AFTER 10 YEARS THE RECREATIONAL PATH BETWEEN JINDERA AND LAVINGTON IS BACK ON THE TABLE

Back in 2009 Greater Hume Council agreed to form a working group with Albury to investigate the feasibility of constructing a Recreational path between the two towns. A lot of work was done including the production of a plan and interim costings. However in 2012 Council voted to disband the group and despite a number of presentations to Council it wasn't until the July 2019 council meeting that Council again agreed to reform the working group with Albury to again consider the feasibility of a recreational path between the two towns.

Local resident Cheryl Ingrey who has been involved with the project from the beginning and organised the initial proposal to Council, and since the group was disbanded in 2012 Cheryl has been pushing for the working group to be reformed. And contrary to some thoughts Cheryl said it was never the intention to use Council funds to construct the path but to get the planning and costings finalised to have the project shovel ready for when grant funds are available to get the construction under way.

Cheryl said it is an exciting time getting the Recreational path back on council books and it has been a long time in the coming but it is a project she is passionate about and she is very happy to see it again making progress.

SUPPORTING PEOPLE THROUGH CANCER

Helping support people who have cancer, or are recovering from cancer, is very important to the volunteers working at Rural Care Link, especially the OP Shop Volunteers. They have helped numerous members of Rural Care Link to get through their treatment regimes.

One of the people they have helped over the past 12 months, and are still helping, is the Vice President and OP Shop Coordinator of Rural Care Link, Colleen Lord. Colleen is known to many in Jindera due to her exercise classes, especially AquaFitness and Pole Walking. Colleen used exercise during her treatment as a means of helping her body to cope and to heal. She has spent many hours researching how exercise helps cancer treatment to be more effective, and how it also helps with recovery and healing after treatment.

She was motivated to continue her work as an exercise trainer by the Breast Care Nurses at the Mater Hospital in Sydney, and to bring her knowledge and experience back to Jindera.

Now, with the help of other professionals, she hopes to have exercise classes for cancer patients and cancer survivors twice a week at the Hub in

Jindera. These classes will be especially designed to help people through chemotherapy and radiation therapy, and to assist their recovery after surgery.

With funding from the Rural Care Link Committee, and input from relevant health professionals, she hopes to have established the first classes by October, 2019. The health care professionals who will contribute to the establishment of this project, are Dr Vaughan Saunders, Osteopath, and Bailey Lang, Osteopath and Exercise Physiologist, both from Sports & Spinal, Albury, Dr John Stevens, Exercise Physiologist and Managing Director of Kinetic Medicine, and Sophie Rohde, Exercise Physiologist, also from Kinetic Medicine.

As someone who knows how exercise helps with recovery, Colleen says, “this is a great opportunity to help yourself at a time when you need it most. I know I will be the first to sign up to these fun classes to continue the healing process”.

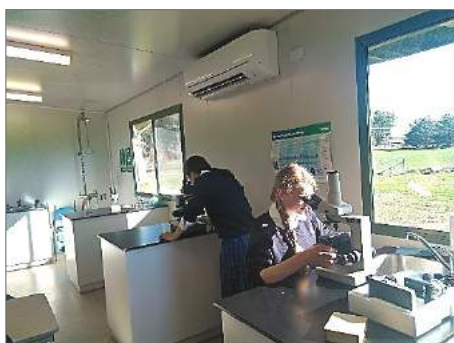
Our school entered into the 2019 Sydney Royal Flower and Garden Show and received first place in the regional schools category, two years running. We were commended for our sustainability methods including composting, worm farm, organic pest control and our seed raising program. The students from years 3-6 all put a lot of effort into the garden and should be commended for their great work.

In year 11 Biology we have been learning about how the Earth has changed over time and what effect this has had on past ecosystems. The students created a linear timeline (about 50m long) to illustrate the most significant developments in the Earth's history.

In year 11 Chemistry students have been designing their own experiment to investigate what factors impact the rate of chemical reactions. Students will be presenting their findings by writing a formal scientific report.



In Term 2 our Year 12 Chemistry students studied Carbon Chemistry and as part of this unit they studied soaps and surfactants. They then undertook a depth study of different types of surfactants. The photos show the students testing out their products to analyse its properties. Biology students have had an exam on practical work and have been using the newly purchased microscopes. These are of a very high quality and a great asset to helping a passion for Science in our school. In the photo some of the year 12 Biology students are looking at blood samples under the microscope.





In response to a notice of motion presented by Cr Denise Knight, Council resolved to work with Albury City Council to reconvene a joint working committee to prepare a feasibility study and plans for a bicycle walking path between Jindera and Lavington.

Council adopted the draft Greater Hume Waste Strategy 2019 – 2023 including 13 recommendations. Key recommendations include that current operating hours be maintained together with current fees and charges unchanged. Council will develop reuse swap areas at waste facilities with items being left and collected on a free to take basis, and will continue to provide support for community driven hard waste collections.

Council accepted the tender from Total Garden Solutions for \$43,956 (excl GST) to undertake contract mowing of cemeteries, pools and council owned properties for the next three years.

The Mayor, Cr Heather Wilton, Deputy Mayor, Cr Doug Meyer OAM will attend the annual Local Government Conference to be held this year at Warwick Farm in October and be accompanied by Director Corporate and Community Services, David Smith and Cr Lea Parker as observers.

Council received a comprehensive report on the review of ward boundaries across the Greater Hume area, triggered by a population variance of more than 10% between the highest population ward and the lowest population ward. Under the Local Government Act 1993 Council must keep ward boundaries under review, and alter ward boundaries so that in each ward containing a number of electors does not differ by more than 10 per cent from the number of electors in each other ward. Greater Hume currently has three wards, North, South and East.

Council resolved to adopt Option 2 as the preferred ward boundary option for public consultation during

August/early September. Council will receive a further report at the September meeting. Council also decided to undertake a constitutional referendum to consider if the Council area should continue to be divided into wards. The referendum will take place at the next elections in 2020.

In June the NSW Government announced a grant funding pool of \$794,431 as Greater Hume's allocation under Stronger Country Communities Round 3. The guideline highlights that 50% of funding needs to youth focused projects or programs, and projects must seek \$50,000 grant funding or more. Applications can be made online until 27 September 2019. Council will now consider which projects it may wish to put forward along with applications received from community organisations. Community members wishing to make enquiries of the grant funding should contact Council's Tourism & Promotions Officer, Kerrie Wise.

Council appointed Cardno NSW to undertake the Culcairn, Henty and Holbrook Flood Mitigation - Investigation and Design Works Project at a value of \$245,098.80 (excl GST). It is expected that the project will take up to 12 months to complete. Following completion, Council will then be eligible to pursue financial assistance through Office Environment & Heritage Floodplain Management Program to implement improvements to drainage infrastructure to help reduce flooding in the three towns.

The next Council meeting will be held on 21 August at Culcairn.

Seeking public comment - proposal to alter Ward Boundaries



Under section 211 of the Local Government Act 1993 (LG Act), a council must keep ward boundaries under review. If a review is undertaken and the difference between the number of electors of the highest ward and the lowest ward is greater than 10%, the ward boundaries must be altered.

A council must also consult with the NSW Electoral Commission and the Australian Statistician before altering ward boundaries and publicly exhibit the proposal.

Population growth in the Greater Hume local government area has resulted in the variance of ward boundaries to exceed 10%.

Council considered the issue at the July Council meeting, and has resolved to seek public comment in relation to the proposal to alter ward boundaries. The proposal includes attributes of the proposal to alter boundaries, and the advantages and disadvantages under consideration.

You can view the proposal and maps via Council's website greaterhume.nsw.gov.au or view the documents in person at any Council office.

Council has resolved to hold a constitutional referendum at the 2020 local government elections to consider whether the Council area should continue to be divided into wards.

Regardless the existing ward boundaries will still be required to be reviewed and altered to ensure compliance with the LG Act for the 2020 local government elections.

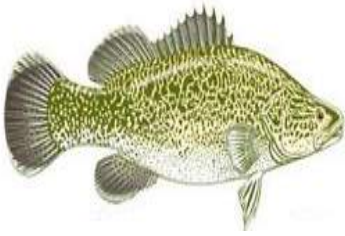

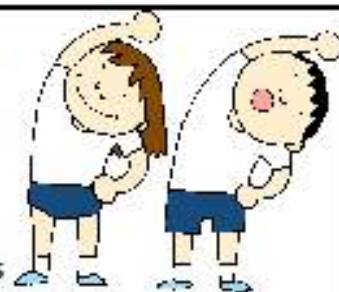
