Be Prepared

Preparation is everything when it comes to holding a garage sale, here are a few pointers to help make sure you've got all your bases covered.

The first step is deciding what's worth selling.

Anything that is irreparably damaged or dirty should probably just go straight to the Jindera Tip.

If you're a secret hoarder, an empty-nester or about to move house, this can be your chance for a fresh start and to declutter.

If you find it hard to part with some items:

- Get the help of a friend or family member to assist you with your decision making;
- General rule... "If you haven't used it in the last 12-18 months, it is time to let it go".

Another essential element of preparation is making sure you have plenty of change, bags and even paper to wrap any fragile items in.

You do not have to worry about the marketing as this will be taken care of for you, with over 80 entrants last year, the Jindera Garage Sale is a huge event.

The event is advertised at starting at 8am, but be prepared and ready for the day as visitors start driving around town from 6am.

Do not display your goods until you are ready to start selling.



Price Setting

What price do you sell things for?

- Set low reasonable prices Think! "What would I expect to pay for this second-hand item?"
- Put individual prices on all large items.
- Put up a price list of the same types of items, ie All books \$1.00, All toys in this box 50cents.

Be Prepared to Bargain

At the end of the day, you want to sell your wares, so a bird in the hand is worth 2 in the bush. Take the Money and Run! People go to garage sales for bargains, so accept the offer. Don't take lowish offers personally, people are just out to have fun.

What Sells

House hold items, bric-a-brac, soft furnishings, furniture, fridges and freezers, board games, gaming systems and video games, books, craft items, clothing, baby items, children's toys, bikes, plants, local produce, shed and garden items, building tools and equipment, cars, car parts, camper vans, caravans, boats, trailers, motor bikes, fishing gear, horse gear, camping gear, vintage wares & collectables, antiques....

Basically, whatever is in your home, garage, shed or garden, is all suitable for the garage sale.

Tips

- Don't hold items for people who say they are coming back they usually don't and you may miss out on selling the item.
- Presentation, presentation, presentation!
- Place similar items together or display and sell as a group/set.
- Make sure items are clean.

Recycling Message

CLEANAWAY

Due to there not being an Australia Post street delivery system to any Jindera residents, we would like you to be aware that unless you have a PO Box at the Jindera Post Office we are unable to notify you that your Recycling bin was contaminated when emptied. Our drivers are putting a sticker on contaminated bins which should have a tick to say what the contamination was.

Normally there is a First, Second and Final Notice sent to the address each time contamination occurs.

Please be advised that if you receive a sticker on your bin, class it as a Notice and on the fourth offence your bin could be removed for a period of two weeks. Then, once you have signed a pledge agreeing to comply with putting the correct items in your recycling bin it will be returned. If you continue to offend, your bin could be removed permanently.

NSW Bushfire Danger Period finished on the 31st of March



JINDERA BUSH FIRE BRIGADE Captain Graham Yensch reminds us that the Bushfire Danger Period has finished. He said, *"that even outside of the bushfire danger period landowners still need to notify their neighbours, and the NSW RFS 24 hours prior of burning off"*.

Graham asks that landholders maintain strong firebreaks and check the weather conditions before lighting any fires. The Bushfire Danger period may have finished but, we still have huge <u>fuel loads around</u> <u>Jindera</u> that are drying out quickly.

If you have any doubts about lighting a burn off, please check with the Brigade first or don't light the fire until the weather conditions will allow you to control the fire at all times.

Keep an eye on the display boards now that the Bushfire Danger Period is over Bazza's cryptic codes might be out again soon, anyone picked up any typos so far?

The Brigade is always on the look out for new members so drop-in and have a chat to us if you see us at the station, we have many roles that you can help us with if you don't want to get on a fire truck.





through to Monday over the Easter weekend in April. It is likely to be a busy time so if you are looking for a quieter place to enjoy close to home, come on in and visit.







Business dealt with at the 16 March 2022 meeting included:

Council agrees to support and participate in the Australian Local Government Association's advocacy for their endorsed national funding priorities by writing to the local Federal Member(s) of Parliament, all known election candidates in local Federal electorates and the President of the Australian Local Government Association. The national funding priorities of the Australian Local Government Association (ALGA), would contribute an estimated \$6.46 billion per year to Australia's GDP and create 43,444 jobs.

Council resolved to move the June meeting from 15 June to 22 June to allow for appropriate review and endorsement of the Community Strategic Plan, Delivery / Operational Plan and 2022/23 Budget.

The Local Preference Purchase policy was endorsed for a 28 day public exhibition.

Council resolved the General Manager will enter into negotiations for the sale of 96 --- 100 Main Street, Brocklesby --- Former Brocklesby Hotel --- Lot 18 DP 6431 And Lots A And B DP 413482.

Council resolved to accept the Expression of Interest from the Bathla Group for the purchase of 5ha of vacant land at Holbrook.


