## ATTRACTING MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES TO RELOCATE TO THE MURRAY REGION FOR LIFESTYLE AND EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Two Information Sessions have been organised for community and prospective employers within Greater Hume, with all welcome: Tues 9 August at Henty Community Club @ 5.15pm to 7.00pm Tues 23 August at Holbrook Library @ 5.15pm to 7.00pm

As part of a NSW Government pilot program to work with local communities to attract migrants and refugees to resettle in regional NSW, the Greater Hume community are invited to info sessions to learn more about this local project this month.

The focus for the three year pilot program is for people living in Western Sydney with the skills and aspirations to move to the region for employment and lifestyle opportunities. The overall aim is to provide migrants and refugees with the information and support they need to relocate to the region, and support Greater Hume communities to welcome newcomers and help them to thrive in the long-term.

Those that attend these consultation sessions will be updated on this pilot program by Murray GROW Taskforce members.

Hear how your community can make a difference by being involved, as well as have any questions answered, and hear your feedback, to ensure that there is locally-led design and decision making occurring.

Co-Chair of the Murray Taskforce, Andrew Kotzur of Walla Walla said "the NSW GROW program becomes a win-win for communities in terms of increasing diversity and clearly for businesses, it's an opportunity for prospective employers. It's no secret that there's a shortage in the workforce, but it's not without challenges, because housing is also very challenging at the moment. Individual communities can't do this on their own, but working with Red Cross, Council, other support organisations together with the community and employers we are hoping to find solutions. I encourage any business or community member to attend one of these sessions, and hear about the potential benefits for the project within Greater Hume Council area" he added.

The NSW GROW Murray pilot program was formally launched in Walla Walla late June by the NSW Minister for Multiculturalism, the Hon Mark Coure.





#### FROM THE ANGLICAN CHURCH

Recently I did a forced tour of three hospitals starting in Holbrook, then Albury, and finally St Vincent's in Melbourne. During my time in all these facilities I was struck by one main thing all the staff had in common, they had "compassion." I felt special as I was not neglected for a moment, and I was cared for in every detail and I was touched with the compassion that they lavished on me.

The word "compassion" is made up of two ancient words where, "com" means to be "united with and or joined to people." The word "passion," means. "Being prepared to suffer with or for someone, even to the death." The example of Jesus' trial, flogging, carrying His cross to Calvary, and death, is referred to as the "Passion of Christ," because He did it for us, not Himself.

Sometimes I hear people say, "I am <u>passionate</u> about the football or coffee," etc., and I must ponder, are they really prepared to suffer or die for such things? Compassion comes out of the need to meet other persons' needs, and compassion is the product of love. Jesus paraphrased the Ten Commandments when He said, "Love the Lord God with all your heart and soul and your neighbour as yourself," living this great commandment requires us to have no compassion.

The thing about compassion is, that it can be given or withheld, and it can be received or rejected. I pray that everyone will receive and show compassion to all people. We have also received a grant for Term 3 which Miss Maroney utilised to add to our gymnastics equipment. The students will enjoy several weeks of gymnastics before taking to the dance floor. We have engaged the services of an outside provider to provide dance lessons for students Kindergarten to Year 6!

demonstration but a great way to bring people together to socialize and cook simple recipes and then share the meal together.



#### LEST WE FORGET – THE FERGUSON BROTHERS

The outbreak of World War One called for able-bodied young men to fulfil their duty to King and country. With his mother's consent, George Ferguson, was the first of the Ferguson brothers to answer the call to arms, enlisting in March 1915, aged 19. His brothers Val, Norman and Tom were farming at Holbrook, but Val signed up also a few weeks later. George and Val joined the 24<sup>th</sup> Battalion destined for Gallipoli where Val was killed at Lone Pine. Norman and Tom enlisted in 1916 and were posted to the 37<sup>th</sup> Battalion. Another blow struck the family when Norman was killed at Passchendaele.

In January 1918, George wrote to A.I.F Headquarters requesting to be reposted to England with some kind of office work, stating he had lost his father, and three of his brothers had died – Jack of lockjaw, Val and Norman having been killed in action. He had faithfully served the Army for three years and had only left the battalion four times being sick or wounded. George also wrote saying to lose any more sons would be too much for his mother. He was turned away, told his request would be a "future reference."

April brought the devastating news of Tom being killed. Words, what could mere words tell of the grief and pain? Again, George now sought to be returned to Australia or at least retained on Home Service personnel. How long would the war last? Would his mother have no sons return to her? "I beg... to be returned to Australia," was his plea. He reasoned that he was now the sole support of his mother, sisters, sisters-in-law, their children, and his younger brother, Andy, who remained at home. This time his request was to be considered.

Finally, he was approved to be discharged, and was arranged to take the next available transport homebound. An overcrowded hall received George giving him a warm welcome home. He was home, and for the moment that's all that mattered.

#### **PLANT PICK PLATE**

We are now over the halfway point through Winter and the days are obviously longer. My



weeping ornamental apricot has burst into delicate pink blooms which is an indication Spring is not far away. Now is the perfect time to select your vegetable seeds and sow into punnets. Healthy seedlings with sufficient root growth with will be ready to transplant into your garden bed in a few months time.

The successful germination of seeds requires a number of elements. Firstly, use a quality seed raising soil mix. Fill plastic punnets with the mix, firm down and water. Sprinkle the seed then cover with a thin layer of soil mix, spray with water and keep moist. Place the punnets in recycled clear plastic tubs with lids, lifting the lid after sprouting. Locate inside in a warm position, out of the sun or in a hot house. Ideally, the temperature should be around 15° for tender crops and 10° for the hardier ones. Next, allow sufficient oxygen and airflow around the punnets by raising them above the water drainage area. They must be moist not wet and the containers should have ventilation holes in the top.

If successful, and be aware that not all seeds will shoot, provide them with regular applications of a week solution of seaweed fertiliser to encourage strong roots and healthy, upright growth. As the days warm, introduce the seedlings to outside conditions returning then inside at night as temperatures can still be low. In a couple of months as temperatures rise, the seedlings will be ready to pot up or plant direct into the garden.

It is so rewarding to raise your own vegetables from seed, to watch them thrive in the garden and finally provide you with delicious produce.
