FAREWELL DENISE

After a local government career spanning 33 years on the former Hume and the current Greater Hume Councils well known local resident and Councillor Denise Knight (nee Osborne) and her husband Peter will soon be relocating to Victoria.

Denise first was elected to the old Hume Shire Council in 1987. Denise served as Deputy Mayor from 1996 to 1997 and then Mayor from 1998 to 2004. A position she held until Hume Council was dissolved on the formation of Greater Hume Shire Council in May 2004.

In March 2005, at the inaugural election of the new Greater Hume Shire, Denise stood and was elected to Council and has continued to serve up until her recent resignation.


Denise also served as Deputy Mayor from 2005 to 2006 and Mayor from 2006 to 2012.

Apart from her Councillor duties Denise was also very active in other Local Government NSW areas, Board Member 2013–2017, Delegate to NSW Rural Fire Service Liaison Committees – 2015–2017, from Local Government NSW to Delegate Fluoridation of NSW Waters Ministerial Advisory Committee.

Denise made an outstanding contribution to the following businesses and community organisations;

- Director of Murray Arts and Apprenticeship Trainees Employment Limited,
- Chairperson of Jindera UPA Gardens Hostel Family and Friends,
- Jindera and District Multi-Purpose Stadium Fundraising Committee,
- St. John's Lutheran Primary School Board,
- Member of the Albury-Hume Local Emergency Management Committee,
- Albury-Hume Bushfire Risk Management Committee,
- Albury-Wodonga Domestic Violence Committee,
- Jindera Rural Fire Service.





In the early 2000's Denise also organised and led the Hands of Hume campaign that resulted in a large area of the former Hume Shire being included in the Greater Hume Shire.

In her working life Denise provided housing support for some of the most vulnerable in our community. Her clients had challenging lives and due to their personal circumstances had no long term accommodation options. Despite having backgrounds of domestic and family violence, abuse, mental health, incarceration,








OUR LOCAL NATURE EXPLORERS

Excerpts taken from News from NSW Red Cross Head office. A story to lift the spirits

On an isolated cattle farm that was hit hard by the Black Summer bushfires the Sturgess family are building a new home for their friend Smiley, with the help of **two Red Cross emergency relief grants.**

When bushfires tore through a remote property near Batlow in New South Wales earlier this year, retired man, Smiley, lost the home he had found with a local farming family.

But thanks to two Red Cross grants, farmers Andrea and Paul Sturgess have been able to build a new home for their friend. With the grant money, they're converting two shipping containers into a cottage in the bush for 63-year-old Smiley.

"We've got to build a big shed over the whole lot. We could put a bit of hay in the side of it ... which will be warm in the winter for him. We're going to find some second-hand tin to put on this shed to give him a bit of cover from wind."

We can all learn something from this story.

Murray River Mayors and CEOs unite in historic push to get restrictions changed



Mayors and CEOs spanning both sides of the Mur- of the border to do their jobs, Cr Wilton said. ray River from Corryong to Wentworth are joining forces in an unprecedented show of strength to convince the NSW Government to ease its latest tough border restrictions.

Since the new public health orders came into effect, all 14 councils say they have received messages, emails and phone calls from residents who can no longer get to work or open their businesses, with many already closing their doors.

Amid fears of a devastating economic impact on border communities that have always lived and worked closely together, the border leaders have combined to tell the NSW Government that the creation of a border zone now restricted effectively to a 2km strip on either side of the river is unacceptable and unsustainable.

Greater Hume Mayor, Cr Heather Wilton said the harsh restrictions are creating stress and anxiety for workers, businesses and families, some of whom are facing enormous financial and emotional hardship because of the narrow permit zone along the border.

'Our request to the NSW Government is simple: please allow border community workers on both sides

'While we understand that both governments are working to restrict the spread of COVID-19, it should be made clear that there are only a handful of active cases of the virus in the border communities yet people living along the Murray River are being heavily penalised through no fault of their own.'

Mayor Wilton said all 14 councils had taken the historic step of uniting in a collective call for the NSW Premier and Health Minister to amend the order to allow more workers and business owners to cross the border, travel directly to their workplaces, and travel directly back to their homes each day.

'The narrow border strip system is causing a growing amount of harm to our communities as each day passes, so we're urging the government to consult with us, so we can save our economies while also ensuring we're all working together to minimize the risk of the virus spreading,' Mayor Wilton said.

The councils calling for the change are: Albury, Berrigan, Campaspe, Federation, Gannawarra, Greater Hume, Indigo, Mildura, Moira, Murray River, Swan Hill, Towong, Wentworth and Wodonga.




Don't forget, Devonshire Tea is available on Sundays.

COUNCIL NEWS JULY 2020

Highlights from meeting held in Holbrook - July 2020

COVID-19 restrictions have changed the way Council can run its monthly meeting. Councillors attended the July meeting held at Holbrook, observing social distance rules.

You can view the recording of the meeting at https://bit.ly/35uKFxX. The meeting was not open to the public.

Business dealt with at the meeting included:

Council adopted a Mobile Food Vending in Public Places Policy on a trial basis until May 2021.

Councillor Denise Knight has announced her resignation from local government office. Denise's last day as a councillor will be Council's next meeting on 19 August. Council resolved to extend sincere appreciation and gratitude to Cr Knight for 33 years outstanding service to Council and the communities of Greater Hume. Council will seek ministerial approval to dispense with a by-election created by the resignation until the next local government election to be held on 4 September 2021.

Council will seek approval for a range of projects under the Local Road and Community Infrastructure Program totalling nearly \$1.3M. Projects put forward are: hot mix paving at Village Green Jindera; toilets installed at Morgan's Lookout, a changing places facility at Ten Mile Creek Gardens Holbrook, a new comfort stop at Walbundrie, a memorial to honour Sam McPaul at Jingellic/Talmalmo, Walla Walla Skate Park and roadworks from the top of Yarara Gap to Coppabella Road at Lankeys Creek.

Council will install a fit for purpose audio visual system to facilitate effective communications at the

Holbrook Library meeting room. This investment is in response to COVID-19 and that Council is required to livestream meetings, and will enable Council to promote the venue widely across the region. Council will also investigate external funding options for similar technology to be installed at the Culcairn Council Chambers.

Council will resume support for the Southern Sports Academy with a \$800 contribution this year, as Greater Hume is represented with four young people in a range of sports who reside in Greater Hume. The Academy provides elite young athletes from southern NSW with cutting edge development programs designed to assist them in their pursuit of higher-level sports achievements.

Council appointed the contractor Nelmac Pty Ltd to design and construct a bridge and approaches on Coppabella Road, which will vastly improve access for harvesting of softwood pines. The \$680,000 project is funded by NSW Government Restart NSW fund.

Council considered a business case for a 24 lot subdivision, and approved a submission seeking a subsidised loan of \$1.5M for the project. Council noted that if the submission is successful, a further report regarding the proposed residential subdivision at Culcairn will be forthcoming.





Remember you have until the end of August as your last chance to catch a Murray cod or fish for a Murray cray.




