CHANGE TO AN AUTUMN SHOW WAS WELL SUPPORTED

After taking the plunge and changing the date of the Holbrook Show from November to late March, it was fantastic to see so many people supporting the event. The early morning showers may have had an adverse effect on the number of Fun Ring riders, but certainly did nothing to detract from the support from both cattle and show horse competitors.

Following the official opening of the 2019 Holbrook Show by 2018 State Showgirl Finalist, Emily Jones, the junior showgirl and Master Showboy competition began. Holbrook Showgirl, Kate Grunow, and Emily had the challenging task of judging the large number of girls and boys in this.

Poultry exhibitors were able to compete for some excellent prizes, as well as the opportunity to have their names engraved on the beautiful trophies for the Champion and Reserve Champion Bird of Show. These had been hiding in the back of a shed in Wagga for the past 20 years, but with a good deal of elbow grease they have polished up very well.

In the pavilion, Chic Taskis won the Champion Rose, Sharon Waite won the Rich Fruit Cake (and is now eligible to represent Holbrook at

the Group Final next February), John Maher won the Champion District Fleece and June Kilpatrick was awarded the Bunyan Trophy for Most Successful in the Garden Produce and Eggs. Both the produce and horticulture classes fell victim to the long dry summer but the introduction of a couple of new sections, such as Home Brew and the Landcare-themed Cake, attracted a good deal of favourable comment. Handicraft, lego and photography were all popular with exhibitors.

The local community radio station conducted an outside broadcast from the show and were able to interview a wide range of people. A demonstration by the Albury Handweavers and Spinners Group offered the opportunity for interested people, particularly children, to have a go at spinning and to ask lots of questions.

The appearance of Dodgem cars and the Bungy jump, together with rides for smaller children, kept many families occupied for some time. This year the Dog Show organisers had asked to move to "Circus Flat", up near the Submarine, due to prickles in the grass. Although this separated the show day attractions it did provide a good area for parking next to the showground and the dog exhibitors were extremely happy with the arrangement.

Thanks must go to the numerous volunteers who help with keeping the Holbrook Show going, as well as to the generous support of sponsors and the assistance of staff from Greater Hume Council.




Now is great opportunity to reassess pastures, update your livestock management plan - how much longer should we feed, and hear the latest information on dual purpose crops. You come along to Holbrook Landcare's interactive discussion regarding what's happening in the paddock now. Speakers include: Sandy Middleton, Southern Slopes Agronomy, will discuss pasture renovations cost vs benefit; lime how much is enough, how to incorporate - what depth method is best; livestock assessment. Dr Jeff McCormack, CSU, will add to the discussion with dual-purpose information on crops including agronomy and grazing management for sheep and pasture management including assessment, pasture establishment, species selection and general management.

Soil Testing Program: This program has now been running for 8 years, and has helped landholders become more effective and efficient with managing their soil fertility through:

- Understanding their soil's capability.
- Making informed decisions regarding setting target levels for major nutrients such as phosphorus, nitrogen, potassium and sulphur.
- Learning how to measure and match inputs.
- Developing personalised strategies for managing soil fertility over time.

All landholders are eligible to be involved in the program. Current Holbrook Landcare members will be eligible for a discounted price for their soil tests, which includes: access to soil corers and sample bags, processing and postage of soil samples.

Landholders are required to take their own soil samples but Holbrook Landcare will coordinate the testing and results.




MEN'S SHED

COUNCIL NEWS

Highlights from meeting held on 20 March at Carabost: Council received a status update regarding two planning proposals. The first proposal will enable changes to the Greater Hume 2012 Local Environmental Plan for zoning and minimum lot size for a number of allotments in the vicinity of Culcairn, Henty and Holbrook.

Council was advised that the resubmitted proposal will include changes to zoning and minimum lot size of additional sites at Holbrook, Morven and Henty.

A new draft Waste Strategy was tabled, which reviews Council's current waste practices and plans a range of strategies to ensure that the service remains affordable and accessible for ratepayers, remains sustainable, and minimises the impact of waste on the environment. Council will soon conduct a workshop to discuss the strategy and then endorse the draft. The community will have an opportunity to Have A Say when the final draft waste strategy is placed on exhibition for public comment.

Council will also write to the football clubs of Jindera, Rand/Walbundrie/Walla Walla Giants and Henty, and the Rotary Club of Holbrook, to thank them for undertaking the Hard Waste Collection held early March, which proved to be very popular. In appreciation, Council agreed to provide a \$1,000 donation to each of the football clubs involved.

Subject to further funding being obtained to enable the establishment of a purposed built men's shed at Holbrook, Council agreed to offer to sell an allotment at the Holbrook Industrial Estate to the Holbrook Men's Shed group at the reduced price of \$20,000 plus GST.

Anzac Day ceremonies will be conducted across Greater Hume on 25 April, with Council representatives attending the services in Culcairn, Brocklesby, Henty, Holbrook, Burrumbuttock, Jindera and Walla Walla. Details can be found on Council's website.

Council has received \$252,200 black spot funding to install road safety treatments at the intersection of Coach Rd and Benambra Road and a further \$100,000 for installation of guard rail on Dights Forest Road and the removal of trees restricting sight distances at the Funks Road intersection. Council will write to all candidates for the Federal seat of Farrer, seeking funding to improve the intersections of Carabost Road and Coppabella Road with Tumbarumba Road.

The survey will be completed by IRIS Research, an independent market research consultancy with more than 30 years' experience specialising in local government.
