

Pedestrians urged to 'look out before you step out'

Highly visible pavement stickers are being installed at pedestrian crossings, intersections and pedestrian refuges throughout Greater Hume to remind pedestrians to cross at the safest locations and to make safe decisions when crossing the road. Council's Road Safety Officer, Kim Schultz said Roads and Maritime Services and the Centre for Road Safety are working with councils across the state to expand the 'look out before you step out' campaign to combat the number of pedestrians hit on the state's roads and bring the road toll Towards Zero.

"The stickers are at key pedestrian crossing points a reminder to everyone to 'look out before you step out" particularly over the busy holiday period," Kim said. "More than 1,500 pedestrians are struck across NSW each year and the aim of the initiative is to drive that number down.

"Taking risks and not being mindful on the roads can end in tragedy, which is why it is important for pedestrians to have their head in the moment.

"We also know this is a two-way street, and drivers also need to play their part by slowing down, especially in

high pedestrian 40km/h zones and on local streets where they know pedestrians are out and about.

"It's important to stick to speed limits in high pedestrian areas since a car travelling at 50km/h is twice as likely to kill a pedestrian than a car travelling at 40km/h." Stickers will be installed over the coming days starting Tuesday, 27 November 2018.

Greater Highlights from the Hume Council Meeting


Council received a report on the audit of Council's books and the financial result for the year ended 30 June 2018. Council's net operating result (before grants and contributions provided for capital purposes) for the financial year was \$1,123,000.

Council approved the use of B-Doubles for the cartage of plantation softwood logs during a six year period commencing 2019 on Tunnel Road from Tin Mines Trail to Woomargama Way. The approval is subject to PF Olsen contributing \$397,000 for upgrades to Tunnel Road. The use of B-Doubles will be subject to a range of conditions including road reduced speed limits, restricted access times, plus ongoing consultation and engagement with residents and local road users about haulage times and any other issues.

Council endorsed the Annual Report on council activities for the period ending 30 June 2018. Residents can view the document online on Council's website.

Council will participate in a Rural Health Consumers and Providers Alliance recently established with a mandate to lobby State and Australian Governments for better health policies and funding to support more equitable health services provision in rural and regional areas of NSW.

Council's quarterly budget review to 30 September, reported that the projected cash surplus for 2018/2019 improved by \$33,079.



Council resolved to immediately introduce an initial drought relief package to include:

Residents of Greater Hume Council whose residence is not able to be connected to a reticulated water supply will be eligible to access Council operated stand-pipes at Jindera, Burrumbuttock, Brocklesby, Gerogery and Culcairn. Eligible residents will be issued with an appropriate electronic key at a reduced cost of \$100 (current cost is \$295), fully refundable when the resident no longer requires access to Council standpipes, OR, by 30 June 2019 whichever is the sooner on return of the key. All water purchased by eligible residents under this arrangement, including residents who already hold an electronic key, will be charged at the current minimum price of \$1.70kl Contractors delivering potable water to residents of Greater Hume Council will be charged \$1.70kl for water (as opposed to the current price of \$3.00kl), subject to confirmation being supplied by the contractor that the water was delivered for domestic use. This initial relief package will conclude 30 June 2019 at which time Council will consider further drought assistance should conditions remain unchanged or worsen.

Community development grants totalling \$13,376 and with submission of additional information a further \$4,405 were approved for projects right across the shire. This round will see a range of funding for improvements and equipment for halls and function areas, tennis courts, sheep pavilion, museum and a sportsground. A full listing is available for viewing in the minutes.

Next Council meeting will be held on 19 December at Culcairn. Meeting agendas and minutes are available for viewing at any time on Council's website or in person at any Greater Hume Customer Service Centre.






