

#### PLANT PICK PLATE

I have relocated my herbs in readiness for new landscaping, which hopefully will be in the near future. I found the perfect spot in my front garden. The flat and curly leaf Parsley, Sage, Chives, Mint and Dill, the



Marjoram, Thyme, Coriander and Rosemary are thriving. Hence, this success raises the question "what to do with all these fresh aromatic herbs?" Incorporating them into my daily diet is the logical choice.

Since the Roman and ancient Chinese times herbs have been used as ointments and digested as health tonics. Dill and Fennel are said to cure insomnia and indigestion while Rosemary oil rubbed on the temples will relieve a headache. And Parsley is a SUPERFOOD! Who would have thought that the green sprig sitting forlorn on the edge of a plate is a superfood? It contains 3 times more vitamin A, B and C than an orange, is rich in fatty acids to aid digestion, iron and other vital minerals. With this discovery and my desire to eat healthy, the humble parsley will take pride of place featuring on almost every meal I prepare, much to the horror of those I cook for.

Most of my other herbs can be used in Herbal Teas, a tonic also of ancient origins and now in modern culture is enjoying a resurgence in popularity. Try infusing one teaspoon of crushed fresh leaves or half teaspoon of dried leaves in one cup of hot water for 3 – 5 minutes. Add lemon juice or honey for added flavour and sweetening but never milk or sugar. A fresh ginger infusion is excellent for nausea and an energy boost. Dill and chamomile have a calming and relaxing effect and the mint teas are refreshing especially when served chilled. So is this good bye to my beloved morning coffee? No chance.



### HOLBROOK CRICKET CLUB IS 150 NOT OUT

The 150th anniversary of the Holbrook Cricket Club will be celebrated at the Holbrook RS Club this coming Saturday 26th October.

There are few cricket clubs in regional Australia that are as old as Holbrook and still active. Australia has changed so much in the last 150 years and through it all, Holbrook has continued to play cricket.

Teams had to travel relatively long distances for their time, during daylight hours by horse, buggy or coach, and had to stay overnight at a local watering hole, although the whole affair had become a little safer after bushranger Daniel Morgan had met his demise in 1863.

Cricket matches were played between villages and stations on an ad-hoc invitational/challenge and reciprocal basis.

The advent of the railways through the region after 1879 enabled teams to get about more easily and new cricket clubs were established and matches played further afield.

Other clubs that Holbrook has had a close association with include Mangoplah and The Rock (both established in 1880), Uranquinty (1893), Yerong Creek (1894), Culcairn (1895), Benambra (1896), Mountain Creek, Henty and Lockhart (1897), Woomargama (1898), Lankeys Creek and Mullengandra (1899), Morven and Gerogery.

An organised competition was underway in the 1890's with the establishment of more clubs and Germanton occasionally had two teams. The inaugural Culcairn Country Cricket Competition (including Culcairn, Henty, Cookardinia and Gerogery) was won by Germanton in 1903-04.

This competition was replaced in 1913-14 by a railway "Line" competition that included Yerong Creek, The Rock and Uranquinty but excluded Germanton and Cookardinia.

The town was renamed Holbrook in 1915 while cricket was in recess for the duration of the First World War. After the war the Holbrook and District Cricket Association was established in 1921 and Holbrook has been the only continuously affiliated club ever since. Holbrook has been blessed with its fair share of fine cricketers over the years including Bill Whitting. principal of Holbrook Public School in 1926. Dr Doug Emery, former Sydney University first grader and fine batsman, led the team successfully for 10 years from 1957 before moving to Tamworth. Grazier and allrounder John Cornish led the Holbrook club to four consecutive premierships in the late 1970's as well as a football premiership in the Farrer League in 1970. Wicket-keeper/batsman Gordon Kendall who played for Country against Metropolitan in 1949-50 after Ron Ring from Little Billabong had done the same in 1946-47.

Tom Jones jnr and Clem Hicks both played for Country South in 1955-56 and opening batsman Hicks played for Riverina-Southern Districts against the touring England team at Wagga Wagga in 1959 when, at the age of 38, he faced the fiery Fred Trueman.

A number of other Holbrook players have played for Riverina: Kevin Cottrell and Bill Nixon (1949-50), Tom Kendall (1950-51), all-rounder Ted Wornes (1965-66) and leg-spinner Nigel Ross (3 years) captained Riverina at Country Week in Sydney in 1949-50.

More recently, all-rounder Stephen Taylor won the Ryder Medal for the best player in Melbourne District Cricket in 2015-16.


