# **VARROA MITE OUTBREAK: MORE THAN JUST HONEY**

The Rural Financial Counselling Services in NSW are warning that current detections of Varroa Mite in NSW are growing, and the flow on will impact far more than just honey.

Rural Financial Counselling Service (RFCS) NSW EO David Galloway said the organisation already had a number of apiarists on the books affected by the Varroa Mite outbreak, however the flow on effects could hit well over a hundred other clients.

"Recreational and commercial beekeepers are already feeling the stress and pressures of the Varroa Mite outbreak restrictions stopping the movement of their hives and equipment, which is devastating for these farmers," Mr Galloway said.

"But this state-wide outbreak won't only impact our beekeepers. Over 30 industries including canola, stone fruits, citrus and nuts, will be directly affected due to the urgent need for bee pollination in cropping, which has been forced to a halt by the movement restrictions."



#### **HOLBROOK LANDCARE**

Foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) is a highly contagious animal disease that affects all cloven -hoofed animals including cattle, sheep, goats, camelids, deer and pigs. Cloven-hoofed animals are those with a split toe. It does not affect horses. (Camelids include alpacas, llamas and camels). FMD spreads between animals via their breath, through contact with the blisters, and through infected body fluids (including milk) and many people will remember the horrific scenes in the UK during 2001 when they experienced an outbreak and millions of animals needed to be destroyed in order to contain the disease.

Producer groups have been using social media to raise awareness of the enormity of the threat posed by the outbreak of FMD in Bali, and the consequences of it being brought into Australia by returning holidaymakers. It has been estimated that FMD being detected in Australia would cost the agricultural industry \$80 billion, not to mention the knock-on effect to other sectors.

In order to help prevent this happening tourists are advised to think twice about the places they visit and to bin their footwear, or thoroughly disinfect both shoes & clothing prior to stepping onto the plane to come home . If you are planning to travel to Bali, or other parts of Indonesia, or know of someone who is, then **PLEASE DO THE RIGHT THING** to help protect our biosecurity and keep this dreadful disease out of Australia.

The Young Carer Bursary Program supports young carers to continue with their education. The program offers 1000 bursaries of \$3000 each year to assist with education needs and resources. Applications for the Young Carers Bursary Program 2023 open from 19 July to 13 September 2022.


To apply you must be a young carer:

- aged 12 25 years old for the entire time you're receiving the bursary
- studying an approved course in Australia within a recognised Australian institution, either full-time or part-time
- in high school
- TAFE or a registered training organisation (RTO) studying towards higher vocational education and training (VET) qualifications
- at university, up to and including your first undergraduate degree\*
- a permanent resident or Australian citizen residing in Australia
- not receiving another scholarship
- \*Undergraduate degrees include: advanced diplomas, bachelor degrees, bachelor degree with honours and associate degrees.

The funding should be used towards supporting you in your education or training. This could include but is not limited to: school fees, laptops and software, uniforms, transport and accommodation, respite care, emotional support, and extracurricular activities.

The benefits of early childhood education provide opportunities for children to develop literacy and numeracy skills, resilience and assists in forming good habits that help to set children up in later life.




The current skills shortages has created many vacancies across our region in early childhood education which is negatively impacting local businesses and workers in participating in the workforce.

The economic impact for families is high as returning to work may be delayed for up to 12 months without a guaranteed position in a service."

Early childhood education offers a great career pathway for those who love working with children with many entry points from traineeships, working with a service towards a Certificate III in early childhood education, progressing to a Diploma and being supported to complete a Bachelor in Early Childhood Teaching and Family Day Care options.

For those already qualified and experienced, there are full time, part time and casual vacancies available or if you want to set up a Family Day Care service Greater Hume Children Services can support you.

In addition, a container was purchased for the purposes of storing all the equipment required for the running of the events and track.
