

HOT RODS IN HOLBROOK



NEW MURAL AT THE HARRY JARVIS WING


This is the beautiful mural painted by the very talented Mikayla Heir for the Harry Jarvis Wing at the Holbrook Hospital.

PLANT PICK PLATE

While travelling around over the holiday period I have been peering into other gardens (my favourite pass time) and noticed many featuring Geraniums planted either in the ground or in pots. This old fashioned beautifully coloured pelargonium appears to be making a comeback in today's gardens. Like so many fashions in life, what is old is new again.

Modern trends are for easy care gardens with plants requiring minimal water so I can see why gardeners are choosing the Geranium. You are rewarded with colour all year round with summer displays of vibrant coloured flower heads en mass, ranging from white through to hot pink, deep mauve and ruby red. In winter, the foliage transform into colours of the earth, dark purples, soft browns and burnt copper tones. In addition the Geranium is extremely hardy requiring well drained soil, at least half sun and will tolerate heat and wind exposure more than other flowering bushes.

However, plant will require the some maintenance. To keep the bush compact and prevent from becoming leggy, progressive pruning Combine pinching the tips to is essential. encourage flowers instead of green growth with regular branch pruning to maintain an all year round bushy, colourful display, then take cuttings in Autumn. When planting into pots the gardener has options to move the colour to where it is best viewed around the garden and even indoors for a few days. Recently I purchased two at a plant sale so I am "on trend".

A plant that has endured the test of time and its suitability for gardens large and small deserves recognition. I would be not at all surprised to hear that the Geranium is the plant of 2023 given its low maintenance and colourful characteristics.

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE PURTELL FAMILY— HOLBROOK

John Purtell was born about 1801 at Rathkeale, Co Limerick. In 1822 famine in Ireland affected large numbers of people in the west and south of Ireland resulting in social unrest. In 1822 meetings of groups of people, after the imposed curfew, led to arrests and transportation. Young John Purtell was one of a group of 43 young men who met one evening in 1822 and were arrested. The group were tried at a Special Session at Limerick, convicted of an offence under the Insurrection Act and sentenced to transportation for 7 years. In May 1829 John was granted a Certificate of Freedom. John remained in the Camden district and in July 1834 he married Mary Hayes. John Purtell commenced leasing and purchasing land at Camden as early as the mid 1830s. Most of his children were born at Camden. However by 1837 John had arrived at, and had named, Ten Mile Creek (also know as Billy Bong, later known as Germanton and now Holbrook). In 1837 John commenced squatting on the Ten Mile Creek run. At the time the Ten Mile Creek run encompassed land from which two other large runs were later formed: the Annandale run and the Mountain Creek run. In 1866 he occupied two stations (or runs): Ten Mile Creek Station which comprised of an estimated area of 20,054 acres and the Mountain Creek Station which comprised of 29,744 acres. At the time the locality was known as Ten Mile Creek or Billy Bong.

John continued to lease and purchase land in the Ten Mile Creek area as the opportunities arose.

By 1858 John had built and opened the Criterion Hotel, in Ten Mile Creek. His son, Patrick held the licence of the hotel between 1861 and 1866 and John held the licence of the hotel between 1867 and 1869. He leased the hotel to other licences when neither he nor his son, Patrick held the licence. John also owned and raced horses and was a keen race goer.

In mid 1871 John developed dropsy (oedema usually due to heart failure). In January 1872 he and Mary attended the annual race meeting of the Ten Mile Creek Turf Club. An incident occurred which provided an insight to John's physical deterioration.

A buggy, occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Purtell, senr., was upset under the following circumstances. It appears that Mr. Purtell, who has been an invalid for a considerable time, felt well enough to be driven out, and consequently was taken to the races in his buggy, to which, while standing on the course, the horse (which is a quiet one) remained attached. Some horseman carelessly tied his horse to one of the buggy wheels, and in a short time it became restless, pulling back, which caused the, horse harnessed to

the vehicle to move forward, the result between the two being a capsize. Plenty of assistance was at hand, and the buggy was soon righted, when it was found that the occupants had escaped with some slight bruises only, which was all the more fortunate, considering the extremely helpless state in which Mr. Purtell has been for some time.

John died at Ten Mile Creek on 15 February 1872, probably at his home on the Ten Mile Creek property. He was buried at the local cemetery the following day. In his will John left his wife the Criterion Hotel, a paddock around the hotel and a 100 acres at Ten Mile Creek. The main beneficiaries of his will were his two younger sons, Maurice and William. Mary held the licence of the hotel for a short time in 1873 and 1875. An advertisement for the sale of the entire Ten Mile Creek estate and hotel appeared in the Albury Banner and Wodonga Express on 30 November 1894. In addition to the Criterion Hotel and the 91 acres attached to the hotel there were two other parcels of land in the town of Germanton and one of these came with a wooden cottage. The Ten Mile Creek Estate comprised of 8,569 acres and a description of the number of paddocks and other assets was included in the advertisement.

The homestead was described as a roomy and comfortable weatherboard residence containing 9 rooms, with detached kitchen, etc and surrounded by a good garden and orchard. There is also a good woolshed, with shearers' and men's huts, drafting yards for sheep, sheep dip, and all the conveniences for economically working the station.

The hotel was purchased by Mr. D M'Inness but the Ten Mile Creek Estate and the other parcels of land were passed in. Mary continued to live at the Ten Mile Creek homestead until her death on 3 July 1899. The Criterion Hotel was destroyed by fire in 1895 and was rebuilt. It is now known as the Woolpack Inn and is a museum. The Ten Mile Creek Estate homestead was pulled down in the late 1890s, although the current house stands on the site of the original house.


Sect 3B next matches are away to Henty, away to WNW and home to Jindera Warriors.




