HOLBROOK GYM CLUB OFFICIAL OPENING – THURSDAY 2nd December 2022

The new amenities, storage and upgrade of the security system at our Community Gym was officially opened on Thursday. President Pam Jones welcomed everyone with an outline of the 9 years in the making of the gym. What started out as the old gymnastic stadium with old rusty steel sliding doors, no air conditioning and no running water we have spent a considerable amount of time, money and energy replacing and upgrading these premises to become what it is today.

An application for a grant from the NSW Government for the Stronger Country Communities Fund was submitted in June 2021. The project guidelines were for Female Sporting Projects - development of new or upgrade of existing infrastructure to encourage female participation in sport. We received strong support from our members and the Greater Hume Council including Marg Killalea who compiled a survey which drew 140 responses. We received 22 letters and emails of support for this application.

Our Project was to install two unisex ambulant toilet blocks with showers and baby change table, a storeroom and upgrading of the security Lighting. With the assistance from Josh Boers for the construction and Greg Tuck from GT Electrical for the upgrade of the security lighting at the Sporting Complex we were able to put forward a strong application.

We received notification in November 2021 that our application was successful. To say we were excited was an understatement.

The construction started in February this year with the upgrade of the lighting system which has made a major improvement not only for our Gym but for the whole of the Complex.

Big thank you to Josh Boers and his team of tradies from Akro Construction, Blueys' Plumbin' and Greg Tuck with the amazing work they have completed.

Our memberships have grown from 170 to now over 210, since the completion of our new changerooms. The Footy and Netball Clubs also access the gym during their season.

Special thanks to NSW Government and Justin Clancy. We appreciate that you have given us the opportunity to upgrade our wonderful gym.

HOLBROOK LANDCARE

Regroup on Revegetation Forum:

Representatives from Landcare groups, Local Land Services & other NSW State departments together with other NGOs (e.g. Greening Australia) met in Wagga last week to discuss best practice in building resilience & sustainability into revegetation projects ready for a changing climate & emerging environmental markets.

This Revegetation Forum was organized by Holbrook Landcare, in partnership with Murrumbidgee Landcare, as part of our Landcare-led Landscape Resilience Project.

For 30 years, Landcare has driven grassroots change in natural resource management and landscape restoration. Landholders and the Landcare community will now need to prepare for a future where climate change and natural capital income streams form part of farm business and drought resilience strategies.

Funded through the Federal Government's Future Drought Fund – Drought Resilient Soils and Landscapes Grants Program, our Landcare-led Landscape Resilience – Tools and Data for Restoration Decisions' Project will aim to boost private, on farm investment in natural capital and enhance resilience through climate-ready revegetation.

A HANDY HINT FROM HOLBROOK HOSPITAL STAFF

An **Advanced Care Directive** is a document that you can fill out with your family, Next of Kin or Medical Power of Attorney, stating what your wishes would be in the event that you may become very unwell.

Depending on how unwell you are, if you present to a hospital or ring an ambulance, you can state how much treatment you wish to have, including whether you want to go to intensive care.

With your family, you can fill the Advanced Care Directive out and get it signed by your GP.

In the event that you need to call an ambulance or present to a hospital, please bring your Advanced Care Directive, Medication List and Medical History summary with you. Ambulance officers recommend you keep this information on your fridge.


