# MURRAY LANDHOLDERS ASKED TO WATCH FOR LOCUSTS AND REPORT

With much grass and vegetation available this season, Local Land Services is urging landholders to be on the lookout for locust activity and report any sightings immediately.

Locust activity has been slowly ramping up across the Murray, with some banding already observed, said Murray Local Land Services Team Leader, Peter O'Shannassy.

"We're urging landholders to be vigilant and report any banding and swarming to their Local Land Services office," Mr O'Shannassy said. "Our staff and local farmers have already started spraying in the Savernake, Rennie and Mulwala areas following sightings of bands reported by the community."

Bands are small at this stage and likely hard to see due to the amount of vegetation in paddocks, however reporting is essential to manage the issue.

"We expect Murray will have locusts at all stages, from hatching to laying adults, scattered across much of the district," Mr O'Shannassy said.

"However, they are generally not being detected until they cross open ground, like roads."

Controlling banding locusts now will help reduce their impact later in the year

If not controlled, plague locusts can cause significant damage to crops and pastures by consuming all in their path.

"Bands are there now to be controlled, which will help lessen their impact on emerging crops in the autumn," Mr O'Shannassy said. "This is why community reporting is essential —reports are used to forecast locust movements, breeding, impacts and required control strategies."

Local Land Services biosecurity staff are trained in the identification of locust biology and control, and available to help landholders implement control measures with advice and pesticides

On-ground treatment by landholders once locusts begin to 'band', is by far the best and most effective treatment option to limit new swarms.

The babies are settling very well, creating safe and secure connections with staff and adjusting to their new environment.


The Toddler room went on their first excursion to the Harry Jarvis

#### COMMANDER HOLBROOK RSL WAR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP 2022

Chairman David Geddes attended each school's Presentation of Awards at the end of last year to present the 2022 Commander Holbrook RSL War Memorial Scholarships.

The scholarship was set up in 1965. The Late Commander Norman D. Holbrook provided the original capital together with the Holbrook RSL sub-branch. Since then, many donations have been made by civic minded individuals and local organisations. A wonderful donation was received after the sale of the Log Cabin a number of years ago. The two Log Cabin Encouragement Awards have been presented since then, to a student from each school.

Last year, a significant donation was gratefully received from the Estate of the Late Mrs Gundula Holbrook. This has enabled a substantial increase for each of the scholarship awards. The Trustees are happy to announce that as from 2023 scholarship payments will be made for the whole of the child's secondary education, Year 7 – 12.

Key words in the Trust Deed that governs the purpose of the fund are: The promotion and encouragement of education of children in the Holbrook district. The principle being of assistance, not reward.

Total payments made annually, are sourced from the interest earnt from the capital invested. The Trust does rely heavily on donations, which are gratefully received at any time and are tax deductible.

The scholarship is open to Year 6 students from the two schools in Holbrook. The students are encouraged to sit the tests, which includes papers in English, Mathematics and Writing.

Twenty students sat the test in 2022, fourteen from Holbrook Public School and six from St. Patrick's School.

Scholarship payments are conditional on the students' continued academic progress, effort and application. Recipients are asked to forward their end of year school report to the trustees each year.

The winner of the Major Award was Jessica Frana from Holbrook Public School.

The winner of the Minor Award was Sarah Cattle from Holbrook Public School.

The two Encouragement Awards went to Justin

Nisbet from Holbrook Public School and Ryan Smith from St Patrick's School.

Congratulations to these four students – the Commander Holbrook RSL War Memorial recipients for 2022.

#### **PLANT PICK PLATE**

Finally, I have tomatoes ripening. Like other gardeners without a large hothouse, this is a welcomed and much awaited event following a late and cooler commencement to our summer. Tomatoes and other hot weather loving vegetables are failing to thrive to their full potential due to the lower temperatures and the significant summer rains in our region.

I planted seeds of apple cucumbers and rock melon several times without so much as a shoot appearing above the ground. The capsicums and egg plant seedlings just sat there pleading for more heat, failing to thrive I eventually removed them. That's not all! Some of my protected and very productive raspberry canes turned crispy brown after drowning in excessive water pooling in that part of my garden. Ahhhh, the trials and tribulations of a productive garden where nothing is guaranteed.

This can also be said for purchased plants and even self seeding vegetables. Having given up on raising my own plants from seed, I reluctantly purchased a zucchini from a plant stall (simply labelled Zucchini). I still have visions from long ago when these monstrous dark green cylindrical fruit became too big to eat, being thrown over the fence to the cows. Currently, the growth of this compact light green zucchini with a subtle sweet flavour is a pleasant surprise. The variety - Italian dwarf light green zucchini.

Also pleasing is the self seeding tomato plants emerging from soil brought in. Not aware of the variety, the waiting involved regular investigation as to how the flowers were forming – singularly or on a truss. Delicious Tommy Toe trusses of bite size fruits are now ripening. 


