HOLBROOK UNDER 17S WIN THE PREMIERSHIP




Holbrook's Under 17 team are the toast of the town after winning their Hume League grand final at Walbundrie on Saturday. Entering the match as underdogs against the all-conquering Osborne Tigers, the Brookers withstood a last-quarter charge by the Tigers to prevail by 5 points. When Bailey Churchill goaled with five minutes left in the third term, Holbrook led by 24 points, before Osborne made their move. In a dramatic final term, the Tigers booted 1 goal 7 behinds with the breeze. Only some stout defending from the likes of Fletcher Parker, Braydon Eddy, Lachie Holmes, and Tom Fitzgerald allowed the Brookers to hang on like a cat on a roof. Parker's courage saw him back bravely into some risky situations, he was later awarded Holbrook's best player of the finals. Jock Triggs scored the medal for best on ground, he chalked up a stack of possessions and generally found a target with his kicks. Jack Keogh (3 goals) and Jack de Steiger (2 goals) got the job done up forward, while Todd McNamara and Nathan Miller handled the footy cleanly in the windy conditions. Also featuring in the action were ruckman Will Canny, Rohan Jepson, Oliver Whitley (1 goal), Logan Wright, Will Plunkett, and Matt Bender. In his post-match address, coach Ben Talarico praised his team for their commitment throughout the season, and said even if they'd lost he would've been proud of them. It's worth noting that Bill Heriot coached the team for five matches while Talarico was in Vietnam mid-season.



LITTLE BILLABONG CWA NEWS

The Little Billabong Branch held their International Day on Saturday 14 September at the Anglican Hall. In 2019, the Country of Study was Papua New Guinea which is our nearest neighbour. PNG has almost 9 million people and 1,100 languages- 17 times the languages of Europe in an area of the size of France! Tok Pisin- a pidgin dialect and English are now widely accepted as the national languages. The Island has been settled for about 40,000 years. 97% of the country's land is owned and managed under customary tenure and stewardship. It is a very poor country. While PNG abounds in dense forests, precious minerals, gas and oil, most people do not benefit from these resources, and frequently live below the poverty line. We welcomed ladies from other CWA branches, and some local people who listened to some fantastic stories about PNG and in particular, the Kokoda Track. We were thrilled to have Oliver Killalea join us for the day- Oliver was in PNG during WW2; not on the Track but not far from it at Buna. So many veterans from our district also served in PNG during WW2.

Our first guest speakers were Andrew Kane- son of Peter and Rosana - and Peter Clancy — originally from Mountain Creek — who gave their impressions of their recent treks of the Track. It certainly isn't a Sunday afternoon walk around the park! In fact, it is 96kms long, in the Owen Stanley Ranges, rising to a height of 2,490 metres (8,170ft) at Mount Bellamy. It begins at Ower's Corner in the Central Province, 50kms east of Port Moresby, goes across rugged and very steep terrain to the village of Kokoda in Oro Province. It

passes through the land of the Mountain Koiari people. The people who welcomed our guest speakers into their villages as they walked the Track were some of the friendliest people they have ever met.

Our lunch- all dishes PNG recipes - followed Andrew and Peter. As sweet potato and coconut -abound in the country, they were used in a lot of the dishes, which included a 'Bully Beef' with rice and tomatoes, curried chicken, curried fish, coconut chicken, Kokoda fish with salad, and hot mixed vegetables. The desserts were coconut cake, banana cake PNG style, and two different dishes of tapioca. All were thoroughly enjoyed by everyone attending the day. Thank you to the members who cooked the food for everyone to enjoy. After the scrumptious lunch, Bruce Wright and Grant Harris from the Rotary Club of Tumbarumba spoke about the trips they have done to the Track with the Tumbarumba High School students. Bruce has trekked 13 times, and Grant 8 times. The Rotary Club support a village along the Track and also a school there. Some of the photos they showed were quite amazing of the country the Track follows. We also saw photos of the local people and the towns of Port Moresby and learned about the state of the roads in PNG!!!! Many photos and memorabilia were on display - some memories of WW2 veterans, some from the 1960-1980 times, and today.

We extend our thanks to our wonderful guest speakers, the people who supplied the memorabilialocally and from the Gerogery and Jindera branches, and our guest speakers and others. Thank you to all who attended our day.

Recently, close to midnight, a local teenage resident found herself with difficulty breathing. Her puffer wasn't providing relief, but with a quick phone call to Holbrook Hospital and a short trip to town, was promptly provided with the assistance she needed.

In both cases the families of their loved ones were very grateful and impressed by the care and treatment they received in our local facility.

These cases, which are representative of many others, exemplify the high level of expertise our local hospital offers, together with the support they have access to from our regional major hospitals.

Just recently also, three local families, at least, have expressed their gratitude for the 'end of life' care their loved ones have received in the Holbrook Hospital and Harry Jarvis Wing. As a community, we value the high quality care provided to our loved ones and in turn providing feedback, and thanks is very much extended to the staff.

The Holbrook Hospital Emergency Department is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. However, if a resident is in a situation requiring urgent medical attention, you are reminded to ring 000.





BE ALERT AND CONSIDER 'COULD IT BE SEPSIS?'

Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD) is urging the community to be alert to the symptoms of sepsis to help fight the potentially fatal disease. "Any delays in identifying symptoms and starting treatment including antibiotics, increase a patient's risk of death, loss of limbs or other long-term disability," Dr Douch said.

Sepsis symptoms to be alert for in very unwell adult patients with an infection include muscle pain, shivering, breathlessness, confusion or not passing urine for more than a day. "If a child is unwell with an infection, look out for a very high or very low temperature, very fast breathing, confusion, a 'fit' or convulsion, mottled skin, lethargy, not feeding, and repeated vomiting as alert symptoms," said Dr Lander. "The groups most at risk are the very young, those older than 65 years and people with weakened immune systems.

"We need everyone to consider 'could it be sepsis?' so, we can stop sepsis and save lives."

Patients with sepsis are up to five times more likely to die than patients with a heart attack or stroke so beginning treatment immediately is crucial to saving lives and improving patient outcomes. Resilience Day held at Culcairn. Steve Bowen was the main presenter and talked about the Boomerang Theory which means that what you throw out, is what you get back. Students participated in many activities throughout the day covering topics of bullying, teamwork, stepping out of comfort zones and discovering their own core values. POLICE REPORT

Hello Everyone,

Every few years the New South Wales Firearms Registry conduct what is commonly known as a 'Firearms Audit'. This involves your local Police visiting those in our community who have firearms registered to their name to ensure that the records held by the Firearms Registry are correct. Checks are also conducted on the storage facilities used by those permit holders to store their firearms to ensure they are safe and comply with the legislative requirements set out by the Registry.

Over the next twelve months Police in the Murray River Police District – which includes your local Police – will be contacting all those within our area that have firearms registered to them. We will be making appointments to attend the location listed as the storage location and checking all the firearms and safes for all categories of Firearms Licences. That is Categories A,B,C,D, and H. We will also be checking those classed as Collectors and Dealers.

If you have any of the listed category of licence and have firearms registered to you name, you can expect a call, so please be prepared. Make sure your safe complies with the legislative requirements, failure to comply could see your firearms seized, your licence suspended, and criminal charges laid. Firearms safety is your responsibility and the New South Wales Police Force take it very seriously.

If you are unsure, or would like to double check to make sure you have everything right, you can find out what is required on the New South Wales Police Force website www.police.nsw.gov.au/online_services/firearms/safe storage.

If you do not have internet access, please give us a call and we will happily provide you with a copy of the information you require.

There is no set pattern to who we contact and when. Everyone will eventually be checked, however if you would like to get yours over and done with, feel free to give us a call and we will be more than happy to come out and check.

PLANT PICK PLATE

The sun is shining and the soil is starting to warm up, however frosts are still a danger. Do not be tempted to plant tomatoes and the like just yet. Instead go for the hardier plants in the berry family which are extremely productive and will reward you with jewels of sweetness and flavour throughout the warmer months. The ever popular strawberry, raspberry and blueberry are the three I have growing in my garden.

Well, the warm temperate blueberries I HAD growing in my garden. Unfortunately, despite moving this pair to a more protected area they still did not flourish, our climate is too warm.

The raspberries on the other hand have been more successful, producing large quantities of delicious fruit in their 2nd and 3rd years. Bursts of flavour from these little ruby jewels I have shared with others, gorged oneself, then froze the remainder which I am still enjoying on my breakfast muesli. Tempted to include a raspberry in your garden? Consider carefully as this plant is a wild one. It displays multi thorns and will readily send up root suckers of new growth, often in areas you don't want which must be removed. In addition your garden helper will be required to construct a fence like trellis onto which the canes are tied throughout the growing period.

Not for you? Then everyone's favourite, the strawberry will be more appealing. These hardy plants are suited to every garden and produce juicy red jewels in the warmer months. I have just given my strawberry crop some TLC to entice prolific growth. Once the weeds were removed, they enjoyed a light haircut to remove old growth followed by a covering of manure, a sprinkle of slow release fertiliser, a dusting

of lime, a dressing of compost then finally the essential layer of mulch. So pampered.






