CALM Care teaches participants how to “pick up” on the signs that someone around them may not be travelling so well and may be thinking of suicide, how to “check-in”, ask and talk about suicide and how to assist the person in the best way possible to safety. Our next workshop will be in April and is open to anyone in the community over the age of 16. The workshop is currently discounted due to the generosity of funds raised though the Holbrook Motorcycle Sports Club.

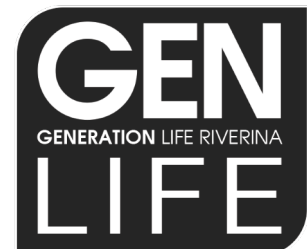

Landscape Rehydration Workshop: Thursday 14 April 12.30 (BBQ lunch) – 4.30pm

Are you keen to understand what "Landscape rehydration" really is? What does it mean and what benefit is it to farms and the environment? So here's your chance – we have been able to get the Mulloon Institute landscape planners along for a ½ day introductory workshop. The workshop will include:

- An introduction to landscape rehydration concepts, water cycles in rural landscapes, and a whole-of-system approach to catchment health.
- An overview of the steps to be taken to initiate a landscape rehydration project at both the property and catchment scale
- Realistic parameters for implementing landscape rehydration projects, with reference to example projects.

Start at Little Billabong Hall, Tumbarumba Rd, followed by a walk and talk on Little Billabong Station, hosted by the Johnston family. This workshop is being supported by funding from the NSW Environment Trust

FROM THE ANGLICAN CHURCH

Bunnies, chickens, chocolate, and church, what do they have in common? The answer is Easter. For thousands of years humans have celebrated birth and new life using things from nature like rabbits which are rapid breeders, chickens have eggs hatch and new life appears. Chocolate was not edible until John Cadbury formulated an eating chocolate in the middle of 18th century. Later that century he created chocolate that could be moulded, and because the Tzar of Russia gave his wife eggs made of Gold at Easter, John Cadbury created chocolate eggs to be sold in shops.

The Christian Church celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus on Easter day, which also marked the change of the seasons in the northern hemisphere. As Spring brought longer days to warm the earth new life would appear. Pagans also celebrated new life in Spring in various ways. Christians are connected to their Jewish heritage in that Easter is connected with Passover which celebrates the Israelites being freed from slavery in Egypt. Likewise, Jesus' resurrection on Easter day is proof that when we die, we too will have a resurrection into eternity, and those who believe in Jesus, will be united with Him in Heaven for eternity with a new life.

PLANT PICK PLATE

Autumn is the ideal time of the year for gardeners to establish their gardens and for experienced gardeners to expand on their plots. The weather has cooled
