2022 LIMOUSIN NATIONAL SHOW & SALE COMES TO TOWN



Last week the Holbrook Sporting Complex was a hive of activity with Holbrook hosting the National Show for Limousin cattle. It is believed that this is the first time that the event has been held outside of a regional centre and was a wonderful opportunity to showcase both the town and the potential for the facilities.

Stud cattle exhibitors from Western Australia, South Australia, Victoria and NSW spent the week preparing and showing their animals, with a large number of spectators attending the show on Thursday, and even more watching the livestream of the event. The program concluded on Friday with

an auction, held inside the enclosed livestock pavilion.

It is hoped that after seeing what is available in Holbrook, other cattle breed groups may be encouraged to follow suit. Being able to host such an event was made possible through several funding sources, which enabled an upgrade of the livestock precinct on the grounds, together with assistance from Greater Hume Council and an enormous number of volunteer hours to overhaul the old rodeo area and turn it into a show arena.

A CONVERSATION WITH AUTHORS




Chris Hammer shot to success with his debut fiction novel *Scrublands* which many of our borrowers have read.

HOLBROOK LANDCARE

Carbon Training Workshop: We were very lucky to have Prof Richard Eckard in town last week to deliver 1½ days of training on Carbon in Agriculture and the use of the GAF tools to benchmark farm emissions. First step on the road to net zero is knowing where you are. The group was a mix of regional landcare/farming system group and Murray LLS staff and HLN members. Building Landcare's knowledge and skills for our members and communities.

Farm Succession workshops: Dr Mike Stevens, Director and Senior Consultant of Meridian Agriculture was the presenter of the Farm Succession Planning workshops held at Tumbarumba and Culcairn a couple of weeks ago. Both sessions attracted many farming families, along with leading bank representatives from the Rural Financial Counselling Services.

Dr Stevens said that "Dividing the farm, so that everyone gets what they need, is becoming increasingly challenging". "Even when families have planned well and invested off–farm or in shares to provide for non–farming members of the family, these assets haven't increased in value as much as the farm."

The Farm Succession workshops addressed the issues involved in a succession plan and take participants through the steps to develop a plan. Today, farming families want to ensure a fairer division of assets. Older generations also want to hand over the farming business while they have the time — and money — to enjoy their retirement.

These workshops were run by Holbrook Landcare Network, in conjunction with the Farm Business Resilience Program (FBRP), funded by the Australian Government's Future Drought Fund and the NSW DPI and Local Land Services

PLANT PICK PLATE Mothers' Day is Sunday 8th May and for those who have not seen the advertising or received a gentle hint by a mother, don't forget flowers. As my children live away,

there are usually no visits, flowers or chocolates. As we all know flowers are synonymous with this tribute day, so looking out into my garden, which is predominately a productive garden, I search for

blooms to place in a vase.

Years ago bought а potted white chrysanthemum specifically for this purpose and later planted it in a garden bed. Each Mothers' Day since, it has provided me with multiple clusters of yellow flowers. I'm not a purest so any colour will do. Last year I fell in love with a potted Sasangua Camellia which now has masses of petite soft pink, delicate blooms which I view from inside. But for my table I need to do a garden walk seeking floral cuttings.

The tall Canna Lillies are nearing the end of their flowering season and look a little sad but the nasturtiums are still producing vibrant colours as are the ground covering yellow and gold Calendula. The ruby Dianthus are peeping through the mass of tiny seaside daisies and the brilliant coloured star Gazinia flowers are both better left to bloom outside. I then focus on the contrast of colours created by the pure white Rose and the long purple spikes of the Russian Sage. Add some lush green foliage and there is your bouquet. The potted candy pink Begonia brought inside for a few days will be equally appealing.

Discovering that I have more flowers that first thought allows me to fill a vase for each room on my Mothers' Day, but nothing compares with receiving a cheery phone call from each of my children. Passionate Gardener, June.




