





PLANT PICK PLATE

These cooler sunny days are absolutely magnificent and there is no better way to soak in the gentle sun than with some garden maintenance.

I made the most of Easter at home by undertaking some landscaping resulting in some plants requiring relocation. Now is the ideal time to repot, relocate and to take cuttings from non flowering plants ready for planting out in the spring.

I continue to harvest the remaining fruit on the summer crops but as they die down, the tomatoes, pumpkins, capsicums and zucchini I remove the plant. Be sure to place in the bin all the fallen fruit when the plant is removed to reduce disease.

My Iris's have also been divided and relocated into a revamped perennial garden where they will form the backdrop for my lower cuttings.

While working with the soil on my garden tasks I have noticed that it is drying out. Be mindful that it has been some time since we have received a heavy rain. I will continue to water and of course maintain the nightly pest patrol and extermination by torch. I am conscious of the number of caterpillars I see so the best way to protect my red cabbage and broccolini from the butterflies and moths is with a pest exclusion net draped over several poly pipe arches to form a tunnel. This environmentally friendly method is very effective.

Another weather event to be mindful of is the onset of frost. I have my shade cloth covers at the ready for my young lemon and lime trees as well as the passionfruit vine. Again I have structures of poly pipe arches mounted on steel posts over which the covers are draped and tied. Be sure allow for airflow so don't cover to the ground.

There are always lots to do in the garden. Enjoy yours.

BAKED VEGETABLE STACK

This is an economical, nutritious and easy recipe using any fresh vegetables from your garden or fridge.

Egg plant is a great bulk filler so use with zucchini, carrot, potato, pumpkin, capsicum, tomato, onion, leafy greens or whatever combination you have. Slice harder vegetables about 5mm thick and softer vegetables about 10mm thick then layer in a casserole dish. Sprinkle chopped garlic, chilli or herbs of your choice on a middle layer. Pour over a jar of tomato sauce, or tomato soup (dilute with 1/3 with water). Cover and oven bake until layers are soft, approx 1 hour. TIP: Egg plant releases water when cooking so slice and sprinkle with salt and leave for 20 min to remove excess water. Rinse and pat dry prior to use.

TOMATO SOUP RECIPE

If any gardeners out there have tomatoes left over, or if you have tomatoes from the shops or even a tin of tomatoes, this is the best tomato soup recipe. Children love it because it is very close to a good tinned tomato soup but fresher!

Fresh Tomato Soup

1 medium onion, 1 small potato, 500g tomatoes, 50g Butter or margarine, 2 garlic cloves, 1 bay leaf, 2tbsp tomato paste, 450ml vegetable stock, 430ml milk, Salt and pepper.

Chop the onion and potato. Quarter the tomatoes. Melt the butter and sauté the onion till transparent. Add the potato, tomatoes, crushed garlic, bay leaf, tomato paste and stock. Cover and simmer for 20

minutes or until cooked. Off the heat, stir in the milk. Remove the bay leaf. Blend in small quantities in a liquidizer or stick blender. Season to taste and reheat to serving temperature.


