COMMUNITY GARDEN

As last reported, the Holbrook Community Garden is moving to the site next to the Library. Although a lot of progress is not yet visible, much has happened over the last month or so. The Greater Hume Council has cleaned out the old Community Garden and has excavated a site for the new garden on the land next to the Library, allowing for crusher granite to be delivered making the area more accessible.

Sancon Civil Pty Ltd generously donated 14m³ of crusher granite to the site and McCarthy Bulk Haulage is in the process of levelling and compounding the granite to make a solid surface for garden beds and pathways.

The Holbrook Community Garden would like to thank both companies for their generosity and encouragement, as well as Greater Hume for their assistance.

Behind the scenes grants have been written and planning is advanced on the layout of the garden,

including ordering the garden shed with an awning. At this time, a Bushfire Recovery Grant of \$6,800 has been awarded though Greater Hume Council. As planning continues for the Holbrook Community Garden much thought is being given to making the site welcoming, inclusive and inviting for all members of the community.

In the meantime, members are revamping current beds and furniture.

Members can also be found at the hospital weeding and beautifying garden beds for patients.



Deborah's work will seek to understand current community attitudes and preparedness to welcome newcomers, available services and employment opportunities, as well to understand the journey so far for the many newcomers who already live here. Deborah will be located at Holbrook, where she lives,

and will be working part time for approximately 12 weeks on this stage of the project. Deborah has extensive experience coordinating community research projects across Australia and has worked with many organisations including Universities, High Schools, Women's Health Centres, Youth

programmes, Migrant services, Government and non-government organisations.

The Greater Hume Council is confident that stakeholders and the community will be supportive of Deborah as she goes about this work.

NSW Growing Regions of Welcome Pilot Program This research is part of Multicultural NSW's Growing Regions of Welcome (NSW GROW) Pilot, a three-year program that works with local communities to attract migrants and refugees to resettle in regional NSW. The focus is on people living in western Sydney with the skills and aspirations to move to the Murray and Riverina regions for employment and lifestyle opportunities. The overall aim is to provide migrants and refugees with the information and support they need to relocate to the regions, and support communities in the Murray and Riverina to welcome newcomers and help them to thrive in the long-term. HOLBROOK LANDCARE

Testing Tropicals Update: This month Alison & Emma had the pleasure of visiting Andrew Hunter of '*Hills Park*' and Steven Scott of '*Scotts Angus*' to see how their newly sown sub-tropical grasses were coming along.

Both producers have in some digit grass, and it was amazing to see that some of plants were taller than Emma! Andrew also had some Kikuyu in which has provided some excellent ground cover and feed too. We are keen to see how both producers' temperate legumes come up underneath the grasses later on this year.

Both producers have also organised some grazing trials so we can collect some data on the impact of subtropical grasses on the average daily weight gain of both sheep and cattle.

In the meantime, for anyone interested in project updates, contact Emma and she can add you into the email group for event updates etc. She can also add anyone interested into the Testing Tropicals WhatsApp group which is a platform for knowledge sharing between producers and ag professionals to learn from each other about growing sub-tropical/tropical pastures in southern NSW.

Likewise, check out our brochure on the HLN website, and watch this space for a tropical pastures field day that is in the works for early April!

Successful Soil CRC project participation: We were recently informed of our success of being a participant in the CRC for High Performance Soils 'Addressing barriers to adoption. Building farmer innovation capability' project. The 18-month long project will be lead by CSU and consists of 4 other farming systems groups from across Australia. The project will fund and train a person from each farming group to design and implement a farm led innovation system with a focus on soil management, through formal training and the use of peer-to peer learning between groups. HLN's ambition with the project is to improve our soil testing and collection service to farmers that not only improves the quality of test results coming from the paddock but also improves the way producers interact with their soil test results. We will be working closely with our R&D partner NSW DPI, and partner soil laboratory CSBP. Stay tuned for more to come.


