HOLBROOK RESIDENT HONOURED WITH ORDER OF AUSTRALIA

Holbrook resident, John Simpson, was among many Australians recognised as a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) on 26 January this year.

John was honoured by the Governor-General for his 'significant service to business, education and to the community.' Married to Cathy (née Shaw) whose family has owned Wantagong (on the Jingellic Rd) since the late 1960's - John has been a regular visitor to Holbrook since the mid-1980s, when he and Cathy were married. During and since Covid, John has spent the majority of his time at Holbrook while also visiting Melbourne several times a month.

John is a former Director of Shell Australia Limited and Shell Energy Holdings (Australia) Limited. He was Chairperson of the Commonwealth Superannuation Complaints Tribunal, President of the large Victorian superfund - ESSS (covering police and emergency service personnel across the state) and is actively involved in the Australian Institute of Company Directors. In education, John served as a Member of Council of Scotch College (Melbourne) and continues to serve as a Member of Council of Monash University.

In the community, John was Deputy Chairperson of the Canberra-based National Science and Technology Centre - Questacon for six years, a Director of the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra and a founding Director of the food redistribution organisation - SecondBite - providing daily food relief to thousands of people nationally. He is a current Director of the Bionics Institute devoted to researching some of humankind's most difficult health and medical challenges.

John and Cathy have three sons, Will, Tom and James. All three learnt to ride horses and motor bikes at Wantagong and continue to enjoy visiting when they can. John has been voted **The Ten Mile's** most regular customer and is known to love a morning coffee or two!

REGIONAL TECH HUB

The new Regional Tech Hub provides much needed independent, free advice about telecommunications services for people who live and work in regional, rural and remote areas of Australia.

This initiative recognises that for those who live and work outside of major cities and towns, accessing and troubleshooting phone and internet connectivity can be more complex for a range of reasons. Connectivity is an increasingly important part of life, and the Regional Tech Hub will help to ensure that regional Australians are able to fully realise the benefits of connectivity – for social connectedness, operating a business and accessing essential services like health and education.

Regional, rural and remote Australians can now access the Regional Tech Hub, where they will find a range of online resources to help understand connection options, troubleshoot faults and optimise phone and internet connections.

The Regional Tech Hub staff, who bring a wealth of experience in IT, regional communications and customer service, are available to provide one-on-one assistance via phone, email or social media.

The Regional Tech Hub is being delivered by the National Farmers' Federation, in collaboration with the Australian Communications Consumer Action Network and is funded by the Australian Government as part of its response to the 2018 independent Regional Telecommunications Review. The review found that there is a market for a simple platform aimed towards regional Australians to help them navigate digital technologies, building on the services and techniques developed by the volunteer organisation Better Internet for Rural, Regional and Remote Australia.



PLANT PICK PLATE

The cooler morning temperatures signifying that Autumn is here! For the productive gardener it's a matter of "out with the old and in with the new" as the summers plants come to an end and soil preparation commences for the Autumn/Winter crop plantings and seed sowing.

I have done just that. My tomatoes had become a haven for the pests so out they came. Hopefully the green fruits I kept will ripen. Also out came most of the basil planted as a companion to the tomatoes, keeping only one strong bush for the kitchen. The unused beds in my vege patch have been manured, composted and fertilised. This task is ongoing until the Butternut Pumpkin and Zucchini vines have been kissed by the frost. They are still producing so I will leave.

Remember to crop rotate when planning your crops. My number one planting is the Garlic followed by the legumes, leafy greens, root vegetables and all varieties of onions. There is always room for a succession of quick growing Lettuce in between.

I have been sowing Lettuce throughout Summer to have fresh leaves always on hand. Recently I included Broccolini as well, sown in punnets and placed inside in the warmth. When large enough I left them outside for a few days to harden. Big mistake! The white butterfly is very much still active and in no time tiny green eating machines had demolished half the seedlings.

Obviously pests can still be a problem in our gardens. Rodents are another to be aware of. Out of the corner of my eye I saw a long tail dash behind my storage bins. A mouse I thought, I will share my garden with him. Later a full sized rat whisked along the boundary fence and behind the bins. There is something about a rat I cannot tolerate. No sharing with him. **Passionate Gardener, June.**

Alligator weed

Wanted For:

- ★ Choking waterways.
- ★ Threatening biodiversity.
- ★ Eliminating small crops and turf farms.
- ★ Blocking and damaging pumps, and restricting water access.

What to Look Out For:


- ★ Leaves are green, shiny and spear-shaped. Leaves attach directly to the stem and grow in opposite pairs along the stem.
- ★ Flowers are small, white and papery. Flowers grow in groups at the tips of stems.
- ★ Stems are red to green when young, turning dark green as they get older. Stems are hollow which help it float.
- ★ This weed is an **aquatic weed**. This means that it has adapted to live on, under or near fresh water or salt water environments.

What to Do if You See It

This weed is a **Weed of National Significance!** which means it is regarded as one of the worst weeds in Australia. It has many negative economic and environmental impacts. If you think you've seen this weed, the best thing you can do is tell an adult so that they can report it to your local council biosecurity weeds officer.


