PLANT PICK PLATE

I am excited to see such large developing crops on my Apple and Apricot trees after last year where




there was no crop. Maybe it was the result of frost damage just as the fruit were setting, I don't know. However, this year I want as much quality fruit as possible so the answer is fruit thinning and now is the time to do it.

Thinning involves deliberately cutting away the small or damaged fruit which will provide the tree with more energy to produce larger, quality fruit. The sunlight can penetrate into the branches providing evenness of ripening, increased airflow will deter disease and mould and less weight will limit branch damage. As a general rule the suggested thinning ratio for Apples are 3 to a bunch, Apricots to be spaced 1 to every 5 cm and Peaches 1 to every 10 cm thus allowing airflow and sunlight between each fruit. Some fruit trees will naturally drop fruit in early summer so allowing for this, I have left a few more on the Apple tree than recommended.

The general rule does not apply to first year fruiting trees. One expert recommends that to encourage stronger and healthier root and branch structures, all the developing crop must be removed. I studied my two blood plums, Santa Rosa and Mariposa which are fruiting for the first time with a large handful of crop between them. I just couldn't do it, not this year. My love of blood plums is so great that I planted 2 trees and I have been waiting 18 months to sample their richly coloured flesh.

I just may have sacrificed next year's Plum crops but hey, I'm living in the moment. There will be the Apples and Apricots as backup.

HOLBROOK LANDCARE - WATER, WATER EVERYWHERE...

After the rainfall events of the past couple of weeks, there are a few 'frequently asked questions' about erosion and waterway health.

The NSW DPI have a flood impact survey out and we would encourage everyone to submit a survey – this helps with estimating the cost to producers and what programs and assistance there may be.

There has been a disaster declaration for Greater Hume Council area from 14th September 2022 onwards and there are a range of assistance measures available. The Woomargama, Mountain Creek and Ten Mile Creek systems were at the epicentre of the severe rainfall event here on the weekend (160mm reported). The resulting bank erosion and sedimentation in the waterways is causing headaches for some with impact on infrastructure.

Before you get the machines in, be aware of your obligations for permits – repair of existing crossing etc may be exempt but we encourage people to check out the following to cover yourselves https://water.dpie.nsw.gov.au/licensing-and-trade/approvals/controlled-activity-approvals/what

Floods are a natural part of the cycle for our waterways, so most of our aquatic species are adapted to coping. The environment will recover – if anyone has any concerns feel free to contact us and we can see if we can help.




