Jindera boasts another young speed demon!



Another young local lad, **Jed Fyffe**, has made his mark in the motorcycle racing world, with recent success in the USA.

Jed's family, Dad Mat, Mum Kim and 13 year old twin sisters, Madison and Charli have been Jindera residents for the past 8-9 years.


Jed started racing flat track with the Albury Wodonga Motorcycle Club when he was 7 years old. Earlier this year, at Easter Time, Jed competed in the Queensland Flat Track Titles at Proserpine, where he won the 85cc modified class.

And now, at the ripe old age of 11, Jed has competed in the American Flat Track Grand Nationals, held 7-14th

July this year, in Du Quoin, Illinois, **winning a National Championship** in the 65cc modified class, and placing 2nd in the 65cc production class.

What an amazing achievement for he and his family.

Leading up to the USA trip, some of the parents and coaches who had been meeting up and travelling with their young competitors, started to discuss forming an Australian Team, whereby they would select a rider from each class, with a view to competing in America. Hence, after much discussion, fundraising and organisation, Team Aus Racing was born. Matt and Lisa Drane, from Forbes, were hugely instrumental in making this a reality, as were Jed's parents and others.



The Team spent 3 weeks in total in the US, where they hired a track for practices and attended a race meet in Ohio, prior to the Grand Nationals in Illinois. They had success with 2 other team riders, bringing home 4 titles, so I bet we'll be hearing more about this team in the future.

Jed spoke confidently and articulately to me about his racing and the trip to America. Interestingly, when I asked him what the best thing was about going to America, he said "*spending time with my Dad and my Pa, going out for dinner and lunch, going to a Water Park and going to a baseball game with Dad*". He told me that it was pretty much like it is in the movies!

Here is a young man who seems to have a great outlook on life, loads of talent, appreciates his opportunities, and cherishes his family. With a Father and Grandfather racing motorcycles before him, he seems to be in the best hands. I'm not sure that Jed's father, Mat, felt as flippant about the whole thing...."*happy*" and "*relieved*" were the words that he used.

I think we will be seeing a lot more of this young man in the spotlight, as he develops his talents and skills.

Heritage Week Dinners

at the Jindera Pioneer Museum

Back in the early days of the Museum (1970's?) a week was set aside by the NSW Government to celebrate things that had a connection to our history – it was called Heritage Week and many and varied activities were held across the state to celebrate that history. This festival continued for many years.



From those early days the Jindera Museum has held dinners to celebrate Heritage Week – originally it was every night for the seven nights of the week set aside for the festival. On some occasions there were plays and skits to accompany the dinner. There was always music. The events were sometimes taken over by a celebration, a wedding comes to mind, but birthdays and anniversary parties were also held especially to take advantage of this week and the great atmosphere the museum offers.

Heritage Week as such no longer exists in the states festivals, however, the National Trust now celebrates a Heritage Festival which runs for two months and events can be listed with the Trust as part of this festival.



The museum has decided to continue this past activity of dinners in the museum as it provides a wonderful opportunity to showcase the lifestyle depicted by this great facility. They are still referred to as Heritage Week Dinners and this year they were held on Friday 29th and Saturday 30th of July. These dinners are always enjoyed by all of those attending as they offer a step back into the celebration of food and family from a bygone era.

Guests get to sit at the large table in the main room of the residence at the museum. All of the antique silver is used and all attending to guests are dressed from the era.



Being able to be part of the museum itself provides a memorable experience for all attending. A five course dinner is served to guests and of course there was music.

Events are held at the museum throughout the year. These are to help raise funds for the up-keep and on-going maintenance of the museum, which can be extensive. The museum is owned and operated by its members and has been operational for 54 years.

Jindera CWA News

At our July meeting, Environment Officer, Heather Collis informed us of the varroa mite which is the biggest threat to honeybees in Australia. The mite is believed to have wiped out up to 90% of New Zealand's bee population since it breached the country's borders in 2000.



The parasite was first found in Newcastle area of NSW and has since spread to other areas. Honeybee hives affected by the varroa mite are destroyed to try and stop and eradicate the outbreak.

A ban on hive movements could have devastating consequences for almond and canola crops which depend on honeybees for pollination.

To follow updates on this outbreak, visit the Department of Primary Industry website. Rural Aid has launched a fundraising campaign to support beekeepers across Australia.




New additions to the playground.

This last month the museum has been busy with holiday visitors, Sunday often being a busy day with many drawn to the wonderful offerings available in our Tea Room.

Our wonderful band of **Tea Room** ladies provide luscious soups, and other savoury fare along with a delicious variety of cakes and slices and their renowned scones. Over these colder months, the fire is always ablaze and the Tea Room provides a cosy hideout to catch up with friends and family, or just indulge in some lovely home cooked delights.



The Albury Historical Society held their AGM during July and I was asked to be the guest speaker at this event. 

As part of a NSW Government pilot program to work with local communities to attract migrants and refugees to resettle in regional NSW, the Greater Hume community are invited to info sessions to learn more about this local project this month.

The focus for the three year pilot program is for people living in Western Sydney with the skills and aspirations to move to the region for employment and lifestyle opportunities. The overall aim is to provide migrants and refugees with the information and support they need to relocate to the region, and support Greater Hume communities to welcome newcomers and help them to thrive in the long-term.

Those that attend these consultation sessions will be updated on this pilot program by Murray GROW Taskforce members. Hear how your community can make a difference by being involved, as well as have any questions answered, and hear your feedback, to ensure that there is locally-led design and decision making occurring.

Co-Chair of the Murray Taskforce, Andrew Kotzur of Walla Walla said “the NSW GROW program becomes a win-win for communities in terms of increasing diversity and clearly for businesses, it’s an opportunity for prospective employers”. It’s no secret that there’s a shortage in the workforce, but it’s not without challenges, because housing is also very challenging at the moment. Individual communities can’t do this on their own, but working with Red Cross, Council, other support organisations together with the community and employers we are hoping to find solutions. I encourage any business or community member to attend one of these sessions, and hear about the potential benefits for the project within Greater Hume Council area” he added.

The NSW GROW Murray pilot program was formally launched in Walla Walla late June by the NSW Minister for Multiculturalism, the Hon Mark Coure.


