hot sun and strong wind while moisture is retained in the soil, all of which encourage vigorous growth and delay the greens shooting to seed early and spoiling.

In my garden, I planted Asian greens amongst the block of tall sweet corn and they have thrived, as has the cos lettuce happily growing under the established climbing tomatoes. As vegies have matured and harvested, small plantings of the very versatile spring onion, beetroot, radish and carrots have been slotted in to extend the variety on my plate. These four are low feeders and therefore ideal as second plantings in a plot to follow a heavy feeding vegetable.

There is still time to add to your vegetable production with succession planting, however as the season is heading towards Autumn, give some plots a rest and prepare these beds in readiness for plantings of the heavy feeders, the large leafy greens - cabbage, broccoli, cauliflower and brussels sprout, by adding compost and manure or sowing green manure seeds.


