Jayfields Nursery was, and is, an important contributor to the economy of Holbrook. And third generation farmer, second generation Landcare member, Colin Geddes finished with a message about why he got on the Board but without people getting involved the organization won't continue to be there for the farmers and community of Holbrook.

It was a great afternoon with a mix of celebrating the past and future— Dale and Kylie talked about the value of Landcare to the community and the landscape of Holbrook—the \$17M invested by various govt programs is estimated to have brought \$100M in run on value to Holbrook district and we can now see the change in vegetation cover from space! (Weekly Times Coles Farmer of the Year in 2018), finished off with future markets and Tom posed some great questions about "green branding" of products. 

I therefore challenge all those floral gardeners to get dirty in your vege patch and grow beautiful, curvaceous and sumptuous vegetables. All the






