



At the last meeting of the Jindera Community Forum, the following list of projects/requests was compiled in order to present to Greater Hume Council. These requirements were divided into short term and long term, and will give Council some direction in their budgeting, as well as in applying for grant monies. We would still welcome any ideas or thoughts that you may have, you are welcome to our forum meeting or you can speak to Kathy Anderson (N A Auto) or Pat Hayes (Post Office).

#### **Short Term:**

- Fenced dog park.
- Lighting for Village Green trees.
- More seating in Village Green.
- More seating in Pioneer Park (possibly under a covered area) facing play equipment.
- Improved seating and paths within the wetlands/recreation ground to facilitate family participation.
- Adult fitness equipment within the recreation ground.
- Bike/scooter path within the recreation ground.
- Green bins/compost bins.

#### Long Term:

- Multi-purpose hall/stadium gymnasium, hall, kitchen and meeting rooms use by youth, community groups, schools, senior citizens – also community events, art shows, private functions, conferences, etc.
- Recreation path Jindera to Albury.
- NBN cable to Jindera (catering for continued growth).
- Water park for all ages (near new playground).
- Walking/riding paths around Jindera to link the pockets of residential areas/estates (initially Jindera central > Drumwood Road > Pomegranate Estate > Jindera central).
- Pump track for children at recreation ground.
- Pool upgrade of canteen and change rooms, with increased shade.
- Converting Crown Lands into open space areas for recreation.
- Electric car charging station.

#### Stage 3 Major Excursion -Borambola

Students enjoyed a variety of outdoor education and challenge activities with many opportunities to develop independence and problem solving. #### Stage 2 Excursion – Riverina **Environmental Education Centre**

The students used the I-pads to document their journey and new discoveries using photos and videos to record what they learnt. In addition, the students were treated to some experiences looking at historical maps and how the area has changed over time. The students had a fantastic time and we look forward to the partnership that this will lead to.



#### **Eddie Woo Visit**

Early last week, the school staff had an exciting visit from Mr. Eddie Woo. Eddie is a Sydney based secondary mathematics teacher who has become well known for his you-tube videos and passion for delivering high quality maths content for all to access. He spoke to staff at our weekly meeting before entertaining/ challenging us with some very interesting maths challenges, focusing on problem solving and working mathematically. He then conducted a workshop for our senior students, again challenging them to think about maths in new and exciting ways. 

#### Burrumbuttock's Squirrel Glider LAMP Project on target to double the Squirrel Glider Population

In 2014, a population analysis of Squirrel Gliders around Burrumbuttock estimated that only 500 animals existed in the local area. If nothing was done to help this animal they would likely keep declining in numbers and disappear from the local area. To ensure Squirrel Gliders had a future, threatened species ecologists calculated that doubling the population to at least 1,000 would be required. From this baseline work the development of the Burrumbuttock Squirrel Glider Local Area Management Plan (LAMP) emerged.

Recent analysis of the work completed for the project revealed that this unique plan is on target to achieving the goal of doubling the population. It is a project that has involved local landholders, local community, local contractors, and local organisations.

Prior to any on ground work it was estimated that:

- There was 5023 ha of habitat that was considered suitable for Squirrel Gliders and this was made up of
- 115 individual patches averaged 43 ha in size

Since on ground works have been implemented:

- Suitable habitat has increased to 5399 ha and this is made up of
- 83 patches of 65 ha average in size (so larger connected patches)

This means that Squirrel Gliders will remain in the local area and thrive well into the future. A great outcome for all involved in the project. The strength in this project, it's achievements and ongoing commitment of those involved comes down to a love for seeing this enigmatic creature not only survive but thrive in the landscape.

#### NSW SINGLE-USE PLASTICS BAN

As of the 1st November 2022 a ban exists for the supply and ultimately the use of:

- single-use plastic cutlery, stirrers, straws, plates and bowls (except where designed or intended to have a spill-proof lid)
- expanded polystyrene (EPS) food service items (including EPS clamshells, cups, plates and bowls)
- single-use plastic cotton buds

This will have an impact on not only the community but also sporting organisations who cater at events and use single use plastics eg cutlery, plates, cups etc.

Also banned will be certain rinse-off personal care products containing plastic microbeads.

If you are concerned about microbeads in products, look for the following commonly used ingredients:

- polyethylene (PE)
- polypropylene (PP)
- polyethylene terephthalate (PET)
- polymethyl methacrylate (PMMA)
- nylon (PA)








The weather has finally given us a reprieve with a couple of weeks (almost) of no rain and actual sunshine, which has made the grass grow and consequently a busy time on the mowers. Fortunately, we have a good crew of volunteers on the mowers attacking the fairways and "rough" resulting in the course looking the best it has in years. Thanks to all involved, in particular Bruce Hill who seems to have formed an emotional attachment to the new fairway mower ....

We have finally struck a major blow with the irrigation upgrade over the past 4 weeks – in particular, last Thursday, Friday, Saturday (24th, 25th, 26th) when we closed the course and installed all of the new irrigation pipe work and control valves.

Three weeks ago, we installed the power cable between the clubhouse and site of the new pump shed to be installed adjacent the 8th green which involved trenching and fitting off of the cable in the clubhouse — many thanks to Craig McMillan for his efforts.



Last Thursday/Friday/Saturday was a huge few days where the 80mm PVC mainline, together with all 50mm PVC branch lines to greens and control valves was installed. We had up to a dozen members working at various times over the three days to completely install and back fill around 2000 meters of piping.

Thanks go out to all members involved, including a few local contractors in Pat Fuge (Fuge Earthmoving) for a great job trenching, Geoff Whiley and his mini excavator in digging holes for valve pits and Jordan Widdison (WidWeld) for welding support brackets to the bridge crossing the creek.

The next phase - (over next 2 weeks) involves installation of the new 220kl tank, pump and shed and then sprinklers to greens

The first **Junior Golf Coaching Clinic** was held last Sunday 20th with around 20 kids enjoying a good session of coaching conducted by Cameron Odewahn, followed by a delicious sausage sizzle. Many thanks to Lucy and Jack Kimpton for their great work in organising and running this program.


