





The Holbrook Football Club capped off a great season by winning both 1st & 2nd Grade Premierships in the Hume Football Netball League for Season 2022.

The Reserve Grade side had taken the direct route to the Grand Final by winning the second semifinal, but had to fight tooth and nail against a very spirited and committed Osborne combination in the Grand Final.

In a low scoring encounter, the Tigers led Holbrook at every change before the Brookers were able to hold Osborne scoreless in the last quarter whilst adding 2 goals 1 point themselves to turn a 7 point deficit into a 6 point victory. Holbrook veteran, Charlie White, kicked 2 goals, while Ben Parker, Sam Joyce, Fletcher Parker & Bailey Churchill were the other goalkickers. The Brookers were best served by Sam Joyce, Gus 'Siren' Keogh, Charlie White, Cal Langlands, Nick Pugh & Tom Heriot. Well done to Ewen and all the boys!

In the senior grade, Holbrook also took on League heavy weights, Osborne, who had beaten the Brookers in the last 16 encounters, stretching back to 2013.

After an even first term, it looked like history was about to repeat itself with the Tigers gaining the slight upper hand to lead by 15 points at half time, and 7 points at the last change. The Brookers had other ideas, and sparked by Des Kennedy medalist "Man of the Match", John Mitchell, Holbrook turned on a master class to kick 7.6.48 to 2.0.12 for the last quarter in heavy conditions against the wind, to run out winners by 29 points (11.13.79 to 7.8.50).

This term we farewell Miss Rhiannon Dally. We






