You do not have to ship them to an auction site and delivery is arranged by the purchaser. You also set your own start price & reserve. The sale will also be advertised in the Holbrook, Albury-Wodonga & Wagga areas as well as promoted on social media and emailed out to a large database.

The Football Club will handle all invoicing and payments and the items will not leave your property until cleared payment has been made.

There is a lot of exciting developments at the Holbrook Sporting Complex lately including the resurfacing of the oval. This is happening at present. There are also new netball courts that have been completed recently, a new children's playground and there is the upcoming redevelopment of the clubrooms to come in the next 6-12 months.

SUBMARINE MUSEUM UPDATE

The Submarine Museum has been very fortunate in receiving a grant of money from the Submarine Institute of Australia to renovate the various rooms.

So far, the Jim Redwood Room has had rails installed for professional hanging of photos etc, and plinths with cases to display a few of the many Oberon artefacts held in archives. Later in January the room is having new carpet installed.

There is now a Tech Room which will allow visitors to understand the engines, batteries and breathing systems on-board the Oberon Class submarines.

The long weekend in January will see several submariners in town yielding paint rollers, as HMAS OTWAY undergoes her repaint. Hoping for great weather on the day!

The main focus in the next few months will be the curating and creating of display material relevant to the AE1 and AE2 submarines. This upgrade will complement the AE2 replica, which is being relocated and upgraded to allow visitors access through the museum.

With Roger Cooper's assistance, we have enlarged and printed some high quality photos of the original E class submarines in service in World War One. AE1 and AE2 were the two Australian E class submarines, and our early submarine squadron ended with the tragic loss of AE1 and scuttling of AE2 in the Dardanelles.

The construction of the walk-through and subsequent move of the replica closer to the museum has yet to be arranged. We look forward to our visitors discovering the story of "The Silent ANZAC-AE2"

In the meantime, Dr Roger Neil (scientist on the AE2 diving expedition) is working on a voice replication of AE 2's captain, Dacre Stoker to play inside the replica. Special lighting and supporting exhibitions for AE2 and AE1 within the museum are also planned. The project will have an official opening once the major works are completed. Recently The Border Mail, the Murray Goulburn ABC and Riverina ABC radio stations have interviewed Cathy Mann, Curator to discuss the project.



PLANT PICK PLATE

Our floral gardens are looking magnificent at present. The summer rain has encouraged growth with floral repetitions providing a fabulous display of heady scents and a visual rainbow of colour. Wouldn't it be great to capture some of this beauty to enjoy later in the year. The age old dried flower preservation is the answer.

I recall experimenting with pressed dried flowers when I was younger. The flowers and leaves were placed between sheets of blotting paper which was then placed between sheets of newspaper then placed between 2 heavy books in a cool position for about 2 weeks to dry. Now I tend to air dry my lavender, bay, basil and other herbs by bunching and hanging upside down in a cool dry place. Roses can be dried in the same manner by harvesting at bud stage or just opening. The Pink roses retain their colour best, however the red, yellow, whites and oranges turn dark or beige. Alternatively, a 5 hour low cook in the oven with door open apparently will achieve the same dried result.

I needed dried lavender to place with my stored woollens and these methods all require time and patience, hence my search for a quicker method. Reading that flowers can also be dried in the microwave, I thought it was worth a try. The lavender I placed on paper towel in the microwave and zapped for 4 minutes on high as per instructions, (2 minutes for delicate flowers). At 2.50 minutes the flowers burst into flames requiring a quick placement into the sink and doused with water. I can tell you that burnt lavender is not the relaxing scent of defused lavender and of course most herbal oils are flammable aren't they!

My New Year's resolution is to practice more patience and not to leave my microwave on unattended.

DEATH OF MRS HOLBROOK

Gundula Helene Feldner was born in Austria in 1914 and was an only child. She passed away at her home late on New Year's Eve 2020 in the village of Steinfeld, Austria.

She married Commander Norman Holbrook VC in 1952, and the couple lived in England until his death on the 3rd July 1976, a few days short of his 88th birthday.

Norman and Gundula first visited the town named after him in 1956, and their last visit together was in 1975.

In 1982 Gundula presented Norman's Victoria Cross and other WW1 medals to the community of Holbrook.

Her incredible generosity to the town of Holbrook was the impetus behind the HMAS OTWAY casing being installed in Germanton Park.

She travelled to Australia for the Dedication/Freedom of Entry Parade in 1997 and was made an honorary citizen of Holbrook.

"I think this is the most important thing that has ever happened to me," Mrs Holbrook told *The Border Mail*. "I don't feel like a visitor any more, now I am a resident."

On November the 1st, 2020, Gundula celebrated her 106th birthday.

Greater Hume Council Mayor Heather Wilton paid tribute to Gundula, "She was a marvellous person, a great benefactor to the people of Holbrook and the Shire of Holbrook and the Greater Hume Council".

Cr Wilton will formally acknowledge Mrs Holbrook next month in a mayoral minute at the council's first regular meeting for 2021. Her funeral is expected to take place in February due to the appalling weather currently being experienced in Austria.
