Keep an eye out. Red bows have started appearing in the main streets of Culcairn, Henty, Holbrook, Jindera and Walla Walla.


The idea of the red bows is to decorate the main streets of our five towns during the festive season, and to send a welcoming message to all.



COMMEMORATING 200 YEARS IN AUSTRALIA



The National Museum of Australian Pottery, in Holbrook, is commemorating the arrival in December 1819, of the potters Jonathan Leak and John Moreton, both sentenced to Australia as convicts for life 200 years ago. Both men managed to establish their own pottery works in Sydney, and the Museum is fortunate in having the largest collection of both Leak's and Moreton's surviving pieces, which are all on display with the history of both men.

Come and spend some time in the Museum and take in the history of these 200 year old pieces, and see close to 2,000 other pottery pieces made by 126 potters from all over Australia, in the only Museum of its kind in Australia, dedicated to 19th and early 20th century Australian pottery.


MEALS ON WHEELS CHRISTMAS HAMPER

News from November Council Meeting

Council resolved to submit a submission that objects to the exhibition of the Environmental Impact Statement for the Walla Walla Solar Farm and the draft submission be amended in accordance with this resolution.

Council agreed to offer the Holbrook Men's Shed Inc. a loan of \$22,000 funded from Loans to Community Groups funding pool, with interest of 3% pa and a term of 10 years.

Council received a report on the quarterly budget review to 30 September 2019. The review indicates a cash surplus of \$75,789, an improved position based on the original estimate of \$1,411. The report noted that revenue from investment interest is being severely impacted by record low interest rates, with a review of investment income to be reported in the December quarterly budget review.

Council also expects savings to flow into the budget in the next quarter from workers compensation premium adjustments.

Due to the rollout of the Crown Land Management Act 2016, Council is required to introduce a short term licence fee of \$250 (incl of GST) for crown land grazing leases.

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1993, Council resolved to provide public notice of the proposed new fee for a period of 28 days.

Council will lodge two projects under the NSW Government's Fixing Local Roads grant round -1. Reconstruction of the remaining 6 km of Cummings Road, and 2. Reconstruction of 4 km of Fellows Hills Road. The proposed grant requires Council contribution of 25% of the cost of these projects.

Council was also notified of the Australian Government's latest drought funding announcement which will result in funding of \$1 Million, to combat the prolonged dry spell and drought's impact in our area. Council awaits grant guidelines but has been advised that the funding is to be invested in projects that support jobs and business income.

Council also resolved to consider two matters of urgency at the meeting. Council resolved to authorise senior management to undertake further negotiations with NEOEN in respect to a Voluntary Planning Agreement (VPA) for the proposed Culcairn Solar Farm and the Walla Walla Solar Farm.

Council also agreed that the results of negotiations be reported as an open agenda item at a future meeting and appropriate bodies be advised of the negotiations.

The next Council meeting will be held on 18 December at Holbrook.

This couple has been in ministry in the Anglican Church for 30 years and are on their way to the Northern Territory for more missionary work. Our Church supports the CMS as part of our mission work. Preparations are moving ahead for our Christmas services and there will be more in the next Holbrook Happenings.

Don't forget, our normal service is on Sunday at 9.30am in Holbrook and at Woomargama every second Sunday of the month at 11.00am.

We honoured our Op Shop volunteers and Parish Council by shouting them lunch on Monday the 2nd at the Middle Pub. This is the least we can do to thank them for their untiring work.

GREATER HUME SHIRE COMMUNITY GRANTS

A total of \$29,534 has been awarded to nine community groups as part of Greater Hume Council's 2019-2020 Community Development Grant Program.

The final allocations were signed off at the November Council meeting for projects aimed at enhancing the range, availability and quality of community facilities and community programs that benefit a diverse range of residents.

Greater Hume Council Mayor Heather Wilton said "Council's Community Development Grants are a great way to support our important community groups and clubs to maintain and improve facilities and provide a range of opportunities for connecting our communities.

It's great to see the diversity in grant proposals and this year we saw many quality grant submissions.

The Holbrook Netball Club, the Holbrook Community Gym Club and the Holbrook Swimming Club all received grants.

RIVERINA WATER GRANTS PROGRAM

Riverina Water's inaugural Community Grants Program has awarded almost \$390,000 in funding to projects and initiatives across the region.

The new grants program was open to individuals, community groups and organisations across the four Local Government Areas that Riverina Water services – Federation, Greater Hume, Lockhart and Wagga Wagga.

"This is a new initiative Riverina Water is trialling for two years as another way to give back to the communities in our service area," Riverina Water Chair, Councillor Greg Verdon, said.

"The Community Grants Program allows Riverina Water to fund a diverse range of projects that will benefit our residents for many years to come. The response to the program was overwhelming and the Board and I are looking forward to see these projects take shape over the coming months."

Unexpended funds from this year's program will be rolled over into the 2020/21 grants, with Greater Hume Council to have an extra \$56,773 available.

With the success of the first year and the extra funding available for these two Local Government Areas, Clr Verdon encouraged potential applicants to start thinking ahead to 2020.

"The total applications for funding across the four Local Government Areas exceeded the \$500,000 pool," he said. "Whether it's a small or large project, the Community Grants Program is a fantastic way for Southern Riverina communities to upgrade recreation facilities, do something creative or conserve water."

PLANT PICK PLATE

Summer is on our doorstep. Productive gardeners need to be vigilant in increasing water supply to their fruit and vegetables to maintain healthy plants and a bounty of crops. This is particularly important if you are going on holiday and you are unable to recruit a person to water your garden.

Prior to going away for a week I installed 7 day water timers to my taps with connections to soaker hoses and to my permanent water system. Pre-setting the time, day and duration of watering made it so easy and I could holiday knowing my vegetables would still be standing when I returned. The system worked a treat. My plants all survived and are now continuing their growth cycle with produce not too far away.

A note of caution though. Do a double check of your timer settings, do a test run then a third timer check just for peace of mind.

Harvesting produce is an on going delight and maturity is crucial.

The Garlic and Onions which I planted back in the Autumn can now be pulled up as the lower 5 leaves have died. Hang the bulbs to dry in a cool place. If you harvest too early the storage time will be reduced. An easy garlic hit is to roast the bulbs whole. Squeeze the sweet, soft flesh from the skins and use in marinades, sauces and dips. Yum.

Given the cooler spring weather this year, who will have their tomatoes ready to eat for Christmas? Congratulation to those who feel they will produce at least one tomato. If not, substitute other veges in your garden like the cucumber and zucchini in a salad. Shaved lengthwise into ribbons and added to halved strawberries and a segmented orange with a sprinkling of chopped fresh chives and pepper.

Also Yum. There is no need to stress if your tomatoes are still green, the carrots are very slow growing or the snails have feasted on the lettuce. Gardening is meant to be a pleasure not a chore so delight in and be creative with the produce you have. *Passionate Gardener, June.*


THANK YOU TO REGIONAL BUSES ON DEMAND




everyone had a wonderful time learning about our history. The students reported that they really enjoyed panning for gold at Sovereign Hill.






