The opening of the season has been out of character this year – it has already been

warm... if not HOT!!! Season tickets can be purchased at the Council Hub.

Our lifeguards and kiosk staff have been challenged not only with managing large numbers of patrons so early in the season, but also complying with Covid 19 restrictions.

Just as all other businesses, Council have adopted best practice set out by NSW Health, and it is asked that when attending the pool that:

1. **If you are feeling unwell, please stay at home**
2. Use sanitiser provided
3. Sign in (on sign in sheet at entrance or log attendance via app)
4. Then pay attendance fee or ensure you are marked off if a season ticket holder.

Further to this, the Lifeguards need to keep an eye on the number of people who are IN each of the pools at any one time (just like a restaurant owner needs to keep an eye on the number of people in their restaurant). There may be busy times when the Lifeguard may

need to ask some people to get out of the water to let others have a go.

Please respect our Lifeguards, and the additional responsibilities that they now have, to not only keep us safe in the water, but also Covid Safe.

Regardless of Covid restrictions, there have always been limits on the number of patrons in the water at any one time per Lifeguard on duty. In these situations, the Lifeguard may need to turn away people at the gate (until another Lifeguard can be sourced). Please respect our lifeguards and let them get on with doing their job – keeping their eyes on the water.

Watch the notice boards for when **Wally Wipeout** will be visiting our pool in the new year.

Once again, Alana is running **Aqua classes on Tuesday and Thursdays at 6.30pm**. Why NOT wait until the new year to make a resolution to get fit! We now have access with steps AND a lift... so there is NO excuse!

Ruth Dunn will be starting up the Murrumbidgee Health **Aqua classes soon, on Wednesday and Friday at 3pm**.

• PIONEER MUSEUM •

It has been great to see the Victorian border open in the last couple of weeks as we have had visitors from the south calling in to the museum regularly since. We have been very fortunate in NSW not to have been exposed to the severe lock-down measures like in Victoria and we have been pleased to welcome our southern residents who make up a large percentage of our visitation.

From December, the 'Tim Fischer Working Machines Shed' will be open as part of your visit to the museum – it is a fabulous collection of tractors, small motors and pumps. We are thrilled to have a fabulous piece from the farm of Peter Moll, a 6 H.P. Austrian engine that is set up to pump water. We have been able to source several restored tractors from the Schulz collection to add to the shed and have moved the Moline tractor into the shed also. There are at least 8 small motors and pumps and several other pieces from the museum collection including a 1914 International portable hopper cooled engine No. HF833. We will also have a 1927 Oldsmobile joining the collection in the near future. Enthusiasts meet on a Wednesday at the shed and we hope to have a regular Sunday afternoon machinery operating time soon. If you have a liking for old machinery, call in and take a look; there is always something new happening at the museum.

On Sunday 13th December, our Christmas Wreath making workshop will again be held. Due to popular demand there are two sessions running and these will both be in the morning to avoid the hot weather we seem to now be getting. Session times are 9.30 and 11 am and tickets are available on Trybooking.

In January, each Friday after New Year (8th, 15th, 22nd & 29th) the museum will be opening for **Twilight visitation** from 6 - 9 pm. Tickets will be \$15 and will include a glass of wine, beer or soft drink with entry and food will be available to purchase. COVID-19 restrictions have changed the way Council can run its monthly meeting.

Members of the public were not able to attend the meeting in person but the meeting was recorded and available for viewing on Council's website <https://bit.ly/35uKFxX>

Council will continue to hold the monthly meetings at Holbrook Library Complex while COVID restrictions are enforced. Residents can bring forward issues to the council by providing a written statement, which is distributed to councillors and read out prior to the commencement of the meeting. Statements should be provided by 5pm on the day preceding the meeting.

Business dealt with at the meeting included:

Council resolved to raise serious concerns with regard to the Glenellen Solar Farm in respect of traffic management surrounding of the proposed development.

Council will submit a planning proposal under an accelerated program for the rezoning and minimum lot size to facilitate the timely expansion of the Jindera Industrial Estate. This is in response to the number of recent land sales in the estate.

Council endorsed the Annual Report of Council operations for the twelve month period to 30 June 2020, interested residents can read the document on Council's website.

Council also received an update in relation to the operational plan and first quarter budget which revealed a cash surplus of \$6,402, which represents a worsening of \$26,034 on the original budget. The result is due to Council continuing its response to COVID-19 and additional legal costs due to a complex Government Information (Public Access) Act 2009 application.

Council received an update report of Council's response to the Coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic and its impact on operations including that rent resume on one commercial property in Holbrook.

Council has accepted that the Moorwartha Cemetery Management Committee will relinquish management of the cemetery, with Council taking over along with other cemeteries under Council's control.

Council will make application for grant funding under the Fixing Local Roads Program – Round 2: Construction and sealing of 7.32km Brocklesby Balldale Road, reconstruction and widening of Gerogery Road (4.5km) and Henty Cookardina Road (6km), totalling \$6.7M.

Longford Civil Pty Ltd was appointed to undertake a

road project which will result in the widening of the Giles Creek structure at Lankeys Creek, at a contract price of \$475,586 + GST.

Abbot Constructions Pty Ltd was appointed to re-construct Pioneer Drive between Pech Avenue and Jindera Street, Jindera, at a contract price of \$319,036 + GST.

Fuge Earthworks Pty Ltd was appointed to undertake partial construction of the Gerogery Drainage Scheme, at a contract price of \$202,190 + GST.

Received as a matter of urgency, Council resolved to submit six applications for funding under Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund which includes road projects on Jingellic Road and Yenches Road and construction of a lookout, car parking and signage at Hanel's Lookout at Woomargama National Park. Council will also provide letters of support for applications from the community that are consistent with the Community Strategic Plan and for 'not for profit' projects.

A second matter of urgency involving the provision of General Practitioner Services and Visiting Medical Officer Services at Culcairn was tabled. Council will undertake discussions with Sarkon Medical Group and investigate potential opportunities.

Council endorsed a proposal to engage with potential land owners to explore sites for an upgrade to the Jindera Waste Water Treatment Facility.

Finally Council agreed to sell 6,300 sqm Rosler Parade Henty. Council will also enter into a six month option to sell Council owned land on Yankee Crossing Road subject to a formal development plan and timeframe being agreed to by both parties.

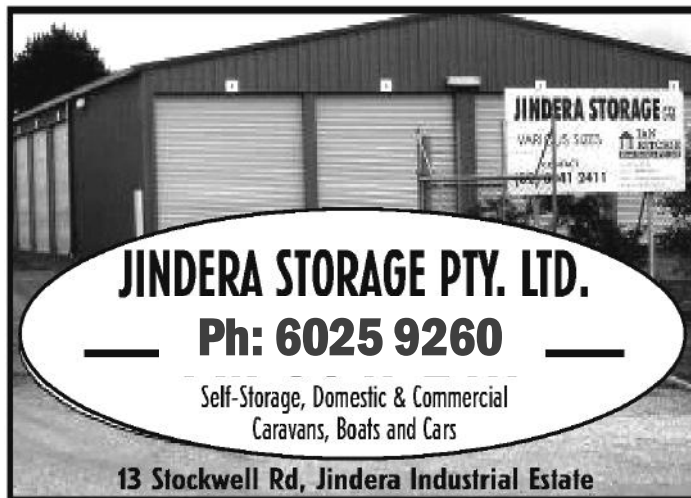

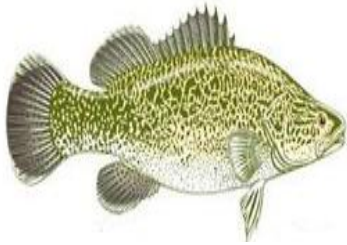
