#### LITTLE BILLABONG CEMETERY **CELEBRATING 150 YEARS**

As some of the readers may be aware, the historic Little Billabong Cemetery, formerly known as 150<sup>th</sup> Lunt's Vale, will be celebrating anniversary next year, as it was dedicated February 14<sup>th</sup> 1873.

The cemetery which now lies between the north and south bound lanes of the Hume Freeway is thought to have as many as 140 graves in 90 plots according to research done by J.H. Winston-Gregson and published in the Australian Historical Archaeology, 2, 1984 under the title of People in the Landscape: A Biography of Two Villages.

John & Joan Quinlan have passed onto me the research that they had done in the past pertaining to this cemetery. As no actual burial records are held for the Little Billabong Cemetery, and with some names and dates having been provided by the Quinlan's, it is a matter of sending for the relevant death certificate to confirm that they are in fact buried there and not Germanton/Holbrook.

If any readers have knowledge of names of deceased who are thought to be buried there, vou please contact me with information. Having been heavily involved with a similar project for the Cookardinia Cemetery in 2013, it is our intention to compile a booklet covering the history of this historic cemetery as a fitting tribute to those who were laid to rest there in unmarked graves.


#### **HOLBROOK HOSTEL NEWS**

#### **PLANT PICK PLATE**

For years I have looked for a solution to controlling the colonies of slaters in my garden. Their protective body armour



keeps these bugs safe from most things. I have placed newspaper under upturned planting pots to attract the slaters and I have sprayed them with pyrethrum, however both methods have not delivered the desired result. I have also prayed that the magpies and plovers that visit my garden are eating the slaters but realistically a whole flock of birds would be need to descend on my garden to have any impact on these tiny robust creatures.

My answer I found in the Holbrook Community Garden Recipe Book. A contributor has suggested placing halved oranges amongst the garden beds and the slaters will be attracted by the sweet aroma. Each morning upturn and dispose the bugs harbouring underneath. I felt this was worth a try. We squeeze fresh citrus to drink daily so I could see no reason to waste whole oranges in the garden. The squeezed halves worked perfectly, attracting not only the slaters but also the slugs. Picking off the slugs and applying a short spray of fly spray on the cluster of slaters is significantly decreasing my pest problem, but this method is ongoing and requires dedication by the gardener. Domes of orange are scattered around my strawberry plants which I relocate each morning and replenish each couple of days with fresh citrus. The orange and grapefruit work best, but not lemon - sweet not sour.

There are many other gardening tips in the book from accomplished gardeners in addition to a comprehensive range of delightful heritage recipes passed down by generations of cooks for everyone to try.




