HOLBROOK'S HEALTHY TOWN CHALLENGE LAUNCHED AT THE SUB



Holbrook's Healthy Town Challenge has begun, with more than 70 people attending the launch at the Submarine Park.

The launch provided a great opportunity for people to find out more about the challenge and how to get involved in events and activities. A Tai Chi demonstration, St Patricks school children skipping and being active along with healthy food and plenty of water provided through Riverina Water at the fill station at the park.

The Challenge goes from February to September and there will be lots of opportunities to get involved, sign up for free healthy coaching, free healthy lifestyle checks, learn how you can improve your health by making some simple lifestyle changes.

Holbrook successfully secured \$15,000 to contribute to the challenge as follows,

- Youth, including improving skate park activities \$5000
- Healthy catering for clubs, groups and community events, \$7000
- Encouraging greater participation & events \$3000

The Healthy Town Challenge is a joint initiative of the NSW Office of Preventive Health and the Heart Foundation NSW. The challenge supports regional and rural communities to facilitate healthy living activities to improve the health of their community members.




We're back to

Adaptive Farming Systems Forum: Approximately 50 local producers, and industry representatives took the opportunity to listen to a range of guest presenters speak about different aspects of adaptive farming systems proved to be very popular. They shared their experience and expertise on the how, when and why you would implement significant change into your farm business. Holbrook Landcare will be holding four follow-up workshops during the year, with a focus on implementing flexibility into farm management systems.

These workshops will offer an opportunity for farmers to reflect on their current management strategies, including production outcomes and the use of available natural resources in a variable economic and environmental climate.


We are open on Wednesday and Thursday between 8.00 and 1200 noon drop in for a brew and a chat.

ROTARY IN ACTION – DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Rupinda Kaur has first-hand knowledge of the stigma of divorce in her community and trauma associated with domestic violence in a new country with no family, no friends, nowhere to go and with few resources to support herself. Today, Rupinder is the chair of the Albury Wodonga Ethnic Community Council. She was guest speaker at the Rotary Club of Holbrook's dinner meeting held to acknowledge Peace and Conflict Prevention, Resolution.

Five years ago, Rupinder left a violent situation and although left with nothing, she fought to save herself and now she helps other women in her community. Rupinder painted a grim picture for some migrant women subject to domestic violence who are fearful of divorce and losing their children and even their right to Australian residency.

Some of the problems associated with domestic violence for migrant women are: The language, they can't speak English; don't know how to get help or who to contact; have nowhere to go for protection, no funds, no support; threatened with visa 457 conditions and loss of permanent residency.


Help lines: Is this an emergency? Rupinder cited one instance when a woman had her phone taken away

by her partner and was unable to call while the violence took place, then later when she did make the call, she was asked if it was an emergency and she said NO.

She said there needs to be special training for doctors, phone counsellors, police, and lawyers to provide safe environment for migrants in a new country. There is some training for networks of doctors who are more experienced in domestic violence matters in Albury Wodonga BUT "the System has to be educated." Although there is a women's refuge in Albury, Betty's Place, there is no refuge in Wodonga and gaining one is a long time off.

HOW CAN WE HELP? Dharuider Singh (lawyer) said the community can play a bigger role with Neighbourhood Watch — keep an eye on your neighbour because if you don't act it will only get worse. We all have the power to make a difference, reach out to people and they may open-up. Help people in our community by talking to them and being friendly.

PLANT PICK PLATE

Companion Planting has interested me for quite a while and as I read more about this method of gardening according to and in tune with nature, the more complex the subject becomes. It is not just a matter of planting marigolds as an insect deterrent or beans to provide nitrogen to the soil ready for the next crop. A sound knowledge of plant requirements and how they interact with other plants, an understanding of seasonal factors and an awareness of natural ecological systems also play a role in successful companion planting.

As your average home productive gardener, I find this concept in its entirety somewhat overwhelming. Therefore I have cherry picked pieces of information on companion planting that suits my garden and that can be applied to the produce I grow without unnecessary distress.

Now that the weather has cooled autumn/winter vegetable seeds and seedlings can be planted. Using the companion planting guidelines, onions and leeks are happy with members of the Cabbage family, celery and carrots but keep away from peas and beans as their growth will be inhibited. Cabbages are not compatible with strawberries so plant spinach with these berries instead. Potatoes enjoy the company of green beans, peas and broad beans but keep away from pumpkins. Garlic repels aphids but it is a member of the onion family so heed the advice above. Asparagus and tomatoes are great friends and will stimulate each others growth but dislike potatoes. Beetroot, parsley, lettuce and chives are friends with everyone so can be planted as borders. Wormwood has toxic roots and should be planted on the outer areas of a productive garden. I will be removing some of these in my garden. So, have you got your head around the basics of companion planting? Confused? You are not alone. Passionate Gardener, June


Don't forget that there will be horses galore, cattle, poultry, a wide range of pavilion exhibits, showbags


