There has been an interest in getting Scouts up and running in the Holbrook and Culcairn area after an absence of 15 years from the community.

Over the last 12 months I have received many messages and emails from parents wishing to enrol their child in Scouting. It seemed that there is a real need for this activity in the community. This interest culminated in a community meeting on 23rd March 2022 in Holbrook. Unfortunately, no-one attended this meeting!

So, we have changed our focus and instead of trying to get a full Scout Group up and running with kids in all sections, we will look at providing a Joey Scout section and grow from there.

Joey Scouts are boys and girls in the 5-8 y.o. demographic. Of interest, there are 810 children in this age group in Greater Hume Shire, representing 7.9% of the total population.

Scouting is community service and citizenship, so we earn our money and give back to the community in the process.

Meeting Nights: This will be open to negotiation with the Leaders. Joeys usually meet for an hour anytime between 5.00pm and 6.30pm. **Meeting Place:** We have 2 choices of meeting places in Holbrook, perhaps one day we will get a real Scout Hall again.

Inclusivity: The Scout Program is designed for any child, irrespective of ability, or disability, to achieve to the best level they can, and they will be always recognised for that. Not everyone can be a sportsperson, but all are equal and included under Scouting.

The Next Steps: Get a list of kids who want to be Joeys. Get our Group Committee formed so we can get a bank account for a start! Get Leaders into training. Get 1st Holbrook Joey Scouts to their first meeting in September 2022.







PLANT PICK PLATE

Winter has arrived with a vengeance and it is too cold to undertake lengthy outside gardening tasks. I would rather plan changes and additions to my garden while comforted by the warmth of the fire, a warm cuppa and



surrounded by piles of gardening literature. This has much more appeal. However, the colder months are ideal to plant out deciduous plants, either productive or ornamental into your garden. Roses spring into my mind. I recalled a garden I had cared for a while ago where the magnificent colours, shapes and the enticing fragrance of the old cultivar blooms delighted my senses every time I passed. I only wanted three to fill the space in the bed where my herbs were growing. These fragrant greens have been relocated close to my kitchen door, beside a slipper friendly path, for a quick pick when required.

This recollection, together with the information from the literature enabled me to compile a significant list with options should any be unavailable. Once arriving at the garden nursery, I was disappointed with the small selection available to me. Apparently, there is a shortage of potted and bare root roses due to the demand

from more people spending time in their gardens over the past several years.

Take what there is and be grateful, echoed in my mind. Admittedly, I am glad I did. The floribunda "Gold Bunny" is in flower with the most richly coloured yellow gold bloom ever. The hybrid tea "Blue Moon" promises to produce the softest mauve T bud perfect for a specimen vase and the hybrid tea "Candy Stripe" (on my list) has striking hot pink and white striped petals with extreme fragrance. Only three, but the anticipation of the promised colourful blooms will get me through our long dreary winter.

ADVANCED CARE PLANNING? A FORWARD APPROACH

Advance care planning is about person-centred care and is based on fundamental principles of self-determination, dignity and the avoidance of suffering. We believe that advance care planning should be incorporated into routine general practice. GPs develop ongoing and trusted relationships with their patients and are well positioned to initiate and promote Advance Care Planning (ACP).

Advanced care planning is the embodiment of person-centred healthcare and a response to the challenges that an ageing population and modern healthcare present. When a patient loses the ability to make decisions about their care (accounting for approximately one in four patients at the end of life), advanced care planning ensures that a patient's expressed wishes remain the focus of decisions made about their care. Advanced care planning has also been shown to both improve end of life care and patient and family satisfaction.

Although state and territory government laws vary on ACP and Advance Health Directives, Advance Health Directives in some form are legally binding documents in every state/territory of Australia.

ACP is a process that all patients, and especially those who are at risk of deterioration in health, can benefit from. Liaising with your local GP to touch base in regards to 'what advanced care planning is' and also starting the conversation.

It has been shown that health outcomes for people and their families improve when they are able to talk through their concerns, decisions, preferences and choices with health professionals.

Currently, in NSW, there is not one particular form a person must use to write down their wishes. This is because there is no advance care planning legislation in NSW. When choosing a form, people should think about how well it meets their needs and purpose.

The <u>Making an Advance Care Directive</u> package includes an Advance Care Directive form to complete and an Information Booklet to help people complete their Advance Care Directive.
