# GREATER HUME COUNCIL APPOINTS NEW GENERAL MANAGER FOR FIVE YEAR TERM



Mayor, Cr Tony Quinn said that whilst Greater Hume Council will be Evelyn's first appointment to a General Manager/CEO role, Evelyn has significant senior management experience in Local Government in Western Australia and most recently as Director Community and Corporate Services at the Shire of Southern Grampians in western Victoria.



Cr Quinn said that Evelyn beat a very strong field of applicants for

the position and is the right person to take the Council forward and capitalise on the significant growth opportunities for the Greater Hume area. We are delighted to be welcoming Evelyn to Greater Hume Council and are confident in her ability to deliver on Council's ambitious Council growth plans and community expectations." 


#### **HOLBROOK LIBRARY BOOK REVIEW**

Perestroika in PARIS by Jane Smiley.

Jane Smiley has a thing about horses so it's no surprise that her latest novel, Perestroika in Paris is about a horse called Paras (short for Perestroika). Reading the blurb I was a little cynical about how I would enjoy this story but enjoy it I did. It's like a fairy tale for adults featuring a horse, a dog, a raven, two ducks and an eight year old boy.

One evening after her last race for the season she finds her stall opens and goes for a wander, taking groom's bag with her. She makes her curious way ,following grass, through parks streets until she finds herself in the middle of the city in one of Paris's manicured parks. There she meets Frieda, the German shorthaired pointer and together they embark on an adventure which becomes entwined with the fate of a little boy and his elderly grandmother.



Thank you to all those involved with helping to set up, pack up, feed people and to keep things moving throughout the 2½ day event.


As usual, we commenced with Schools' Day, which consisted of workshops during the morning then moved into the Schools'

#### **PLANT PICK PLATE**

All plants require certain essential nutrient elements. Those not provided by nature must be applied by the gardener with the main three being (N) nitrogen (P) phosphorus and (K) potassium.



Store bought fertilisers display these elements as N-P-K in percentages, but what do they mean and which product do you choose?

**Nitrogen** is essential in forming green leaf pigment, chlorophyll. Leafy crops require (N) in a higher percentage than fruit crops. Excess (N) will reduce the yield of fruit and vegetable crops producing excess plant growth. This element is supplied in animal manure, green manure crops (legumes), blood and bone and purchased fertilisers.

**Phosphorus** is necessary for early plant growth. It promotes root development in seedlings and increases fruitfulness, flowers and seeds in productive and floral gardens. Superphosphate contains phosphorus and is readily available to plants whereas (P) present in blood and bone is slow release.

**Potassium** is essential for growth and development. Root vegetables in particular respond to (K) which provides increased quality and texture of the fruit and vegetable, strengthens the plant and also reduces disease. Available as Muriate of Potash, powdered or granular and also as Potash sulphate which is a water soluble mix providing (K) to your plants rapidly.

Organic fertilisers are animal manures, blood and bone, composted materials and green manure crops which are slow release and should be mixed into the soil months prior to planting. Side dressings of (P) are recommended throughout the growing season for productive, healthy plants.

**Artificial fertilisers** are manufactured from minerals or synthesised and are usually rapid release providing the plants with immediate nutrients. Complete fertiliser mixes fall into this category with the added benefit of near equal percentages of (N - P - K ) making application quick and easy without scratching your head deciding which fertiliser to use.

# National Volunteer Week brings opportunity to recognise local health advocates

National Volunteer Week celebrates and recognises the vital work of volunteers who are often changing their communities for the better. In the area of health, local communities are represented by volunteer health advocates as members of Local Health Advisory Committees (LHACs) to consider health needs, promote health literacy and wellbeing and provide a voice for planning and evaluation of health services.

"We are all passionate community members who care deeply about improving health outcomes in our respective towns. LHAC members give up their time to listen to community and ensure there is a local voice at the table when developing new strategies and plans,' Ms McCrone said.
