WOOLPACK INN MUSEUM

We are getting excited about our upcoming **BIRTHDAY FESTIVAL TO BE HELD ON SUNDAY 20 NOVEMBER** in the Museum's grounds starting at 10.00am.

Activities on the day include a Mini Outback Show by Lachie Cossor, Live Music by local duo Night Shift, Vintage Photography shoots by Leanne Bickley of @lea_bic Photography, wagon rides, market stalls and food and drinks. Come on down and enjoy some time with us.

The Woolpack Inn Museum actually had its 50th Birthday in December last year but the celebrations had to be postponed due to Covid-19 restrictions. With the help of Greater Hume Council we have been fortunate to secure some funding for our festival through the NSW Government's Reconnecting Regional NSW Community Events Program.

On a sadder note we recently lost the services of Bert and Dianne Ray, our Caretakers at the Museum since 2007, when they decided to retire. They did an amazing job at the Museum always welcoming visitors with a friendly smile. We wish them well in their retirement. We will be looking for replacement Caretakers at some time in the future. Meanwhile, the Museum is being manned by our wonderful volunteers from Wednesday through to Sunday each week.

HOLBROOK SUBMARINE MUSEUM

The museum has a small but significant collection of submarine crests including one from WWII. Naval Crests are derived from the elaborately carved figure heads from the bows of Man-of-War sailing ships.

British and Australian submarines up until the late 1920s were named after the class of submarine and the build number, hence HMS B11. When WWII broke out the British Admiralty revered to the number system for all of its submarines to disguise the number of submarines, all British submarines in WWII were called P followed by a number. HSM is fortunate to have a crest from HMS P31 later named HMS Thunderbolt.





Holbrook Landcare Network had a successful Cultural Appreciation Day on Monday 17th October at the Mullengandra Hall. HLN staff and Board members spent the day with Aunty Ruth Davys and Uncle Tunny Murray, Aunty Edna Stewart and Uncle Sam Whitby from the Albury First Nations Community, sharing stories and food. The day was organized as part of HLN's Working Together project, with funding from Landcare NSW and Murray Local Land Services. It was designed as a first

step in building lasting relationships between HLN and the Albury First Nations Community. The session was about getting to know one another, with individuals sharing their life stories, and finding commonalities that we can build on to work together in Caring for Country into the future. Participants found the day overwhelmingly positive and ended the day with agreement on the next steps forward in strengthening these relationships. The session was delivered by Giilangyaldhaanygalang, a 100% Aboriginal owned business partnership specialising in Wiradjuri language education services.

PLANT PICK PLATE

When is the best time to organise a holiday when you have developed and care for a productive garden? With no children under my roof and no pets, one would think anytime, but this is not so for an enthusiastic productive gardener like myself. As the warmer seasonal temperature rise and the days grow longer all I can think of is my garden – planting, picking and the continual weeding.

A great start for the plants in my summer vegetable garden has been the combined regular rainfall we are experiencing together with the much milder temperate days. The broad beans and peas I planted during winter are now providing me with delicious produce for my kitchen requiring a daily pick to maintain quality, the "Goldie Locks" stage - not to big and not to small, just right. Now is not the time for a holiday. Likewise, in mid summer when the plants that do not hold their fruit well such as my tomatoes, capsicums, cucumbers, corn, berries and lettuce are in full production also require daily picking. I planted my tomatoes and potatoes into the garden at the end of September well aware that frosts are still a risk. Another reason to re schedule the holiday and stay at home to closely monitor that sudden chill that will destroy these two essential vegetables.

Maybe I could get away in early autumn after the summer vegetables have been eaten, preserved and given away, when the weather is cooling and the plants have died down. No. This is clean up time in the garden. The removal of all spent vegetable plants must be undertaken to prevent disease and pests invading my patch.

As one season overlaps into the next I have continual garden tasks requiring attention. Holidays will remain a dream, for now anyway.
