Griffith explains how Australia can make renewable energy in far higher quantities than our economy needs. We can also store renewable energy for tomorrow. We can make so much that we have enough in the dark cold times and an abundance in the warm, sunny times and a surplus to sell to other nations. His book is a blueprint - optimistic, yet feasible - on how Australia has the potential to be a renewable energy superpower because of our low population density





We can use renewable energy to create millions of jobs and a healthier environment. Squirrel gliders have moved into several of these new homes within a few weeks of their installation. Nest material was found in some of the Habitech modular boxes and insulated wooden nest



boxes. Some of the in-tree-hollows are too high to monitor with a standard pole camera, we may need to use wildlife cameras instead to gauge usage.

We had a great turnout to our 'Soil Acidity and Salinity Workshop' in Burrumbuttock last Thursday morning, run in partnership with West Hume Landcare. This was part of our Future Soils Project, supported by NSW DPI and funded through the National Landcare Program. There were some terrific discussions held and a particular interest in the lime and molybdenum relationship we are experiencing at our local trial site this year.




#### LADY GAIL'S TALES




#### **HOLBROOK SUBMARINE MUSEUM NEWS**

#### FROM THE ANGLICAN CHURCH

On Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> September, Bishop Mark Short and his wife Monica will be our guests in the Parish. Bishop Mark is the head of the Anglican Diocese of Canberra and Goulburn which reaches from the coast to Holbrook, and from Victoria to near West Wyalong. While here Bishop Mark will Confirm three people at the Sunday morning service at 9am.

Confirmation is where a person makes a personal commitment to be a Christian. It is called Confirmation because the same questions are asked of the people that were asked at their Baptism. The difference is these people will answer for themselves, whereas their Godparents and Parents answered the questions at their Baptisms.

The questions are basic but have a deep spiritual and personal commitment to them which are: "Do you turn to Christ?" "Do you reject Satan and all that is evil?" "Do you repent of your sins?" These questions are the basis of a Christian commitment, and when they are answered in front of people as witnesses, the answers have a spiritual and lasting commitment which we will have to answer for to God.

Making a public FAITH commitment is a powerful thing because we then must live into what we committed to. I once read that the word FAITH is spelt R.I.S.K., and Faith is the GLUE that holds humanity and God together. If people and nations had more faith in each other, and God, the world would automatically be a better place because, we do not want to hurt what we have faith in and love.

I pray that you have faith in God and people, and that the glue of love will hold us together, and even empower us to take risks that will make the world a better place. Making a commitment to faith and love is risky, but the rewards are out of this world.




