

HOLBROOK LANDCARE

Have you heard an odd bird calling around Holbrook at night lately? Several people have asked what the strange noise is – it's an Eastern Koel. They are large cuckoos that are more commonly found in northern Australia but do turn up periodically. The great tree flowering season has brought a lot of Red Wattlebirds to the district, and these are their main targets. And yes, the calling can be a weeny bit annoying but luckily the birds are migratory!

A number of Grey Headed Flying Foxes have also been spotted in Holbrook lately - the large Silky Oaks (Grevillea robusta) around town are in full flower and are a great nectar resource. Keep an eye out at dusk.

LEST WE FORGET – JOHN JEFFREY

Trooper John Jeffrey was born in Coatbridge, Scotland, in 1895. When he left school, Jeffrey worked as an apprentice for nearly three years, training in engineering and draughtsmanship. Jeffrey came to Australia at the age of eighteen, finding residence in Germanton, to work as a station hand.

Jeffrey enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force only four months after Britain had declared war on Germany. Trooper Jeffrey was posted to the 1st Light Horse Regiment. This Regiment was one of three of the 1st Light Horse Brigade and was the first mounted formation committed by Australia to the First World War.

In February 1915, Jeffrey embarked from Sydney bound for Egypt. The light horse was originally considered unsuitable for the Gallipoli campaign but was soon deployed without their horses to reinforce the infantry. The 1st Light Horse Regiment landed at Gallipoli on the 12th May 1915.

A new offensive was launched in early August that year, in attempt to break the stalemate between the Allied and Turkish forces with a series of fresh attacks. The offensive began on the 6th of August, with the battle of Lone Pine. It was followed on by an attack at The Nek, the battle of Chunuk Bair, and others.


During these battles, at some point on the 7th August 1915, Trooper John Jeffrey was killed in action. With no known grave, his name is commemorated at the Lone Pine Memorial, on the Gallipoli Peninsula, in Turkey. References:



Sect 6B kids are getting better and thanks to parents for helping out here. The side has two wins but with a log jam mid-ladder all teams must be competitive, which is the main thing.


We will be having a BBQ after tennis on either 5th or 12th Dec – to be confirmed next weekend – please ask about this.


